This Club's Venture Crew Scouts helped collect the food and distribute the baskets. These Lions purchased 20 Christmas wreaths and placed them on soldiers' graves at the National Cemetery in Houston. The Venture Scouts assisted them in this project.

The Houston Northwest Lions Club will hold a Chicken BarBQ: on April 23 and-24. They will also hold a Club Social on Saturday, February 28th at the Hot Dog Shop. These Lions held a Christmas Party for the children of Mission of Yahweh.. This is the second year they have hosted a party for these children. Mission of Yahweh is a homeless shelter for single women and their children. Approximately 25 children and their mothers live there. \$300.00 was spent on toys for the children. Additional donations from friends of Lions added enough to spend a total of \$650.00. . The children were entertained with games and awarded prizes. District Governor Barron Cagle took the role of "Santa" Each child had his/her picture taken with Santa and that picture was presented to the mother of the pictured child. Singing Christmas Carols ended the party at 3:00PM. A total of 40 people were in attendance including the children, mothers and other single women living at the Mission as well as the Northwest Lions.

The Houston Spring Branch Lions prepared a total of 150 Christmas Bags for the Turning Point Homeless Shelter. They also sold baked briskets and hams for Christmas.

The Houston Westbury Lions Club was able to donate about 70 stuffed animals to needy children for holiday gifts. Some of the stuffed animals were donated to The Speech and Hearing Center as well. This Club ended 2008 with a fabulous holiday party for their members, friends and prospective members. These Lions did quite well selling Entertainment Books for their fundraiser this year.

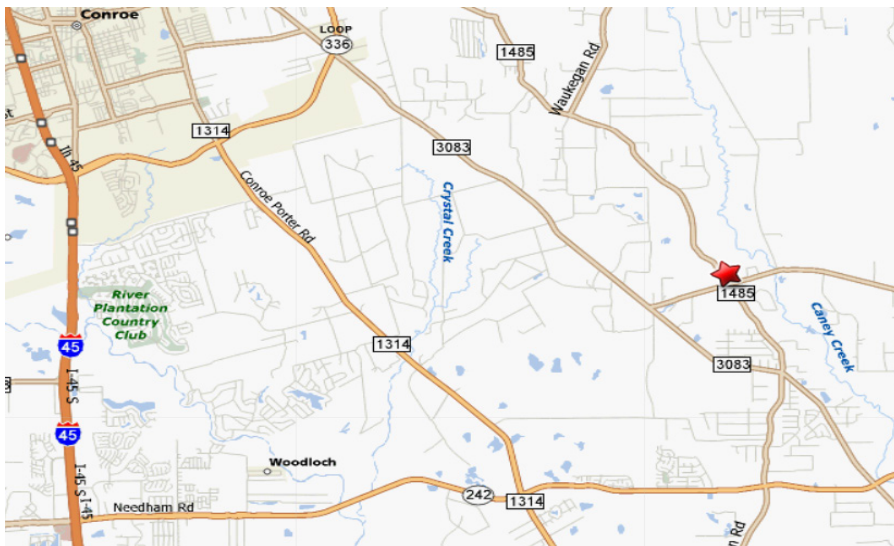

### Presidents' Day

This is truly an historic year in politics for the United States. The U.S. is preparing for another changing of the guard with the inauguration of Barack Obama as the 44th President of the United States. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Association Distinguished Achievement Award is to “bestow honor upon those Lions in District 2-S2 who have shown outstanding leadership and service achievement to their Club, Community and District.”

**QUALIFICATIONS**

Minimum qualifications for the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Distinguished Achievement Award are:

- (a) An active member with at least seven (7) years of service. This award is for living Lions only, unless the honoree passes away after being nominated.
- (b) Outstanding leadership and dedicated service to Club, Community and district.
- (c) Special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate.
- (d) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a member of any Lions Hall of Fame.
- (e) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a District Governor or Past District Governor of any Lions Clubs International District.

**NOMINATIONS**

The completed application form(s), will be provided to the Chairman of the District Governor’s Honorary Committee. Said application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application(s) are required to be received by February 15th of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to induct someone each and every year.
