White Cane Day is Coming

Throughout the world, the long white cane is used by people who are blind or visually impaired as a tool for safe and reliable navigation. The white cane is a symbol of the user's skills and talents, mobility and independence. It also allows the sighted person to recognize that the user is visually impaired.

The white cane was initially developed and put into use as a measure of safety, especially in traffic situations. Sufficient training with an Orientation and Mobility specialist can aid in successful cane use, technique and safety. Several countries have traffic laws designed to protect the person using the white cane. The "VisionAware" section of the American Foundation for the Blind's website illustrates several types of white canes that are internationally recognized. Sometimes the white cane has a red band or strip for the purpose of contrast.

International White Cane Safety Day is October 15th, but traditionally in our District, we coordinate our service projects at the end of March. This gives Lions an opportunity to increase awareness of the white cane traffic safety laws. According to the World Blind Union, which is a global organization representing the 285 million blind or partially sighted people worldwide, "White Cane Day is observed worldwide to recognize the movement of blind people from dependency to full participation in society."

Suggested Activities for Lions

Mobilize your club to partner with local blindness experts, schools and organizations for the blind to plan your International White Cane Safety Day awareness activity.

- Arrange for a person who is blind to demonstrate the use of the white cane and its benefits, and share his or her accomplishments and aspirations with the community or your club.
- Invite a representative from a local school for the blind or a low vision clinic to speak about white cane, orientation and mobility and white cane laws in your community.
- Work with your local government officials to create a White Cane Safety Day Proclamation for your event.
- Work with local news media to convey your community's white cane laws to the public.

Consider a fundraiser service project and send proceeds to the Lions Eye Bank of Texas to help with education about preventing blindness and promotion of the donor registry.



Certified Guiding Lions

I have been asked by District Governor Noah Speer and Global Leadership Chair Sam Thomas to conduct a training session to Certify Lions to be Guiding Lions.

Why is this needed?? Every new club that is organized in the District needs to have at least 2 Certified Guiding Lions assigned to it. These Lions attend every regular club and Board of Directors meeting that the club has during its first two years of existence. These Lions are there to help "guide", not "tell" the club how it should be run. They are there to answer any questions by officers and members, to keep them from doing something that goes against the Lions Constitution and By Laws. They are there to encourage, NOT run the new club.

I have been privileged to assist three separate clubs during my years as a Certified Guiding Lion. As many of you know, I am not one to idly sit by and not "offer" my opinion. The hardest thing for me was to "keep my mouth shut unless asked a question". If I could see that the club was struggling with a particular item, I would ask them a question that would get them restarted.

If you have a desire to help new clubs get started, or help reorganize struggling existing clubs, please contact me. I would like to setup a training session for new Certified Guiding Lions. The training session takes about three hours to complete. You will review the history of LCI, learn about the techniques in helping a new club, and have an interactive workshop. Depending upon the number of Lions who would like to attend, we may be able to hold several training sessions in various parts of the District.

EARLY CHILDHOOD VISION SCREENING

Lions are committed to promoting and saving vision. To help in this, the District has recently purchased vision screening equipment from Plusoptix. This equipment will be available to all clubs within our District. Before your club can schedule the use of this equipment, members from your club need to be certified in its use. Members of the Houston Cy-Fair Lions Club will assist you in starting your program. The District is beginning to put together a manual on the use of this equipment. Some vision problems, if not caught and treated early, can lead to permanent blindness. Typical vision screening where a child reads from a chart 10 feet away only checks for the ability to see far away. We use a special camera by Plusoptix, which takes a picture of the child's eyes, and within 3-5 seconds, can detect vision problems including nearsightedness, farsightedness, astigmatism, unequal pupil size, "lazy eye", and other problems. With this device, Lions can easily and successfully screen children from six months of age and older. Children with vision problems are not aware that they cannot see well, as they cannot compare their vision to others. Vision problems in children do not cause pain or inflammation, so parents and teachers are not aware that there is a problem. The Plusoptix Vision Screener gives us a message of PASS or REFER immediately at the screening. Children who are referred should be seen by a professional for a complete vision examination.

Screenings can be held at health fairs, community events, day care centers, Mother Day Out programs, and anywhere else you can get permission.

Below is a link to a short video of Lions Club members conducting a vision screening in a Day Care setting. All you need is a small room with blinds/curtains to block out the light, a small table, about 3 chairs, and an electrical outlet, and the use of one of facility workers who knows the children by name. We take about 6 children into the room at a time to allow their eyes to adjust to the low light, which helps quicken the screening process. All children screened will need a consent form completed and signed. Samples can be provided by the Houston Cy-Fair Lions. Please review the attached videos. This is a free community service, with no cost to the facility or the children.

NOMINATIONS

The completed application form(s), will be provided to the Chairman of the District Governor's Honorary Committee. Said application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application(s) are required to be received by February 15th of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to induct someone each and every year.


