

#### **Procedures for Lions Day with the United Nations**

#### FORM AND PAYMENT

The registration form and payment must be received at Lions Clubs International no later than February 20, 2004. Due to United Nations security requirements, all those planning to attend must be pre-registered. Only registrations accompanied by payment will be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a check, draft or money order in U.S. dollars drawn on a U.S. bank and payable to Lions Clubs International.

#### REFUNDS

There will be no refunds after February 20, 2004. There are no exceptions. Since Lions Clubs International must pay for meals and fees whether registrants attend or not, this policy of no refunds applies to all registrants, including those needing to obtain a visa and those who are not issued a visa.

#### VISAS

Lions Clubs International does not have the ability to assist individuals in obtaining visas to attend this event. Issuing visas is the prerogative of the consulate of any country.

Lions Day with the UN is an event that is open to any Lion/guest from any country who pays the fee and attends the program in New York. Lions Clubs International is unable to issue special letters of invitation to any Lion wishing to attend the event. However, a confirmation letter will be sent to each person who registers.

#### **LUNCHEON WAITING LIST**

Luncheon seating is limited to 350. Reservations will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration forms and payments must be received at International Headquarters by February 20, 2004. UN security regulations require that every person attending must pre-register by the February 20, 2004 deadline.

After the 350 reservations for the luncheon have been made, additional registrants will be added to a luncheon waiting list based on available seats. Please note: If you are on the luncheon waiting list, it does not affect your participation in the day program. Prior to the luncheon on the day of the program, registrants will be called for available lunches according to the order of their name on the waiting list. Registrants who are not present when the seat becomes available will not receive a refund for the luncheon portion of their registration fee.

If you are in attendance and your name is not called, you will be issued a refund for the luncheon portion of the registration fee. This will be mailed to you a few weeks after the event. Because registration actually begins in September, it is recommended that those who want to attend the luncheon register as early as possible.

To remove your name from the luncheon waiting list, please call 1-630-571-5466, ext. 316 before the deadline of February 20, 2004. A refund will be issued for the meal portion of the registration fee several weeks after the event. Requests after the deadline cannot be honored.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Please use the public entrance located on First Avenue at 46 Street. Registration begins at 9 a.m.; program begins promptly at 10 a.m.

The March 12th date is official. However, the needs of governments always take precedence over NGO (non-governmental organization) requests. The Conference Room must be vacated if the General Assembly is called into an emergency meeting.

All sessions will be in English. Children younger than five years of age are not allowed in the UN.



## FOREVER CHANGING



With all of our cooking, baking and entertaining during the holiday season, our dishwashers get a workout. Here are some suggestions to help get the dishes clean.

Dishwashers today are much quieter and more efficient than the ones from 10 years ago. Some are so quiet they need a status light so you can tell the dishwasher is running.

"Intelligent" dishwashers are the ones which sense how dirty the dishes are and automatically run the proper number of cycles at the proper temperature to clean them. The controls on intelligent dishwashers also allow you to override the automatic setting and select any cycle you wish.

These dishwashers sense the cloudiness of the wash water to determine when the dishes are clean and no more cycles are needed. Some designs shine a beam of light through the water. A photo sensor determines when the water is clear enough indicating no more food is coming from dirty dishes.

Energy efficiency of dishwashers is primarily a function of the hot water usage and how long they run. The level of sound insulation, which will also keep the water warmer, will benefit the overall efficiency.

Dishwashers use a lot less water than doing the dishes by hand in most cases. Wait until you have a full load. You have the added bonus of not having to use your hot water, too. Most modem dishwashers have their own heater inside to heat the water for you.

The temperature of the water is a key factor in dissolving detergent and removing food from dishes, pots and pans. To do this most effectively, the water temperature should be 130 degrees or higher. With lower temperatures it is harder to remove greasy residues, and your dishes may develop spots and/or soap film. If your dishwasher doesn't heat the water automatically, you can adjust the water temperature by following the directions on your home's water heater.

Dishwasher detergents are available in powders, gels and tablets. All perform well, so the choice is usually personal preference. Gels dissolve quickly, allowing the detergent to begin working right away.

If your dishes are spotted or have a film, you may not be using enough detergent. Add more detergent, especially when washing full loads, or when using the air/no heat drying cycle.

Dishes washed only every two or three days can cause an odor. Use the rinse/hold cycle at least once a day until a full load accumulates, or hand-rinse the dishes before loading the dishwasher.

## **DIABETIC ESSAY RULES**

Topic: "What is the impact of exercise on diabetes?"

"Essay" is a written article read, by the author, at the District 2-S2 Youth Contest Day on a Saturday, March 21st, 2004 at Tomball Community College with other contestants from District Lions' Club. The District winner will compete with other contestants from other Districts in the State of Texas at the State Convention in Longview, June 4 & 5, 2004.

The essay does not exceed 1,500 words. All words in the essay are counted including articles, conjunctives and pronouns, for example: i.e., "a", "I", "and", and "an".

Each contestant must personally research, write, and read the contest essay and present it before judges and spectators. The essay must include a bibliography of sources used in its composition. In addition to copies used by the contestants in the reading of the essay, each contestant submits four double spaced, typewritten copies of the contest essay at the time the article is read.

The following criteria used for judging essay:

- a. 60 percent currentness, authenticity and application to the assigned Essay Topic.
- b. 15 percent grammars, sentence structure, pronunciation, enunciation, correct word usage, and relationship to the assigned essay.
- c. 25 percent understandability of the essay through personal presentation techniques in use of posture, eye contact and voice, by its modulation, volume, speed clarity and enunciation.

#### Each contestant must be or have been:

- a. Regularly enrolled as a student at a public high school or comparable educational program of learning.
- b. Junior or Senior level up to 19 years of age by June 5, 2004.
- c. Never married.

Contestant submits for publication with application, 2 wallet sized color photographs (close up of head and shoulders).

District 2-S2 (Houston area) Scholar/Grant: \$500.00 State Multiple District-2: Scholar/Grant: \$1000.00 for 1<sup>st</sup> Place and \$500.00 for 2<sup>nd</sup> Place.

## **Young Texans Speak Out on Drugs**

What are the challenges teens face in confronting a substance abuse problem?

The presentation should analyze the problem with present a solution. Research for this topic can be conducted by interviewing school officials, teachers, judges, law enforcement personnel, probation personnel, counselors, Juvenile Court Officials, legislators, medical personnel and by using the library. The topic is broad and allows the contestants considerable leeway in proposing the plan. Sources of data and any quotes used in the presentation should be identified by title and or date published (year if known). Innovative practical and reasonable ideas are welcomed. Each contestants must be a full time student in a Texas High School, a junior or senior class member at the time of the MD-2 convention and be sponsored by a Lion/Lioness/Leo Club in Multiple District 2.

The speech will be from 5 to 7 minutes in length. Notes, cue cards and video equipment may not be used at District or State contests. Contestants will be required to use either the stationary or hand held mike for presentation. A monitor will signal contestants at 5 minutes and at 6 ½ minutes. At 7 minutes, the monitor will signal and 5 points will be deducted from the contestant's score. A speech of less than 5 or 7 ½ minutes will be disqualified. Contestants will not give any self-introduction but give the title of their speech and then deliver the speech.

After all speeches have been delivered, the contestants will assemble at the lectern in order of their presentations, and will give their name, age, school, grade and sponsoring district and club. All person connected with the contest shall be introduced at this time, including judges, monitors, VIP's and etc.

Names of the winners will not be disclosed until the announcement at the Saturday luncheon on June 5<sup>th</sup> in Longview, Texas. The winner will present his/her speech at that time.

## **Outstanding Youth Scholarship Contest Rules and Guidelines**

Contestant must be a full time student at a public school or comparable educational program of learning, at the junior or senior level, within the area designated as District 2-S2 in Texas Lions Clubs districts. Contestant must be between the ages of 17 and 19 as of June 5, 2004. Contestant must not be nor have been a party to a marriage or cohabitation with a person of the opposite sex who is unrelated to contestant or have participated in the conception of a child before participation in the 2-S2 scholarship contest. Contestant must be available to attend the State Convention in Longview, Texas on June 4 & 5, 2004.

Each contestant's application shall be accompanied by an unofficial high school transcript and three letters of recommendation.

The maximum points to be used for judging contestants shall be:

a. Grade point average = 20 points.
 b. Personal biography information statement = 5 points.
 c. Three letters of recommendation (total) = 15 points.
 d. Community service / leadership = 30 points.
 e. Personal Interview = 30 points.

The judges' total scores are to be combined to reach a grand total score.

Contestants shall remain outside the contest room until invited to enter by the Contest Chairman.

Before the contestants enter the contest room, the audience is asked to refrain from applauding or celebrating until all contestants have been interviewed. No one is allowed to enter the contest room during an interview. Upon entering the contest room, contestants shall state only their names and then the interview shall proceed. Contestants may remain in the contest room to hear interview of other contestants.

When all interviews have been concluded, contestants shall assemble in the order of their presentations to state their names, hometowns, ages, schools, grade levels and sponsoring Lions clubs. The audience may collectively applaud upon completion of the process.

We have contracted for buses for the trip and for use in Detroit. On the way we will spend two nights in Branson and see three shows. Then it on to Detroit to elect Jimmy and enjoy the convention. The buses carry 55 passengers, have a rest room, vcr, large baggage belly and a P A system. In Detroit, we will have the use of the buses to take us to the parade staging area and pick us up at the end of the parade. We can use the buses for trips to the convention center and for side tours.

Buses are scheduled to depart Thursday, July 1st, from San Antonio, El Paso, Lubbock, Amarillo, Dallas and Houston. They will meet in Branson and convoy to Detroit arriving Sunday afternoon, July 4th. We will stay Friday night to celebrate the victory and leave Saturday morning, spend the night in St. Louis and return home Sunday.
