
Effects of Deforestation

Deforestation is the removal of trees to facilitate farming activities, mining, roads and grazing of cattle. This act has become a major issue in environmental circles because it affects life in general. Slash and burn means cutting down trees and burning of forested areas to establish crops and provide pastures. This method of land clearing is the most frequently used method of clearing agricultural lands. When we destroy the forests by ranching, logging, farming and industrial activities we are creating an imbalance. Do we really want to do this?

Why is there need for trees? Trees play an important role in the quality of life on Earth. Trees assist in improving air quality by trapping carbon and other pollutants. They determine the amount of rainfall we receive by replenishing the clouds, they cool and regulate earth's climate, reduce erosion, landslides and enhance soil fertility.

Some of the negative impacts of deforestation include soil erosion, loss of biodiversity, increased disease transmission, political turmoil, climate disruption, and destruction of forest based societies. Despite the adverse effects of deforestation on the environment, the quality of the soil and water are also affected. Humans are also affected due to the aesthetic value of the land being reduced and less space is available for recreation and cultural practices.

Fellow Lions putting the issues on the back burner will only threaten life on Earth much more. If we don't fix the problems now when the forests are gone we won't be able to fix it then.

It's Not That Far!

It's not that far. I didn't mind the heat. Waiting eight hours was not a bother. Comments like these are heard by the Lion volunteers, who go on foreign missions, because people have to walk for miles and miles in oppressive heat (or monsoon rains), and have to wait for hours just to get a used pair of glasses. They might have to wait days to get their child actually examined by an actual eye doctor... **but it is that far**, and they risk heat stroke, and they camp outside a clinic likely in unsanitary conditions for days, to get the help they so desperately need to see.

Of course, on those missions where an actual optometrist office has been set up, the equipment is too big to move around, so people have to come to it. Basically we are talking about the doctor's chair with the phoropter attached. The phoropter is that big set of glasses with wheels and dials all over it, which the Optometrist uses to get your refractive status and obtain the prescription.

With children we always need a phoropter and an Optometrist, because they need new glasses prescribed. Children would readily accommodate to a near prescription, if you tried to put recycled glasses on them, which would only make it worse.

TLERC's pilot Children's Eyeglass Program is already proving that we can operate a lab and make brand new prescription glasses for children from a long distance. We also are showing that Lions in developing countries can be successfully trained to make prescription glasses on manual lens cutting equipment.

So what if we could get the phoropter to the children in their own villages, where they would not have to travel so far. That's what TLERC is working on now. PDG Ike Fitzgerald has put together a simple tripod system from which a phoropter can be mounted. The whole thing weighs less than 10 pounds. So now it is possible to take the mission Doctor from town to town reaching many more children. Prescriptions could be sent to nearby lens labs operated by the Lions to make the new glasses for the kids.

So what's the problem? Let's just go out and buy a bunch of lens cutting machines and Phoropters. It's a matter of money. We need more Focus Clubs (\$3/member) and "Visionary Knights of the Blind" (min. \$100/yr. or \$10/mo bank draft). We are a long way from 25 Visionaries/District. If you are a Club President, please have your District Director come speak to your Club. He/she can tell you about all of the programs, many of which offer you chances to SERVE right in your own community.

With funding to buy the equipment and provide training, we not only will SERVE many more children with a new pair of glasses, but we will also teach these areas to develop their own optical industry and become self-sustaining.

Even more exciting, if we can put new glasses on children in these developing areas that have no optical industry, how much of a leap is it to be able to put new glasses with an accurate prescription on adults? Actually, it's not that far!


