The purpose of the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Association Distinguished Achievement Award is to “bestow honor upon those Lions in District 2-S2 who have shown outstanding leadership and service achievement to their Club, Community and District.”

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum qualifications for the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Distinguished Achievement Award are:

- (a) An active member with at least seven (7) years of service. This award is for living Lions only, unless the honoree passes away after being nominated.
- (b) Outstanding leadership and dedicated service to Club, Community and/or District.
- (c) Special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate.
- (d) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a District Governor or Past District Governor of any Lions Clubs International District.

NOMINATIONS

The completed application form(s), will be provided to the Chairman of the District Governor’s Honorary Committee. Said application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application(s) are required to be received by February 15th of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to induct someone each and every year.

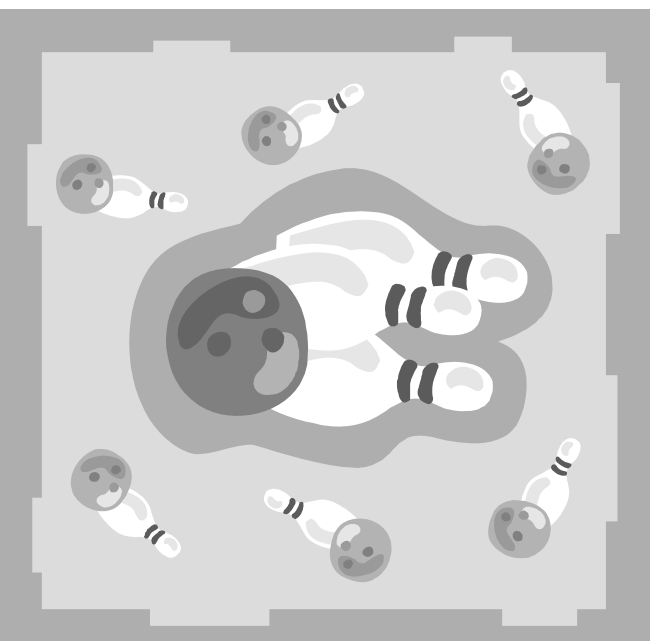

Proceeds from the Bowl-a-thon benefit the Lions Eye Bank of Texas, exists to promote the work of the Lions Eye Bank of Texas at Baylor College of Medicine, and in particular, provide community education about the need for donation, vision safety and prevention for the causes of preventable corneal blindness.

The Lions Eye Bank of Texas services the entire Texas Gulf Coast and parts of East Texas. In 2016, the Eye Bank distributed over 1,100 donor corneas for transplant.

Thanks to the Lions' contributions and funds from special fund-raising events, the Eye Bank is able to continue its educational and community outreach programs along with providing corneas at no charge to indigent patients in need of a transplant.

Registration

Teams of 4 bowlers can register for the Bowl-A-Thon by filling out a registration form and returning it with \$150 by mail to the Lions Eye Bank of Texas. The fee increases to \$160 for registering onsite the day of the event. Checks should be made payable to the **Lions Eye Bank of Texas**. Each person will bowl three games. No one will be allowed to bowl until the waiver on the registration form is signed. Bowlers may also register at the Bowl-A-Thon, subject to lane availability. Individuals will be assigned to teams and can participate for \$40 each or \$45 for onsite. Registrations received after March 13, will not be guaranteed an event t-shirt.

Prizes

Participants have a chance to win prizes for the highest team score and highest individual score. Door prizes will also be given away throughout the event.

Registration and payment must be postmarked by **March 10, 2017** to be included in the drawing to win 50% of registration fees in tickets to be used at the event.

March for Service

Lions Clubs International has granted approval of another new Lions Club in our District – the Nassau Bay 100 Centennial Lions Club. Our District is growing in the number of new Clubs and expanding service to more of our neighbors in need. Your District leadership team has plans to continue expanding into additional areas and adding additional new Clubs to continue our service and ensure greater needs can be met by caring Lions into the next century of Lionism.

We have fifty-five great Lions Clubs across our District now. Many have rich histories of fifty, seventy-five and one hundred years of service behind them. Now is the time that we need to focus District attention and support on our existing Clubs and make plans to support their growth and ensure they are around to meet the needs of their respective communities.

In traveling around our district, I've learned a lot about our Clubs from conversations with the membership. Most say they wish they could attract younger, upwardly mobile career-minded individuals into their clubs, but they just don't know how. I don't believe that there is a simple answer. What I do know, however, is that some of our Clubs are successful at doing just that – bringing in new members just like those I described.

So, what's the secret? The first answer that comes to my mind is "Service". We are a service organization and we must provide service. I'm reading a book right now (written in 1949) about the early years of Lionism titled *The World's Biggest Doers*. The central theme credited for the tremendous success and growth of the International Association of Lions Clubs follows "The Jones Law". It was Melvin Jones' belief that "You can't get very far without doing something for somebody else." So, if your Club isn't planning a service project, start thinking about what you can do. Ask a neighboring Club to join you if you need Lions to work your project. Vision Screening, for example, is rapidly becoming a popular Club project, even for Clubs without the expensive screening equipment.

My challenge for Lions is to look at the remainder of the year and start planning a new member event before the end of the year. Several Lions have told me they have held very successful Open House events to bring in new prospects. At these events, Lions can show examples of past service activities and ask prospects if they see unmet needs in our communities that Lions could help alleviate. Keep it informal and simple. Don't forget to ask them if they'd like to help you serve!

To end our year strong, let's see if we can create a district-wide event I will call "March for Service". Plan an Open House for March. That gives us a couple of months to prepare. Print special invitations. Ask each member to invite at least two potential prospects. Serve something simple – light snacks, finger foods and punch or tea. Find a room in a local restaurant, fellowship hall or school. There's plenty of time to make this a special project for every member of your club. Don't forget to invite your members who rarely participate in your activities. It might be an opportunity to reengage them with the Club. My final request is to keep your District in the loop – let us know what, when and where your event will be. If you'd like your Governor's Team to help, let me know! Good luck!

How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2017. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "The Future of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging.
