2-S2, I'm Proud of You

Vice District Governor C.W. “Buzz” Goins



A point to ponder: Hubris a Greek word meaning an “excess of pride”. All the tragic heroes in Greek mythology met their downfall because of an excess of pride.

A conversation with some LEOs at the MwLLC:

Mr. Goins, “Why is a man making duck noises and stopping the proceedings to fine someone?”
“A very good question, for which I have the answer, let me explain.”

First, we must define a “Lion”. A Lion is someone who has chosen to join a like- minded group to help those who are infirmed, ailing, afflicted or otherwise in need of help - in other words, “Someone who has not enjoyed the good fortune that **he** has, and also believes that **his** good fortune is to be shared, and that **he** needs to give-back to the community.” Further, a Lion is an individual possessing great confidence in him self as indicated by his actions and demeanor, and as they say “Is very comfortable in his skin.” In joining the “like minded people”, the Lions Club”, he must now subjugate himself to the rules and will of that majority. Unity and strength of numbers are the real power in a Lions Club, and this power grows as long as there is unity. Once egos are allowed to come onto the playing field, their divisive companions “I” and “Me” will start to out muscle the sometimes fragile alliance of the “We “, “Us”, and “Our”, and this can be the beginning of the end of a club.

The man with the duck call (A variety of obnoxious sounding devices are used.) is called a “Tail Twister”, and his job is to keep the meeting or proceedings on course and within the rules while maintaining a lighted hearted atmosphere. The Tail Twister is on guard for breaches of protocol, dress code, and almost any other infraction, real or fancied that he may choose. The proceedings shall be conducted with decorum and project an air of sober dignity that befits the Lions. The Lion being fined may not be guilty of an infraction of the rules – the Tail Twister may just want to establish his authority and remind the group of their obligation to conduct a meaningful meeting according to the rules. The Tail Twister is responsible to maintain all aspects of the proceedings within the rules, and his authority is absolute. He can be challenged, but such a challenge requires a unanimous vote of the assembly, and he will not vote against himself. Most, if not all, disagreements that arise can be reduced to trivial “nothings” by a good Tail Twister and a copy of Robert’s Rules of Order. No one Lion nor small group should ever rule the Club.

“I understand Mr. Goins, but why do LEOs not have Tail Twisters?” “Very simple, when you become an adult, you will have learned how to curb your ego and be happy to serve and be a part of the group in order to achieve the greater good.”

Congratulations to all the Tail Twisters. Keep up the good work!

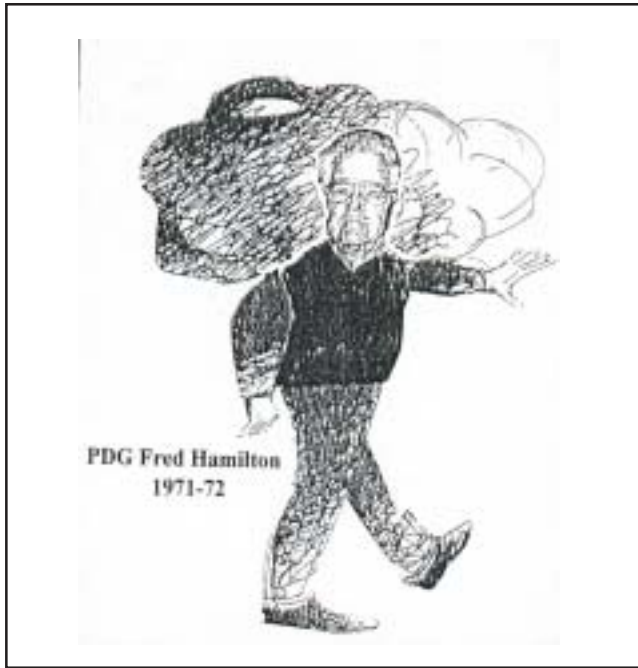

Older Americans in the most polluted parts of the country are significantly more likely to need medical treatment, particularly for lung ailments, according to a study that suggests reducing pollution could cut medical spending as well.

Earlier studies have established a link between air pollution and early death, but this is the first large scale look at the impact on medical care itself.

With medical care spending exceeding \$1 trillion a year, even a reduction of only a few percentage points would save society tens of billions of dollars annually. Use of medical care is significantly higher in areas with more pollution.

The study found air pollution significantly increases Medicare recipients' medical care needs, even after controlling for region, population size, education, income, cigarette use and obesity. Because race plays such a large role in health, the study focused only on whites.

In general, it found hospital admissions were greatest in the Deep South and in southern states nearby: Arkansas, Oklahoma and Texas.

STUDY:

REDUCING POLLUTION COULD CUT MEDICAL SPENDING

Specifically, the analysis found hospital admissions for respiratory problems were, on average, 19 percent higher in the 37 areas with the highest air pollution compared with the 37 areas with the least amount of pollution.

Similarly, outpatient care was 18 percent higher and hospital admissions were 10 percent higher.

Controlling for demographic and health factors, the researchers found Medicare would have saved an average of \$76.70 per person in inpatient care and \$100.30 in outpatient care for every drop of 10 micrograms per cubic meter in air pollution.

Economist Randall Lutter, a resident scholar at the conservative American Enterprise Institute, said it's already known that air pollution affects health.

He criticized the study, saying it appeared to him to use crude measurements to get at the differences around the country. He noted, for instance, that stress also can affect health and that stress may be much different in New York City than in Des Moines, Iowa.
