SPREAD OF DISEASE



A wide-ranging survey of world ecosystems shows that warmer temperatures have sparked a host of epidemics in plants and animals, suggesting global warming could ravage the planet's ecology and accelerate disease in a number of species - including our own.

The study cites a litany of species - oysters, oaks, monarch butterflies and colorful Hawaiian forest birds called honeycreepers - that have succumbed in recent years to new or more virulent disease outbreaks resulting from even small increases in temperature.

Although many deaths were related to short-term temperature spikes from phenomena such as El Nino, scientists said the findings bolster theories that long-term global warming could usher in similar devastation - and on a much broader scale.

Almost everywhere - on land and on sea, in tropical climes and temperate ones - there are examples of plants and animals falling prey to disease as temperatures rise.

The link between global warming and disease has been controversial since it was first proposed in 1991. Many critics argue that such concerns are overblown since a connection has yet to be firmly established. The problem has proved to be maddeningly difficult to analyze because of the multitude of factors, such as pollution and habitat destruction that play major roles in the spread of disease.

THE SUN ISN'T IDEAL FOR LIFE

Is it possible that, when stars were given out, we got the wrong model? The Sun's energy includes quite a bit of ultraviolet radiation, the kind that causes sunburns and skin cancer. Over millions of years, Earth has built up an ozone layer in the atmosphere that protects us from some - but not all - of the UV. We still need sun-block to protect our skin from excessive radiation.

What if our Sun were a bit redder? We wouldn't have to worry so much about holes in the ozone layer, because red stars are older and cooler than yellow ones, so the Sun wouldn't be sending out enough UV to hurt us.

There are many such stars in our galaxy. The fact that we are here despite our Sun's not being perfect shows how delicate life is. If we wait a few billion years, the Sun will slowly expand and turn red all by itself - and we won't have to worry about sun-block. BUT by then the enlarged Sun will have engulfed the Earth.

This is unfortunate for those organizations because they do wonderful work for their communities and mankind.

The Lions Vest aids in advertising our clubs' good deeds. It lets folks know we are an "open society" of citizens filled with the desire to do great things for our communities and the world. I believe the public knows our motto better than we, because they know they can depend on Lions TO SERVE.
