What is a Master Plan?

Why is a Master Plan important?

A Master Plan is used as a guide for the future development of an airport, almost like a "troubleshooting" handbook. The goal is to examine the current conditions at an airport, try to predict future changes in the airport's demand and capacity over the next 20 years, and recommend how any problems arising from that growth could be remedied. Advance planning helps identify and correct problems before they happen.

How will Ellington Field's Master Plan benefit me?

The Ellington Field Master Plan benefits existing and potential aviation tenants, the traveling public, and surrounding communities and businesses. Using information contained in this Master Plan, the Houston Airport System can plan and develop facilities to accommodate the Airport's traffic and generate economic activity.

How will the Master Plan address environmental impacts such as air quality and noise?

During the initial phase of the master planning process, environmental issues affecting airport development will be identified to guide the development and evaluation of alternatives. In the final phase, environmental impacts will be studied and identified for each recommended improvement.

If I have a comment or suggestion regarding the Master Plan, to whom should I direct it?

Throughout the project, there will be public meetings held to present master plan status and obtain public comments. To All the Lions of District 2-S2:

As you all may know, Lion Thomas Capers had/has a real serious medical condition which started when he developed a perforated colon which in turn caused a severe abdominal infection that almost took his life. He was put into a medically induced coma for about 3 weeks and was in the hospital for about two months. He is now recuperating at home.

It will be at least another 4 to 6 seeks for the incision to heal up and he will be off work for another 6 months or more depending on how quickly his body heals. He is also a diabetic which will cause him to heal slower then a non-diabetic person would.

Thomas will not have an income coming in from the time he was hospitalized until he is healed and can go back to work which will be at least 8 months are longer.

I have approached my club, the Humble Lions Club and other clubs at the last PSC meeting to all pitch in and help as Lion Thomas needs our help.

To do this the Humble Lions Club has started a checking account at the Woodforest National Bank in the name of Thomas Capers, Account # 0004790309, Woodforest National Bank, 528 Sheldon Rd., Channelview, Texas 77530 and the contact person is Lion Allen Lee at 713-495-8056.

I am asking you to please ask your club members to help Thomas by donating funds to the Thomas Capers Fund to help him in his time of need. Lion Thomas has generously given 30 plus years to Lionism and now he needs our help.



FREEZE PROTECTION

A bitter cold front can give way to freezing conditions in a matter of hours. When temperatures dip into the 20s the water pipes of homes can freeze and burst. What makes these problems more distressing is that in most cases they could have been avoided.

BEFORE THE FREEZE —

Review homeowners insurance policy to ensure you have adequate protection. Insulate pipes, especially those close to outside walls in attics or crawl spaces. Wrap outside pipes and faucets with newspaper, foam, rags or any other insulating material. Cover them with elastic and secure with string, wire or tape. Hardware stores sell products designed to fit over an outside faucet providing insulation.


If you have an electrical outlet near your pipes, use heat tape. Follow the manufacturers instructions when installing. Improper usage may cause a fire. Pipes should be carefully wrapped and secured tightly.

Seal leaks surrounding pipes and cover any vents around your home's foundation. Use insulation to keep the cold outside.

Disconnect and store all garden hoses and other outside hose connections. If practical, use an indoor valve to shut off and drain water from pipes leading to outside faucets. If you have a swimming pool, either drain the circulation system or keep the pump motor running.

WHEN THE COLD STRIKES—

Outdoor faucets are most vulnerable in freezing weather. Make sure all faucets outside the house are turned on to allow for water to drip.



Inside, turn on both hot and cold faucets near outside walls to allow a small trickle of water to run during the night. Open cabinet doors under the sinks in your kitchen and bathrooms to allow heated indoor air to circulate around your water pipes. Set the thermostat no lower than 55° even when your home is vacant or unoccupied during the winter. If you plan to be away during cold weather months, have someone regularly check your home to make sure it's staying warm enough to prevent freezing. Make sure you know how to shut off the water and call a plumber if needed.

IF YOUR PIPES FREEZE—

Open all faucets. If you turn on your faucets and nothing comes out, leave the faucets turned on and call a plumber.

Remove insulation and wrap pipes in rags. If possible, pour hot water over pipes, starting as close to the faucet, working your way towards the coldest section of pipe. If that doesn't thaw them, call your plumber. Don't try to thaw pipes with an open flame.

Don't use lamps or electrical appliances to thaw pipes. Leaking water from the thawing pipes could cause a short and you could be electrocuted.

IF YOUR PIPES BURST—

Shut off the water immediately to prevent additional damage.

Call your plumber.

Take an inventory of any damaged property or possessions. Do not dispose of any items without prior approval of your insurance adjuster
