





Global warming likely to hit Texas...

Scientists say temperature rise change rainfall, Gulf Coast region



Global warming will have serious long-term effects on the Texas Gulf Coast, possibly including more flooding, worse droughts and a diminishing supply of fresh water, according to a study released recently.

The two-year study, which was written by a team of 10 scientists with expertise in the entire region detailed the potential consequences over the next 50 to 100 years of higher temperatures and rising sea levels on the Gulf Coastal Plain from the Laguna Madre to the Florida Keys.

Climate changes will have important implications for the health and well-being of human populations as well as other goods and services that ecosystems provide to society.

The Gulf Coast region is disproportionately susceptible to changes in temperature and sea level. A small increase in temperature can result in a drastic rise in the July heat index; a small rise in sea level poses serious problems to a coastal region that is flat, overdeveloped and sinking.

The report, titled Confronting Climate Change in the Gulf Coast Region, accepts without debate that global warming is a real phenomenon. It assumes as fact that summer high temperatures are projected to rise between 3 and 7

degrees, and winter low temperatures will warm by as much as 5 degrees. It also assumes sea level will rise from will 18 to 20 inches, or from 15 inches to as much as 44 inches if ground subsidence is factored in.

All the scientists, as well as their forecasting models, agree precipitation will become more "uneven" and that extreme rainfall events, such as the flooding caused in the Houston area in June by the remnants of a tropical storm will occur more frequently.

In Texas the primary effect of climate change will be a reduction of fresh water supplies, necessary to both humans and the ecosystem, as salt water pushes further into coastal estuaries and wetlands, and evaporation increases off reservoirs and rivers.

Roger Zimmerman, the director of the National Marine Service Fisheries Laboratory in Galveston and also an author of the study, said Gulf Coast waters produce 1.9 billion pounds of fish, shrimp, crabs and other shellfish every year, worth about \$758 million. The fishery relies heavily on wetlands and estuaries for replenishment.

"These resources are vulnerable to climate change", Zimmerman said. "In the worst case, the wetlands are lost."

Other possible consequences

- More frequent or longer lasting droughts;
- Greater damage from storms because of, among other things, higher sea level;
- A shift in the ranges of plant and animal species, and a more conductive environment for invasive species;
- Warmer temperatures will aggravate an already serious ground-level ozone problem in Houston and other coastal cities:
- A greater threat to public health from higher temperatures.
