




CAMPING SEASON IS RIGHT AROUND THE CORNER.......

It is not too early to start contacting those campers you sponsored last year. If they usually get their application on line, let them know that the new 2008 camper applications will be available on and after January 15, 2008. To download an application go to www.lionscamp.com.

Here are some other things to pass along to your campers and to consider yourself:

- > If your potential camper has a handicap that is not listed on the approved list, complete the application and send it in. Let Camp personnel decide if your camper qualifies.
- > There will be only five (5) handicap sessions this year.....June 1-7 (Session 1), June 8-14 (Session 2), June 15-21 (Session 3), June 22-28 (Session 4), and June 29-July 5 (Session 5).
- > Unless we increase our campers from 2-S2 by at least 30 this year, we will run a bus for only two of the five sessions. Although we have not negotiated with Camp personnel which sessions those two will be, we are hoping for the June 22-28 (Session 4) and June 29-July 5 (Session 5) time slots.
- > Remember that Lion Sponsors have the responsibility to follow up to ensure the child being sponsored either "shows up" or cancels prior to the beginning of the assigned session. (Last year, our District had the highest number of "no shows" in the State.) This year, because of the decreased sessions, a "no show" could mean that another child who was turned away because the camp was "full" would be denied the camping experience.
- > The Diabetic Camp Applications will change this year. If you have old Diabetic applications, feel free to discard them now. Again, the new applications will be available after January 15, 2008.
- > It is the Sponsor's responsibility to ensure that an application is completed correctly. The best way to ensure that this happens is to NOT SIGN AN APPLICATION IN BLANK but rather have the application mailed back to you (the Lion) and you, in turn, mail the application to the Camp. The most important information required is the Sponsoring Lion's signature, the immunization dates and emergency contact information.

More information about Bus Transportation and any last-minute changes will be shared in upcoming editions of this Newsletter.




The Pledge of Allegiance

As you have heard previously, one of the goals and priorities of Sight First and LCIF is the elimination of River Blindness.

We scored another victory recently when it was announced that River Blindness has been eliminated in Columbia. Ecuador and Guatemala are not far behind.

River Blindness is one of the leading causes of preventable blindness worldwide. It is transmitted through the bite of black flies and can cause intense itching, disfiguring dermatitis, eye lesions and, over time, blindness. It is hyper-endemic in 33 countries, primarily in sub-Saharan Africa and isolated areas of Central and South America and Yemen.

Lions play a role in helping to eliminate this disease by distributing medication and informing the local community of the need to take the medication as directed.
