Thoughts from your District Governor

Several years ago, as part of my job at an offshore drilling, I used to travel globally visiting our offices and in many instances our rigs. It was a lot of travel, but it was definitely a learning experience being able to see a lot of different regions of the world. Not many tourist destinations other than airports, but then I'd drive or catch another smaller plane to an oil producing part of the country. When I visited rigs I would reach it by a boat ride if it was close to shore, but in most instances a helicopter ride would be involved. After several years of riding helicopters to the rig without any problem, it was discovered by someone at the company that I hadn't had the needed safety training. This was typically only required in my company for people who worked on the rigs or travelled to them during the normal duties of their job. I worked in Information Technology and working on a rig wasn't a normal part of my job, but someone decided it had grown to be a normal part of my job and I'd have to go through the training.

The training is called Helicopter Underwater Egress Training or HUET for short. HUET is for preparing passengers for emergency exit in the case of a crash landing over water. It involves strapping the trainees in to a helicopter simulator and dunking them in a pool while also flipping the simulator upsidedown. I'm not sure if all the training is the same, but the one I went through involved this "dunking" several times. Initial dunks involved exiting through a window that you are sitting right beside. Some of the later dunks involved that exit no longer being available and needing to exit through a window on the other side of the simulator. This was quite different, because now you had to wait for the person sitting by that window exit to open the exit while unbuckling themselves then swim out where they would clear the area. You had to wait to make sure you weren't kicked in the face while they were swimming out. To make this point clear, while you were waiting you for them to exit and clear you were strapped in to this helicopter simulator upside-down and underwater. Now the training wasn't overly stressful and I had no fear of actually drowning. Scuba divers were monitoring and they were right there to assist the second it looked like anyone needed help. But sitting there strapped in the simulator, just hanging out waiting for them to clear out, it seemed to take forever. Then when it was your turn to exit first and the other person had to wait, funny thing that seemed to take forever too. Much longer than when I was the only person going out my own window. Now I was responsible for someone else's exiting too and that somehow made the process of opening the window while unbuckling, swimming out and making room for them take much longer. In actuality, it probably didn't add any time but it seemed too. Other than learning the skills I needed to continue travelling to the rigs (and thankfully never having to put these skills to use), it also helped reiterate the point that when you are on a team sometimes you have to depend on others to help you achieve your own goals.

In Lions, we don't have to worry about surviving helicopters ditching in the water so HUET training isn't necessary. We also might think we don't have our own individual goals in Lionism. We all probably do have goals related to Lions, we just might not think of them that way. You goal might be a general one, such as having the club become stronger. You might have a specific one about a new project, fundraiser or charity to support. In any case, you are on a team. The best team in all the world's service organizations. So talk to other Lions in your club or your district. See if together you can help spell out the goals and then plan a way to achieve them. Your goal might just be requiring another member of your team to open the window first before you can swim out.



MD-2 TEXAS LIONS HALL OF FAME

- 1) Elevation of Lions into the Texas Lions Hall of Fame bestows an honor upon one who has been outstanding in using their time, talents and resources to further the cause of humanitarian services.
- 2) The MD-2 State Office shall, at the first council meeting each year, distribute information about nomination criteria to District Governors.
- 3) Selection shall be by the Hall of Fame Committee for each district. The committee of five members each, from different clubs, shall be appointed by the District Governor. The nominee shall be certified to the Council of Governors not later than the February Council meeting.
- 4) Minimum standards to qualify for the Texas Lions Hall of Fame are:
 - a) Be an active or deceased member with at least fifteen years of service,
 - b) Having provided outstanding and dedicated service to Lionism beyond the call of duty,
 - c) Having provided other than Lionistic service to community, state and nation,
 - d) Having accomplished special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate, and
 - e) Not having solicited in any manner for this recognition, which will automatically eliminate the soliciting candidate for that year.
- 5) A fee of \$227.50 shall accompany the nominee's profile. Selection of International Directors is automatic and no fee is required. The Hall of Fame fee covers the cost of the Hall of Fame Medallion and, the Hall of Fame Plaque, which is presented to each nominee.
- 6) Presentation of the selected nominee, by the District Governor, shall be at the MD-2 Convention. Each selected nominee will receive a duplicate of the plaque placed in the Hall of Fame.
- 7) A plaque with the names of to the Texas Lions Hall of Fame members shall be maintained in an appropriate space at the MD-2 State Office.
- 8) The nominees shall be selected in accordance with the following schedule:

2005-2006:	2-T2, 2-T3, 2-X3, 2-A2, 2-S2 and 2-S5	2012-2013:	2-E2, 2-X1, 2-X2, 2-A3 and 2-S3
