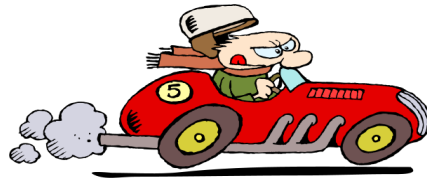
May Day
