**Lions Service Project: Community and Environment Programs**

I just returned from Calgary Canada where I participated in the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute. The Institute is a two-and-a-half day intensive training in various aspects of Leadership that can help prepare Lions for leadership roles within their districts. There were about 80 Second Vice District Governors attending along with another 65 other Lions currently serving as Zone or Region Chairs, Cabinet Secretaries and others desiring to serve at their District level. I made a lot of friends, who like me are excited about learning to better serve the Lions in our Districts.

One of the training objectives provided participants an opportunity to plan and execute a service project during the time we were in Calgary. Well, we completed our service project "on paper", at least. In advance of the Institute, our team leader – another 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG from Tennessee – coordinated the inputs from each of the five members of our team. We communicated by email and conference calls to coordinate the decision making and preliminary work details. All in all, it was a confidence-building program designed to familiarize each of us with the tools necessary to plan and execute a meaningful community service project. In our team's case, we remodeled and reworked an existing building into a new community center to serve and meet various unmet community needs.

I share this experience because we have all been called to action by our International President Lion Joe Preston to focus our service in four key areas this year. In the late summer, we provided service to our communities' children preparing to return to school. In the fall, we stepped up our efforts to at serving those with vision challenges. In the winter, we served our communities by feeding the hungry during the holiday seasons. Now, with the awakening of Spring, we are called to action once again to serve our communities through community and environment programs.

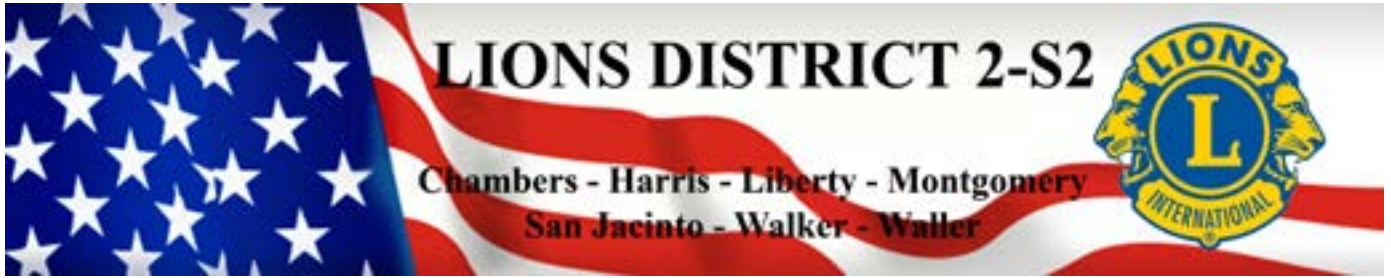
LCI coined the term "Lions Crew at Work" to describe Lions teams providing service right at the community level. These projects can be like the project my work team planned in Calgary – remodeling a non-profit community center – or as simple as painting a shelter for the homeless or repairing a public park or playground. "Lions Green Team" projects are those that protect our planet by cleaning up the environment, planting trees, recycling and educating others on environmental issues.

## Texas Lions Began Serving Eastern Europe Last Year

When the Conroe Noon Lions Club's Glasses Recycling Center made its first shipment to Romania after a series of unlikely events. Back in the summer of 2013, a young lady from east Texas, Mary Timaeus, resigned her job at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and embarked on a multi-country service trip that took her into Asia, Africa, and Eastern Europe. Her father joined her and worked with her in Romania for a week in March of 2014. About two weeks after his return to Texas, Mary's father received a request for 2,000 pairs of prescription glasses from one of the pastors in a small town west of the Romanian capital of Bucharest. The pastor wanted the glasses to distribute in several villages in Olt County, Romania.

Mary's father volunteers as a ride marshal on the annual MS 150 Bicycle Ride from Houston to Austin and, as a preliminary event, he commonly rides the Humble Lions Club fundraiser bicycle ride. In February of 2014, he had met PDG Bill Hughes at the Humble Lions bicycle ride. Mary's father called Mr. Hughes, who connected him to members of the Conroe Noon Lions Club. Within a couple of hours, Mary's father had a clear path and specific criteria for the tasks associated with sending glasses to Romania and distributing them there.

Over the next three weeks, he identified transportation systems, a volunteer network, and tested the distribution venues and transportation system by distributing reading glasses in Draganesti-Olt, Romania. Local optometrists (Texans) were enlisted as consultants to verify the feasibility and propriety of the plan to distribute prescription glasses in Romania, and connections were established with the Phoenix Lions Club in Bucharest. The Phoenix Lions agreed to provide valuable assistance, the most important of which was all of the technical help and expertise required for vision testing.

Over a period of several months, from mid-2014 through Christmas, Conroe Noon Lions Club provided glasses and the glasses were shipped into Olt County. The Bucharest Lions, using a system of interrelated churches as distribution points, distributed glasses in Draganesti-Olt, Slatina, and other villages in southwest Romania. The Romanian Lions expanded their service to include blood pressure checks, blood sugar testing, electrocardiograms and other general physical exams and testing. Toward the end of the year, the Phoenix Bucharest Lions Club went back into Olt County, on its own, and distributed Christmas toys to poor families and made a contribution to one of the rural schools.

The relationships continue. A second shipment of glasses started its journey to Romania in February 2015 and these glasses will be distributed in Bucharest. All of the participants and recipients in this system are grateful to the Texas Lions and Lions Clubs for their bold spirit and generosity. The president of the Bucharest Phoenix Lions Club, Stefania Dinca, expressed this message best when she wrote, in an email, "[You] made us say not only 'We serve' (this is Lions mission and logo) but 'We Serve Together!'"

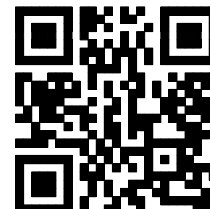

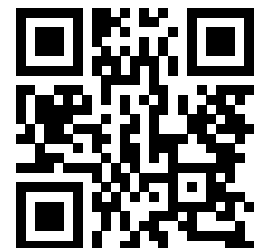
