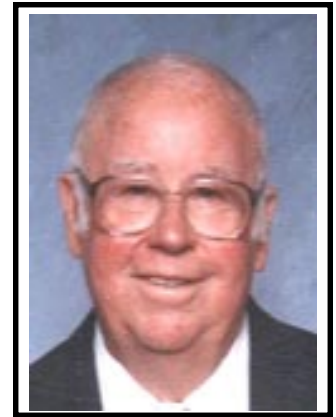

Lion Ladoris Cates led the group in singing "Smiles".

Lion President Chuck Martin announced that the program at the May meeting would feature The Lions World Services For The Blind.

We will hold the election of new officers of the P&S Council at our June meeting.

THE BENEFITS OF TREE



Trees have been an object of desire for centuries. Life on our planet as we know it depends on our trees to clean our air and cool us from the strong rays of the sun. Trees convert carbon dioxide into clean breathable oxygen everyday and are natural air purifiers. Shade trees also help cool your house on those hot summer days, reducing air conditioning costs. A row of evergreen trees can also serve as an attractive screen to block the cold, harsh wind in the winter months. In addition to conserving energy costs and cleaning up the air, trees simply add a natural beauty to the landscape and substantial value to your home and property.

Protection from the Sun The shading that trees provide can reduce temperatures inside your home by as much as 8 to 10 degrees. By planting deciduous trees (those that shed their leaves in the Winter) the same tree will allow the winter sun to warm up your house during the cooler months, Planting trees on southern and western exposures will accomplish both of these goals.

Protection From The Wind Windbreaks created by evergreen trees on the north and northwest side of your home can minimize the amount of cold air that blows into your home on a cold winter day, Energy bill savings of as much as 23% have been recorded in comparing a completely exposed home with one that was landscaped with a living windbreak. The extent of the protection from the wind occurs in a range of 5 to 7 times the height of the tree. If your tree windbreak will grow to 20 feet tall, plant it between 100 and 140 feet from the house to maximize its screening effect.

Cleaning Up The Air Experts agree that trees are the best tool to tackle the job of cleaning up the immense build-up of carbon dioxide released into the atmosphere each year. During the photosynthesis process, trees absorb carbon dioxide, sunlight, water and soil nutrients in order to make food for growth and maintenance. The primary by-product of this process is the release of enormous amounts of oxygen. The benefits of trees in the urban landscape become very clear when you realize that trees are virtually giant air purifiers, generally, faster growing, native and evergreen trees will remove more carbon dioxide from the atmosphere than their slower growing, non-native, deciduous counterparts. These fast growing trees can remove 25 to 45 pounds of carbon from the air in a year. (Think of this amount as equal to a typical bag of topsoil. Yet this is pure carbon like the soot that comes from your fireplace.) Since each of these trees remove this amount of this pollutant each year, it is easy to understand the importance of planting trees in our urban landscapes.
