



EACH CHARTERED CLUB IN THE STATE IN GOOD STANDING WITH INTERNATIONAL, AND STATE AND DISTRICT, DUES PAID TO DATE ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT THEY ARE ENTITLED TO ONE (1) VOTING DELEGATE AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE FOR EACH TEN (10) MEMBERS OF SAID CLUB, OR MAJOR FRACTION THEREOF, AS SHOWN BY THE RECORDS OF LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL ON THE FIRST DAY OF THE MONTH LAST PRECEDING THAT MONTH DURING WHICH THE CONVENTION IS HELD. THE MAJOR FRACTION REFERRED TO SHALL BE FIVE (5) OR MORE MEMBERS. ONLY REGISTERED DELEGATES WITH CERTIFIED CREDENTIALS, PRESENT IN PERSON AT ANY MEETING OF THE CONVENTION, SHALL BE ENTITLED TO VOTE. ELIGIBLE DELEGATES ARE MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND A DAY IN THE CLUB AS SHOWN BY THE RECORDS OF THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE AS COUNTED FOR PURPOSES OF CALCULATING DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT. EACH SUCH DELEGATE MY CAST ONLY ONE (1) VOTE ON EACH QUESTION.

THE PHRASE "MEMBERS" WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND A DAY IN THE CLUB" IS INTERPRETED TO MEAN THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. A TRANSFEREE SHALL BE COUNTED AS A MEMBER FOR THE PURPOSE OF CALCULATING THE DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT OF THE CLUB IF THE TRANSFEREE HAS BEEN A MEMBER OR RECEIVED TRANSFER FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.
- 2. A REINSTATED MEMBER SHALL BE COUNTED AS A MEMBER FOR THE PURPOSE OF CALCULATING THE CLUB'S DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT PROVIDED THAT THE REINSTATED MEMBER HAS BEEN A MEMBER FOR AN AGGREGATE PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.
- 3. A NEWLY CHARTERED CLUB WILL BE ENTITLED TO ONE (1) DELEGATE AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE DELEGATE UNTIL IT HAS BEEN CHARTERED FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY. THEREAFTER, ITS DELEGATE QUOTA WILL BE BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ENROLLED, IN THE CLUB, FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY.
- 4. CLUBS BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO WILL HAVE THEIR DELEGATE QUOTA BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ENROLLED IN THE CLUB FOR ONE (1) YEAR AND ONE (1) DAY AT THE TIMEOF BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO. HOWEVER, A CLUB BEING RELEASED FROM STATUS QUO WILL BE ENTITLED TO A MINIMUM OF ONE (1) DELEGATE AND ONE (1) ALTERNATE DELEGATE.



KEEP ON RECYCLING THOSE EYEGLASSES! There are people all over the world who need corrective lenses. Let's keep our eyeglass chairman busy for years to come. So bring those used eyeglasses to the P&S meetings and keep your club out of HOT WATER

Consumers who have to replace their gas water heaters will get a surprise at the checkout counter - a price increase of about one-third due to a new safety feature designed to save lives and property.

The change is a combustion chamber that encloses the burner and pilot light on a 30, 40 and 50 gallon residential gas water heaters. This chamber is intended to prevent fires and explosions that might occur should flammable vapors be released in a room — when for instance, someone fills a lawnmower gas tank, thins paint or cleans something with gasoline.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission estimates that about 800 residential fires are caused by gas water heater incidents related to flammable vapors each year, resulting in about five deaths and 130 injuries.

The manufacturers of gas water heaters, many of which had been faced with product liability lawsuits, formed a voluntary consortium to address the issue, realizing it was better to take action than to wait for federally mandated regulations. They worked with CPSC to develop the technology now being incorporated

into the designs of all major U.S. gas water heater manufacturers.

The safety device, which will vary slightly on each manufacturer's model, will shield the burner and prevent flames from spreading outside the heater should a dangerous spill occur nearby.

The improvement comes at a cost to consumers. A 40-gallon tank that used to carry a price tag of \$150 now cost \$200 to \$220, according to retailers.

The new standard was approved by the American National Standards Institute, Although gas water heaters without the safety device that are already in the sales pipeline can still be sold, all models manufactured after July 1, 2003 will incorporate the change.

According to industry statistics, 40 to 50 million American homes currently have gas water heaters that do not incorporate the new technology and that manufacturers say are safe. But consumers should not store gasoline, paint thinners or other flammable liquids near them.
