

# District Governor C.W. "Buzz" Goins

the Region and Zone Chairmen. It's amazing what these positions can accomplish when chaired by the proper people. Again, THANKS!

We must keep turning over rocks by doing things that attract the members we want. Are we back to community involvement yet? More "face time" in the community. 



THE MAJOR FRACTION REFERRED TO SHALL BE FIVE (5) OR MORE MEMBERS. ONLY REGISTERED DELEGATES WITH CERTIFIED CREDENTIALS, PRESENT IN PERSON AT ANY MEETING OF THE CONVENTION, SHALL BE ENTITLED TO VOTE. ELIGIBLE DELEGATES ARE MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN ENROLLED FOR AT LEAST ONE (1) YEAR AND A DAY IN THE CLUB AS SHOWNBY THE RECORDS OF THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE AS COUNTED FOR PURPOSES OF CALCULATING DELEGATE ENTITLEMENT. 



## SOMETIMES THINGS JUST FALL SHORT OF EXPECTATIONS



On December 20, 2005 the U.S. Environment Protection Agency announced a disappointing proposal that falls far short of what is necessary to protect public health.

The Clean Air Act requires EPA to determine how much air pollution is safe to have in the outdoor air. EPA determines these limits, called the national standards, for each major air pollutant by setting levels that protect public health.

Polluters want weak standards so they don't have to clean up.

EPA has proposed revisions to the standard for a pollutant known as particulate matter, sometimes called soot or particle pollution. These tiny particles are so small that they penetrate into the tiny airways of the lungs. They can shorten life by months to years, trigger asthma attacks, and increase respiratory symptoms, doctor visits, emergency room visits, and hospital admissions.

People most sensitive to particle pollution are children, the elderly, people with asthma and other lung diseases, heart diseases and diabetes. The standards must be set at levels that will protect these most vulnerable populations.

EPA has proposed revisions that are weaker than EPA's own science advisors recommended and not tough enough to protect public health. EPA also recommended a new standard for larger, or coarse particles that protects only against some types of particles. It would allow unlimited exposure to other types of potentially deadly particles (such as from toxics such as pesticides and metals).

If EPA's proposals are adopted, tens of thousands of people who could have been protected will die prematurely. Polluters are blaming these deaths on anything but their pollution, even denying the evidence of thousands of studies because they don't want to have to clean up.
