

District Governor C.W. "Buzz" Goins

Half way to the finish line of June 30, 2006 and ambivalence is the feeling of the day. There is great joy for the things accomplished and nagging guilt for those things yet to be done. And worst of all is the sure knowledge that all of the things will be not done. As a "feel good", rationalization does not work nor does it lessen the guilt. Realization is the better balm for the ego – all things take time, and time is indeed finite for all endeavors. "We have fought the good fight.", and therefore,

realizing our limitations, we go forward with a list of priorities and renewed resolve and energy. With newly derived insight, consider the following.

- 1. Few clubs will ever be as self sufficient and as productive as they should be. No club can be better than the voting membership who determines the course and destiny of the club. Every social grouping is subject to the evils of sloth, indolence and ennui which are as pervasive in the general society as they are in Lionism. In my travels, the "good clubs" have a core of enthusiastic members, and equally as important, are led by dynamic officers. The "strikingly better clubs" usually have a PDG or two in the background and have a modest turnover in membership. There is evidence suggesting that club health is cyclic, and if this is true, we must control the incidence of "low performing" clubs. The first step is to require **all** elected officers to attend training before taking office. It is truly astounding (and frightening) what some officers do not know the mechanics of their job and Lionism. The District will provide the training.
- 2. Some clubs will always disagree with the Governor's 100% Charity List. The Governor's Office selects these charities based on what they can do for the whole of society and the community specifically. Usually, these charities serve a small number of people over a wide geographic area. For example, LPCCI (Lions Project for Canine Companions Independence) was added this year because of an incident two years ago. The district was requested to provide a Companion Dog to assist a local person. Investigation showed that such a dog would cost \$8,000.00 plus. Joining this charity, which is a Lions Project, gets the dog for a much less cost, and more importantly, puts us in-line to get a dog when one is required. One dollar per member per year is insignificant when compared to the good provided not to mention all the joy brought to the local "puppy raisers" who help supply the dogs. Surely, the Governor's 100% Charity List is not so insidious to warrant being ignored? You will never get as much "bang for your buck" as you will for this \$32.00 per year per member, and it comes out of the Activities Fund.
- 3. Our involvement in youth is more vocal than action. LEOs are doing well but could do better. The youth contests are much better this year than in the past. So you do not or can not find contestants. (Amazing how many people have forgotten where the local school is located.) We have the people who will do the work. What we need are the people to bankroll the effort. Community and youth wise, I believe every club should sponsor at least one person in one of the youth programs. The involvement is just writing a check for money that comes from the Activities Fund. This is the perfect solution for the non involved or the much "too busy" crowd.
- 4. On the subject of money, one of the premier events last year was the Women's Symposium that was sponsored by a grant form LCIF. Our District was one of two grant winners on a world wide basis. The LCI emphasis on the women's role in Lionism dictates that this event be repeated but, unfortunately, without the grant money. We are asking for voluntary club donations for this effort scheduled for March 25, 2006. Another example of Activities Fund money that goes directly to the heart of Lionism which is local community involvement. A few very good people are doing a lot of great work help them, please.

Don't forget the Mid-Winter Lions Leadership Conference (MWLLC) and The Bob Dowden Dinner.






