Procedures for Lions Day with the United Nations

FORM AND PAYMENT

The registration form and payment must be received at Lions Clubs International no later than February 20, 2004. Due to United Nations security requirements, all those planning to attend must be pre-registered. Only registrations accompanied by payment will be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a check, draft or money order in U.S. dollars drawn on a U.S. bank and payable to Lions Clubs International.

REFUNDS

There will be no refunds after February 20, 2004. There are no exceptions. Since Lions Clubs International must pay for meals and fees whether registrants attend or not, this policy of no refunds applies to all registrants, including those needing to obtain a visa and those who are not issued a visa.

VISAS

Lions Clubs International does not have the ability to assist individuals in obtaining visas to attend this event. Issuing visas is the prerogative of the consulate of any country.

Lions Day with the UN is an event that is open to any Lion/guest from any country who pays the fee and attends the program in New York. Lions Clubs International is unable to issue special letters of invitation to any Lion wishing to attend the event. However, a confirmation letter will be sent to each person who registers.

LUNCHEON WAITING LIST

Luncheon seating is limited to 350. Reservations will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration forms and payments must be received at International Headquarters by February 20, 2004. UN security regulations require that every person attending must pre-register by the February 20, 2004 deadline.

After the 350 reservations for the luncheon have been made, additional registrants will be added to a luncheon waiting list based on available seats. Please note: If you are on the luncheon waiting list, it does not affect your participation in the day program. Prior to the luncheon on the day of the program, registrants will be called for available lunches according to the order of their name on the waiting list. Registrants who are not present when the seat becomes available will not receive a refund for the luncheon portion of their registration fee.

If you are in attendance and your name is not called, you will be issued a refund for the luncheon portion of the registration fee. This will be mailed to you a few weeks after the event. Because registration actually begins in September, it is recommended that those who want to attend the luncheon register as early as possible.

To remove your name from the luncheon waiting list, please call 1-630-571-5466, ext. 316 before the deadline of February 20, 2004. A refund will be issued for the meal portion of the registration fee several weeks after the event. Requests after the deadline cannot be honored.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Please use the public entrance located on First Avenue at 46 Street. Registration begins at 9 a.m.; program begins promptly at 10 a.m.

The March 12th date is official. However, the needs of governments always take precedence over NGO (non-governmental organization) requests. The Conference Room must be vacated if the General Assembly is called into an emergency meeting.

All sessions will be in English. Children younger than five years of age are not allowed in the UN.



McCune's contributions win acclaim Loyal Lion is honored by community

Harris County Commissioners Court has proclaimed today as James "Bud" McCune Day in honor of his contributions and gifts of service to the community and to Harris County. Precinct 4 Commissioner Jerry Eversole will host Bud McCune Appreciation Day at the Vera B. May Community Center, 2100 Wolf Road, beginning at 10 a.m. today.

He will read the county resolution, and present a plaque to be placed at the entrance of the center. The parking lot at May Center also will be named in McCune's honor. 'While naming a parking lot after an individual may be slightly unusual, this is the least that can be done to recognize and honor James 'Bud' McCune," Eversole said. "For many years, Bud McCune has been active in the community with very little recognition. He is also an important part of the success of this community center."

McCune was born Aug. 21, 1921 in Minden, Texas. He married Jane Davis in 1943. The couple has two sons, Bill and James E. McCune Jr., one grandson and three grand daughters. They moved to Huffman in 1964 and were founding members of the Lake Houston United Methodist Church, where they continue to volunteer. McCune is retired from the Metropolitan Transit Authority in Houston where he served as maintenance supervisor of buses. His wife worked as an administrator for the Houston Independent School District.

McCune was a charter member of the Huffman Lions Club in 1971 and is the only remaining Lion to hold that status to day. He has had perfect attendance in his 31 years with the Lions Club and has held every club office except treasurer. He has served as club president seven times. McCune serves now as the district governor for District 2-S2 over 64 Lions Clubs in seven counties. He was elected into the Lions Club State Hall of Fame in July 2003.

Through the Lions Club, McCune has helped sponsor Boy and Cub Scout Troops, obtained wheelchairs for people in need, raised funds for individuals who need eye and heart surgeries, built two bus stop shelters for schoolchildren, a nature trail for Ben Brown Elementary and a community tennis court.


He has also been an active part of the Lions Kids Camp in Kerrville for children with dis abilities or diabetes. McCune has helped buy glasses for chil dren who could not afford them and annually supplied books to kindergartners. He also has aided food banks and organizations for the blind.

Some of his awards include:

Life Member of the Texas Lions Camp, Ben Bowen PTA, and Lions Clubs International; four International Presidents Appreciation Awards; seven 100 percent Club Presidents Awards, as well as 14 District Governor Awards, two Extension Awards, Founders Membership Award, Star Team Award, District Hall of Fame Award, the Past District Governors Distinguished Achievement Award, and the International 50 Member Key Award. He also has received recognition as a Texas Lions Foundation Follow, Jack Wiech Fellow and Melvin Jones Fellow.

McCune loves to raise flowers and routinely brings fresh flowers, especially day lilies, to his friends throughout the community. Jane does just as much work as Bud does, said Lions member Margaret Jennings. "They've been very helpful to students with disabilities, especially the Special Olympics. Jane keeps Bud on schedule." 

A CHANGE WAS COMING



Here in the termite belt, pressure treated lumber has for years been the wood of choice for just about anything built outdoors—decks, fences, landscaping, raised gardens and even playground equipment. All that was to end officially on December 31, but was cancelled

The commission decided a ban on the wood in playground equipment was unnecessary because of the industry phaseout.

In February, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety (CPSC) released results of a study regarding chromium copper arsenate (CCA) treated decks and play sets. The research concludes that out of every 1 million children exposed to CCA-treated lumber an average of three times per week for five years, between two and 100 have an increased risk of developing lung or bladder cancer.

In March, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) reached agreement with producers of pressure-treated lumber to discontinue sales of CCA-impregnated wood by the end of the year. The agreement affects lumber used to build anything children might come in contact with — decks to picnic tables to playground sets. EPA officials do not recommend removal or replacement of CCA treated structures or surrounding soil. The CPSC does recommend homeowners take steps to protect children coming in contact with arsenic that may leach from the lumber.

Pressure-treated lumber resists rot, decay and insect infestation. It typically has a greenish tint. It typically has a greenish tint. It usually has a stamp that identifies it as pressure-treated.

Although increasing significance the lumber has come under attack in recent years, to the homeowners is unclear. Industrial and commercial products or those used in saltwater marine applications are expected to continue.

The copper in CCA is the major preservative, protecting against fungi and insects. The arsenic is a second line of defense. The chromium fixes the treatment so it doesn't easily leach from the lumber.

Some have wondered why the EPA did not call for removal or replacement of CCA-treated structures if such lumber is dangerous enough to be phased out.

The debate seems certain to continue for some time. The new non-arsenic lumbers — alkaline copper quaternary or ACQ, copper boron azole CBAS) and Tanalith E — cost as much as 20 percent more. Many major building supply outlets have yet to stock the non-arsenic Treated alternatives.

In lieu of removal, the EPA says that applying an oil-based, semitransparent stain once a year may reduce the levels of arsenic on the surface. Children playing on CCA-treated wood should wash their hands before eating; food should not be allowed to touch the wood. Use gloves when handling CCA-treated wood. Do not burn it.

Bus trips to International Convention in Detroit
