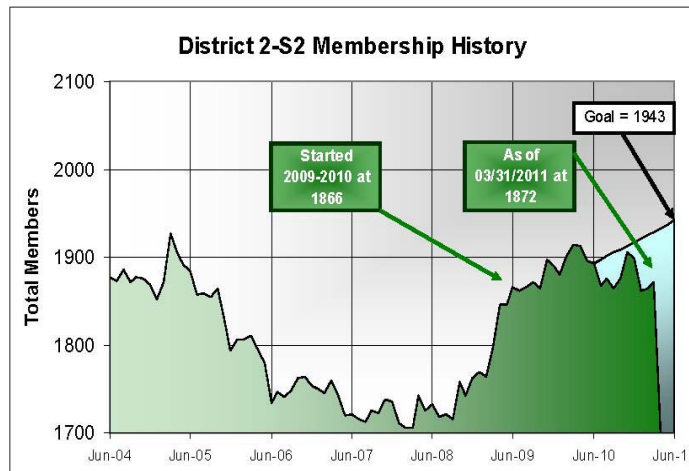

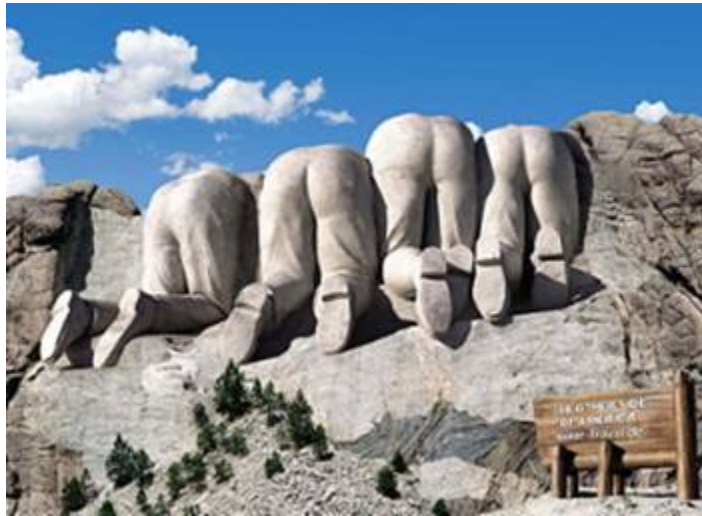

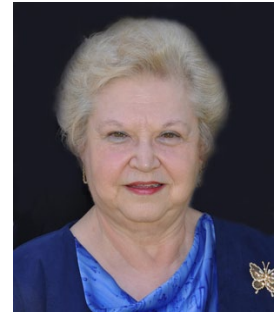

Service as Strong as a Lion

Cy-Fair Lions Club Gives Back with Kind Deeds and Community Support

Martin Luther King Jr. once said, "Everybody can be great, because anybody can serve." The men and women of the Cy-Fair Lions Club have become proof of the positive power of giving back, and many of their Cy-Fair neighbors would most certainly agree. The 35 members of this local club join with 1.35 million Lions Club members all over the world to make a difference in their communities and in the lives of those around them.

Theresa Casey is the president of the Cy-Fair Lions Club. She joined the organization 10 years ago following the example of her parents, who had been Lions Club members since she was a teenager. "Lions are a great group of people that want to make a difference in their community," she shares. "If someone is looking to make lifelong friends, the Lions Club is a great place to do that. We have lots of fun in our meetings and doing community projects."

A Tradition of Service

The Cy-Fair Lions Club was chartered on April 23, 1957 with 31 members. Some of the members live as far as Prairie View and Hempstead. The club focuses on serving Cy-Fair ISD, which incorporates a large portion of the northwest Houston area and includes some of Katy, Cypress, and Tomball. "I have grown up around the Lions and have worked alongside its charter members," says Casey. "A lot of them are in their 70s to 90s now. Nowadays, I have the pleasure of seeing new, younger members join our club looking to make a difference."

C. Don Robinson was a charter member of the club and has overseen the club as it has operated over the past 50 years. When asked how the club has changed, Robinson admits it hasn't. "We're still trying to serve the community as we were 50 years ago," he shares.

Giving Time to Give Back

When asked what makes the Lions Club distinct from other service organizations, Casey has a simple explanation: "The Lions Club is not a check-writing club," she says. "We don't ask our members to donate their money. We ask them to donate their time." Fellow member, Chuck Martin adds, "We give a lot of our time in service projects, but in order to serve the public, we also have to raise money from the public. The great thing is that all money that we take from the public gets donated back to the public. Nothing goes to the organization."

The various fundraising projects directed by the Lions benefit many people, including children in Cy-Fair ISD who need eye exams, glasses, and hearing aids. The club's funds also go towards making holiday food baskets to donate to those in need and sending handicapped and diabetic children to the Lions Camp in Kerrville. Along with these activities, funds are also donated to the LightHouse of Houston, Leader Dogs for the Blind, eyeglass assistance programs, the Texas Lions Foundation, humanitarian relief funds, the Lions Club International Foundation, the McGruff program, the Lions Quest and War on Drugs program, and the

organization's youth exchange program. A portion of the funds raised by the Lions International organization go toward preserving sight, cornea transplants, and job training for those who are visually impaired.

Casey adds, "We assess the needs in our local area and do service projects where needed. For example, we participate in Wreaths Across America and nursing home visits." Robinson recalls a recent service project where a Christmas basket was delivered to a family whose home had burned down. "The father kept saying how unbelievable it was and how grateful he was," says Robinson. "It just feels good when you are able to help people in need like that."

Doing small acts of service over a period of time can add up to big numbers. Casey says with pride, "During our 50 years of existence, we have contributed over \$100,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors in Cy-Fair ISD." A few other specific projects that the Lions Club has been involved with include purchasing and repairing eye glasses for Cy-Fair ISD students, manufacturing a wheelchair ramp for a Cy-Fair student so she could easily get from her house to the bus, purchasing an electric wheelchair for an individual in need, and helping to buy a ramp for a van so a child could have access to the family vehicle.

Good Deeds and Good Friends

As the Cy-Fair Lions work toward common goals, they are also building strong bonds of friendship. "When you spend as much time as we do doing service projects together, you get to feel like a family," says Martin. "We all seem to work together well, and we sort of keep track of each other. If someone isn't feeling well, another member will call to check on them or stop by and see how they are doing." Casey adds, "I couldn't ask for a better experience in life. I get to work with people who want to make a difference in their community, and in turn, it makes a difference in your life. You can have that warm, fuzzy feeling all year long!" CFM

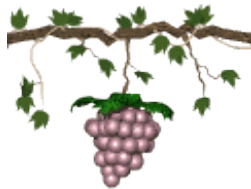
A New Wine For Seniors
