This summer he and Thomas will ride the TransAmerica Trail from Florence, Oregon to Yorktown, Virginia. They are doing this "to raise awareness and money for the Foundation Fighting Blindness, an organization that does research on preventing degenerative eye diseases such as retinitis pigmentosa which caused Thomas blindness and for the Covington County Visually Impaired People Lions CLub in Andalusia, Alabama of which Thomas is a member." 2nd example - 1925 - Helen Keller's challenge to the Lions "to become knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness." "Lions are known around the world for their service to the blind and visually impaired." {Read the full story on the LCI website/Helen Keller - Biography}. How many lives have been changed? How many pairs of used glasses have we as Lions collected? Now for the opportunity - see a play being performed at AD PLAYERS - GRACE THEATER LOCATED 2710 W. Alabama Street, HOUSTON. Title of the play is "The Miracle Worker" Depicting Anne Sullivan's struggle to reach Helen Keller, locked in her world without sight or hearing. The play runs from May 13 - June 21, 2015.
