Here it is February and we lack **7 MMR's** for the month of December and **27 MMR's** for January. **MMR's are due by the 10th of each month.**

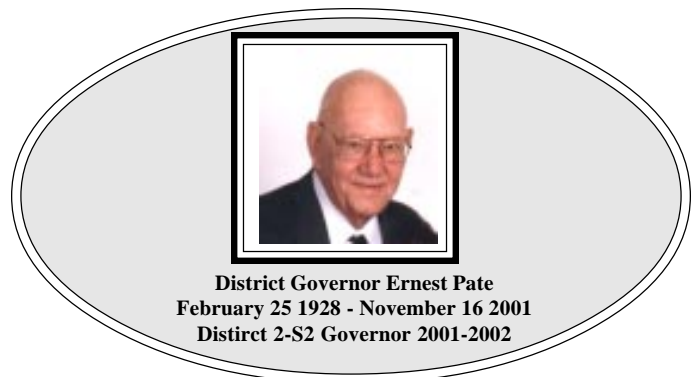

TEXAS LIONS FOUNDATION ADOPTS JUVENILE DIABETES PROJECT

The Texas Lions Foundation is an organization owned and operated by all of the Lions of Texas through a board of Trustees representing the sixteen Lions Club Districts in Texas. The foundation was established in 1984 as a public, no-profit, tax-exempt corporation, and its purpose is to promote human welfare by careful application of contributed funds.

Your foundation has adopted Juvenile Diabetes as an ongoing project. The latest endeavor is the preparation by Dr. Steve Ponder of an 18 minute video entitled "Taking Diabetes to School". This professionally produced film in color is directed toward the classroom teacher in order to better inform them about diabetic students in their classes. This first year we are concentrating on Class 1-A and Class 2-A schools in Texas. Lions Club members have been requested to deliver these videos to the School Administrators in their neighborhood. We will now start concentrating on the Class 3-A schools where there are 225 districts and a total of 851 campuses.

Also this year, the Texas Lions Foundation has issued four emergency grants. These include \$2000 after a flood in Skidmore-Tynan area (District 2-S4); \$2000 following a flood in Stockdale (District 2-A2); \$2000 after a tornado in Hondo (District 2-A2); and \$2000 following a tornado in Decatur (District 2-E2). Emergency grants are limited to \$2000 and can be issued immediately upon receipt of a Grant Application form from the District Governor or Trustee to Executive Director PID Edwin H. Flood.

All of the monies received for these awards goes in the corpus fund of the foundation and only the income received from these investments is used for grants.

MERCURY THERMOMETERS



'IM SORRY MOMMA, I THOUGHT YOU WERE FINISHED WITH THE DISTRICT NEWSLETTER.'

That silvery glass mercury thermometer that Mom slipped under your tongue now is considered Public Enemy No. 1 by health professionals and environmental activists. So concerned are they about the effects of mercury vapors released from broken thermometers that they are urging residents to search their medicine cabinets for the fever measuring dinosaurs and turn them in. They are considered hazardous waste.

Why demonize such a long standing member of the medicine cabinet? Because when a broken thermometer releases mercury vapors into the environment, it can end up in lakes and rivers where it can be transformed into highly toxic methylmercury. Only one gram of mercury per year is necessary to contaminate all the fish in a 20-acre lake. Consider the havoc those vapors enclosed in a home can wreak upon its occupants.

Nearly everyone over the age of 40 has marveled at the slippery beads of mercury that split off from each other like atoms once freed from their glass tube. And granted, officials say that the breaking of one thermometer is unlikely to threaten the health of a consumer.

If the mercury seeps into carpeting, for instance, it eventually will vaporize and could reach dangerous levels in indoor air.

Don't use a vacuum cleaner either, falsely believing out of sight, out of mind. That tactic can actually increase the risk. So could the accidental heating of the freed mercury.

RECOMMENDATIONS ARE:

1. Increase ventilation in the room with outside air and close the room off from the rest of the house. If available, use fans for a minimum of one hour to help ventilate the room.
2. Pick up the mercury with an eyedropper or scoop up beads with a piece of heavy paper, such as playing cards or index cards.
3. Place the mercury and contaminated collection instruments and any broken glass in a plastic zipper bag. Place this zipper bag inside a second zipper bag and then in a third zipper bag, tightly sealing each bag. Place the bags in a wide-mouth, scalable plastic container.
4. Call your local health department to find the nearest approved mercury disposal location.
5. If weather permits, leave windows open for approximately two days to assure the area is completely ventilated.
6. When cleaning up a mercury spill, do not use household cleaning products, particularly those that contain ammonia or chlorine.

 Form must be **postmarked by March 31st** to be counted in the contest
