

Thought's from the Second Vice District Governor:

Let's all spend a few moments of prayer for the victims of Christchurch New Zealand and especially Sendei Miyagi. The disaster in Japan is unbelievable. The earthquake was bad in itself, but the tsunami was worse. Hundreds of people were swept away. In one coastal city, 9500 people are missing. The tsunami created problems at the nuclear power stations by damaging the standby generators that would allow cooling the power rods. Then the possibility of nuclear melt down has occurred. If this wasn't enough, a volcano erupted. The Lions are to be congratulated for sending help to both countries. The Lions on the ground in Japan are providing water and food for the victims. Lions Clubs International Foundation is providing over U.S. \$1.25 million, or 100 million Japanese Yen, for immediate relief from the devastation of earthquake and tsunami in Japan. This includes major catastrophe and emergency grant funds as well as designated donations from Lions around the world. The Foundation has established a designated fund to directly support this disaster. LCIF is also monitoring the impact to other Pacific Ocean nations. Lions in Japan are coordinating their relief efforts via social media and are using the Japan Lions Office in Tokyo as emergency relief headquarters. Donate online at www.lcif.org/donate. Select Disaster and include "Japan Earthquake/Tsunami" in the comments section.

This is one of the biggest reasons I became a Lion. When I was about 25 years old, I traveled to Guayaquil Ecuador. We flew into Guayaquil on a modern jet airplane and walked through a modern glass and steel airport and got into a taxi to be taken across town to the hotel. We traveled through a poor section of town where the streets were crowded with people. The taxi literally pushed people away in order to continue. In order to avoid looking at a possible accident, I turned away and looked out the side window. I observed a small naked child in the gutter of the street fighting with a large sewer rat for a scrap of food. You can imagine how a young father would be affected by such a scene. I was devastated by a feeling of hopelessness. The depression was overwhelming. There was absolutely nothing that I could do to alleviate the situation. The problem was too big for an individual to accomplish anything. Later while in New Delhi India, I saw people stacking bodies on push carts early in the morning. I was told that poor people sleep in the doorways of shops and die in the night, so this activity was common. In parts of Mumbai, hundreds of children will surround the taxi begging for money when they see a foreigner. This is truly unbearable.

Later that same year, while driving across Venezuela, I crested a hill and saw a beautiful small school building that just sparkled in the sun. As I passed it, there was a sign out front that said the school was built by the local Lions Club. I remembered that my father-in-law was in the Lions Club and decided that once I stopped traveling around so much that I should consider joining the Lions.

After I joined the Lions, I learned that it is a world wide organization that wasn't afraid to tackle big world problems such as river blindness.

So now YOU know why I became a Lion.

One more thing, we will elect a new P & S President and P & S Secretary at the June meeting.



Project is to replace the current wood deck of the walkway with composite boards. This will require that all of the old decking be removed, hauled to the disposal area, and additional support boards be installed before the decking is attached. A skidloader on tracks will be available to move the old lumber to the trailer for transport and to relocate the new materials from the storage pile. There are four areas of the boardwalk that can be worked on simultaneously. New boards will need to be cut to the correct length and installed with screws. Power for the tools will be provided by generators.

The plan is to start Friday morning April 1, at sunrise, 7:27 am, and hope to finish by Saturday evening. This will require about 40-50 Lions with minimum skills to get the walkway finished as expected. Lions can save the camp about \$50,000 by doing this project.

1VDG Rick Reynolds will provide 4 of his carpenters, a dump trailer and miscellaneous equipment for cutting and installing the boards.

1VDG Anse Windham will provide meals for both lunches and maintain a coffee pot for the morning.

LIONS DISTRICT 2-S2 CONSTITION AND BY-LAWS 2010-2011 PROPOSED AMENDMENT #1

To bring District 2-S2 Constitution more in line with the Lions Clubs International Constitution and By-laws, Lions Clubs International Election Guidelines and Robert Rules of Order we recommend the following changes.

Remove the areas with strikethroughs and renumber and re-letter Section 3

ARTICLE VII - DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

Section 3 District Governor

(b) Election

The election of a District Governor must conform to the Lions International Constitution and By-Laws. The following procedures and rules shall apply in lieu of more definitive provision in said International Constitution and By-Laws

- (1) There shall be no "write in" votes cast for the office of District Governor except as hereinafter provided.
- (2) Nominations for the office of District Governor shall not be made from the floor of the District Convention, except as hereinafter provided.
- (3) In the event there is only one (1) candidate, the ballot shall provide for a "yes" and a "no" vote. A majority of "yes" votes shall be required to elect.
- (4) In the event the majority of votes are "no" then and only then, can nominations be made from the floor of a duly notified Convention Assembly. Procedures as heretofore and hereinafter provided in all respects shall apply except that the nominees name need not appear on a printed ballot.
- (5) In the event the District Convention convenes with no pre-endorsed (pre-nominated) candidate, then nominations from the floor of a duly notified Convention Assembly shall be the order of the day. Each nominee for District Governor must satisfy all the requirements as stated in Lions International Constitution and By-Laws.
- (6) In the event there are three (3) or more qualified candidates, a plurality shall elect.
- (7) In the event of any tie votes, immediately after tie tabulation, a second (2nd) vote shall be taken, and if still ends in tie, the decision shall be determined by lot.

Add the following from the Standard Form District Constitution as recommended by Lions Clubs International.

(C) BALLOT. The election shall be by secret written ballot, with the candidate or candidates required to secure a majority of the votes cast by the delegates present and voting in order to be declared elected; for purpose of such election, a majority is defined as a number more than one-half of the total valid votes cast excluding blanks and abstentions. If, on the first ballot, and subsequent ballots, no candidate receives a majority, the candidate or tied candidates receiving the lowest number of votes shall be eliminated and balloting shall continue until one candidate receives a majority. In case of a tie on any ballot, balloting shall continue on the tied candidates until one is elected.

LIONS DISTRICT 2-S2 CONSTITION AND BY-LAWS 2010-2011 PROPOSED AMENDMENT #2

It is recommended that the number of cabinet members needed to constitute a quorum be changed. This change would ensure that business of the district can be conducted if there is a low turn out at cabinet meetings.

Article VIII, Section 2.

Authority: The Cabinet shall function within the limits of the International Constitution and By-Laws and this document. The Cabinet shall be the Executive Body of the District, and as such, all corporate powers of the District expressed or implied, are vested in the Cabinet. A majority of the Cabinet members shall constitute a quorum.

The attendance of a majority of the officers of this district, as listed in Article V, shall constitute a quorum for any cabinet meeting.

When determining the number of cabinet members required to constitute a 2/3 (two-thirds) majority or a quorum, absent Past District Governors who are not Committee Chairmen or Co-chairmen shall not be included.

LIONS DISTRICT 2-S2 CONSTITION AND BY-LAWS 2010-2011 PROPOSED AMENDMENT #3

Add Immediate Past District Governor to the list of District Officers, to be more in line with the Standard Form District Constitution from Lions Clubs International.

ARTICLE V - DISTRICT OFFICERS

The officers of the District shall be the

- Immediate Past District Governor

and there shall be no salary paid to any officer.
