#### SEAFOOD WATCH



**Farmed Rainbow Trout:** U.S. trout farms are regulated and monitored by the EPA and state water quality departments. Though there has been concern that farmed trout could spread disease to wild trout populations, research shows that disease outbreaks and their effect on wild populations are minimal.

Although trout are carnivorous fish, they are efficient at converting their feed into edible protein. To reduce their impact on wild fisheries, trout farmers are reducing the amount of fishmeal in trout feed.

**Farmed Catfish:** Channel catfish are the type most often farm-raised in the U.S. Catfish can eat soybean and wheat pellets, reducing the demand on ocean fish used in fish feed. Using closed freshwater ponds, catfish farmers can control water quality.

**Farmed Clams, Oysters Mussels:** Shellfish farms cause little impact on the environment because shellfish filter their food right out of the sea water, requiring no use of feed.

**Farmed Talapia:** In the U.S., most tailapia are farmed in inland recirculating systems that have little impact on the environment. Tilapia thrive on inexpensive vegetable-based foods, making them a good source of eco-friendly protein.

**Farmed Striped Bass:** Farmed striped bass is actually a hybrid between wild striped bass and white bass.

Most farms are located inland, so ocean pollution from discharge of wastewater is not a factor. Neither is disease or genetic risk to wild populations, since there are no wild hybrid striped bass.

#### **Dungeness, Stone Canadian Snow Crabs:**

Dungeness, are protected by regulations on the U.S. West Coast: fishermen may keep only mature male crabs and must release all females. The stone crab fishery is also considered sustainable. Florida lands 98 percent of U.S. production. These crabs regenerate their claws, so crabbers remove only one claw from each crab, and the animal is released alive. Adult stone crabs can regenerate their claws three or four times. Crabs are caught in traps, a method considered eco-friendly because fishermen can release undersized crabs and other "bycatch" unharmed.

#### Shrimp: U.S.. Farmed or Trawl Caught:

Efforts are improving in the U.S. to reduce environmental impacts from shrimp farms and to reduce bycatch of other marine life from trawling nets.

Wild Alaskan Salmon: Certified sustainable the Marine Stewardship Council. Canned salmon is wild Alaskan salmon, so it's also a best choice. Stick with Alaskan over other wild salmon, which are facing problems.


