IMPORTANT NOTICE

FINANCIAL ISSUES

We are rapidly approaching the end of the 2011-2012 Lions Year and several clubs still owe their second half dues to the District and Lions Clubs intentional.

SECOND HALF DUES

I do not plan on embracing any club, but there age 3 Clubs that have not paid their Second Half Dues to the District. Two to of these clubs also owe the second half dues to Lions Clubs International. Then we have two clubs that have not paid their second half dues to Lions Clubs International, but have paid the district dues.

100% CHARITIES

As of April 24, 2012 – 18 of our 64 Clubs have not paid their 100% Charities or at least some of them.

Three of our Charities are currently requesting payment, because they are short of funding to continue their work, serving the community. If your club has not paid the 100% for 2011-2012 please consider paying the portion for the following charities as soon as possible.

- Texas Lions Camp \$10 per member. Camping session are starting soon and the funds are needed to purchase supplies and pay for counselors. Out District has been 100% to the camp for over 24 years, no other district in Texas has this record. Let's not let the children and DG Rick down by breaking this string.
- Lions Eye Bank of Texas \$5 per member They age currently running approximately \$10,000 short in their budget. Beside the 100% Contribution to the LEBT, if your club held a White Cane Day Collection please send the Eye Bank portion, which is generally one half of the collections on the White Cane Day. If your Club got supplies for the White Can Day, then your club is expected to send funds to the Eye Bank to help pay for the supplies.
- Texas Loons Foundation \$2 per member. They provide grants in time of natural disaster and Texas has had its share this year. Our District received one of the grants from TLF to help with the relief of those impacted by the wildfires last August and September.

Please consider making a contribution to these worthy charities, be sure to designate which charity you wish the funds to be forwarded to.

If your Club has already made their 100% Contribution, then consider an extra donation, it would be greatly appreciated.




