



Hello, Lion Family:

By the time you read this, we will ready for our District Convention. I hope you have made arrangements to attend this important event. There are at least four reasons to attend. First, we are going to elect leaders for the 2005-2006 Lions Year. Second, there is important business for you do decide, that of State and District dues. Third, the Convention brings learning opportunities, both formal from our Leadership team, and also informal in meeting with representatives of our charities. Copperfield is almost finished, and Houston Northwest is well underway, thanks to Extension Chair PDG Cliff Burke and Lion Kay.

By now many of you know that I was called to Oak Brook, Illinois April 7-9, to attend a conference at Lions Headquarters. There I learned that I had been assigned to a team of 30 Lions from around the world who are tasked with implementing the goals of next year's President, Dr. Ashok Mehta. I was one of only two District Governors present; the rest were mostly Past International Directors. My task will involve being a resource to the Multiple Districts in Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico Arizona and Colorado.

Momentum of our Lions District is very much on my mind now that we are entering the final two months of our Lions Year. It's important that we have a strong finish to this year so that we can already be in motion when VDG Buzz comes back from Hong Kong as your next Governor.

Finally, thanks to all of you for your expressions of support and your prayers about Lion Judy's medical condition. Her surgery is scheduled for May 4th, and a this time we are not anticipating the need for either chemotherapy or radiation treatments.

One more month has flashed by much too fast. Much has happened, and much is left to do.

A few words need to be said about the District Convention on 29, 30 April and 1 May at the Sheraton North Hotel on JFK Boulevard in route to Bush Airport. We need to clear up a couple of facts that seem not be well known. First, the convention belongs to all the Lions of District 2-S2, not the cabinet, not the region and zone chairs, and most of all, not the District Governor or the Vice District Governor. The aforementioned are your elected and selected servants, if you will, for the year. We are the representatives of the membership - nothing more. The membership pays for the convention; not all of the expenses, but certainly enough in spirit, to retain ownership.

The question of who goes to the convention should be a moot one, leaving the obvious, "Anyone Lion who wants to go." Now to the cost, the convention is free – participation in the pageantry requires money. You, as Lions, can attend any of the training programs or visit the exhibits at no cost. It goes without say, that certified delegates can vote. If you are hungry, you may eat in the hotel restaurant or go elsewhere. If you choose to join us for breakfast, lunch, the banquets or the Friday night party, you will need a ticket. In **either case** you will need to register for the convention and get a badge (pass) that will identify you as a Lion or a guest of a Lion. The Agenda, Registration Form, etc. are available on the District Website or in this newsletter.

Speaking of training, we are offering New Club Officer, New Member Orientation, and LEO Club Officer Training in morning and afternoon sessions. Money is not a deciding factor in attending these programs. Therefore, each club has a duty to see that the new members and officers attend these programs as necessary. This duty is applicable to all clubs sponsoring LEO clubs.

<u>Important Note</u> As this was being written, I was contacted by the hotel for the list of rooms that we will require. Please register as soon as possible. The unused rooms must be released or we pay for them.

As advertised at the PS&C meeting, the room(s) raffle was a "flop" (mea culpa), and we have converted it to a \$5.00 per ticket 50-50 raffle. The winner gets half, and the convention gets half. All previously sold tickets will be refunded or converted on an equal dollar amount to the 50-50 raffle at \$5.00 per ticket. Now we can sell to the public as well as to ourselves. This could be a significant prize.

All Committee Chairpersons are reminded to bring their displays as per the MWLLC. Also, we want each club to bring their Banner.

Attend your convention and celebrate 87 years of Lionism in District 2-S2.


