

Dear Lenny:

On behalf of the staff, Board of Trustees and children of Houston Ear Research Foundation, we would like to thank Lion's Club, District 2-S2 for your past support and confidence in our program. Your most recent contribution of hearing aids to be used as loaners for infants identified with severe to profound hearing loss as part of the Texas newborn hearing screening program have been a tremendous assistance. As you can imagine, new parents experience a tremendous shock when informed that their newborn baby has a significant hearing loss.

We have started a program, with the assistance of your donated hearing aids, where we can immediately provide appropriate amplification for these infants. Parents then are allowed a period to deal with the issue of hearing loss at their own rate, without having to worry about financing the hearing aids. When the child is 1 year of age, they can receive the cochlear implant, if appropriate. If implanted, they return the hearing aids to be "recycled" for other infants; if implantation is not appropriate, we direct parents to the process of obtaining their own hearing aids, and the hearing aids are also returned to be used again. This allows the most appropriate hearing health care management, with the hope of minimizing additional stress for the new parents.

We most recently, with District 2-S2's assistance, fitted a 3 month old with binaural hearing aids. The child's reaction was priceless: he immediately quieted, smiled and gurgled!! His mother began crying as this was the first time she had seen her child respond to sound of any kind, and she was so encouraged that, indeed, we might be able to help her son.

Houston Ear Research Foundation is a non-profit 501 (c) (3) foundation started by H. E. Maddox, III, M.D., in 1983 for medical research and education, primarily involving the cochlear implant, a surgical procedure for severely and profoundly hearing impaired. We have grown to be one of the premier cochlear implant centers in the country. We rely on contributions from individuals, corporations and private philanthropic groups and we receive no government funding. No one is denied hearing health care.

The cochlear implant is an electronic inner ear device that helps people with severe to profound hearing losses regain some ability to hear. One part of the implant is surgically placed into the inner ear (cochlea) and sound, converted by another part of the device into electrical impulses, is passed to the hearing nerve. The cochlear implant provides sound awareness and some speech understanding for those who would otherwise not even be aware of sound.

Thank you for your continued interest and support of Houston Ear Research Foundation. Please feel welcome to visit the Foundation, and see for yourselves how you have contributed to our program. It is truly touching to watch a child hear for the first time! If you have any question, please contact us.



DUMPSTER DIVING



Perhaps this is one reason Governor Bud gets so many new members He looks everywhere possible.

Dumpster diving is the name given to the activity of climbing into these giant garbage containers in order to rummage through other people's trash. This free venue for used goods definitely isn't for everyone. Nonetheless, there are plenty of stout-hearted individuals who claim dumpster diving is both fun and profitable. After hauling their salvaged treasures home and cleaning them up, divers either use them, peddle their finds at flea markets or sell them to secondhand shops and antique stores.

Prime times for dumpster diving are the week after Christmas, around Easter (spring cleaning) and when school lets out in residential neighborhoods near colleges and universities. According to those with experience, store openings and closings generate superior scavenging opportunities, and the bins behind advertising agencies often hold coveted surprises that are abandoned after product shoots. When rummage sales are over, somewhat less desirable unsold curios often end up in a nearby dumpster. To find specific items, veteran divers recommend visiting dumpsters located behind businesses that sell, service or use the product being sought.

For those who find the idea intriguing, here are some guidelines: To begin with, ask permission before diving into a private dumpster. Then, rather than actually climbing inside, which in fact isn't recommended, extend your reach with a pair of long-handled tongs or a "fishing pole" made from a stick with a bent nail or metal hook protruding from the end. During the search, watch out for broken glass, sharp objects, empty chemical containers and other hazardous waste. Consider wearing protective glasses, sturdy boots, gloves and similarly appropriate clothing.
