#### Dear Fellow Lions,

During the past weeks, many Lions have emailed, telephoned or cornered the Cabinet Secretary and me, asking why they had not been informed of the occurrences that resulted in a Lion reading a resolution at the April PSC Meeting. It is in response to those queries that I write this article. Be assured that it is not nor has it ever been the intention of this District Governor nor any of his administration to withhold information or "hide" any situation from any Lion, in or outside of District 2-S2. If efforts to resolve a controversy with as little damage as possible have made the "grass roots" Lions of this District feel they were purposely left out of the informational loop, I, sincerely apologize to them. Indeed, those efforts seemed to have failed.

To answer the many questions, this incident happened on August 3, 2002 at an open meeting of the Board of Directors of the Texas Lions Camp during nominations for Camp Secretary. Before Lions and guests, when Past District Governor George Conner was recognized to speak in favor of Lion Barron Cagle as a candidate for League Secretary, he, instead, spoke against the other candidate, Past District Governor C. Lenny Holzband. The degree of severity of his remarks seems to differ in some recounting of the incident. Some Lions who were there believe what was said was "untrue", "hateful" and "vengeful".

#### This incident was reported as

"Lion Grindstaff called for those who would like to speak for Lion Barron Cagle. Past District Governor George Conner spoke on his behalf" (quoted from the minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting-General Session, signed by Lion Barron Cagle, Secretary)

The Executive Committee of the Texas Lions Camp adopted a course of action that included

"Past District Governor George Conner is encouraged to apologize and retract statements made that spoke against a Lions candidate, rather than for a candidate, at the Board of Directors meeting on August 3, 2002" (quoted from minutes of Special Called Executive Committee Meeting, September 13, 2002, signed by Lion Barron Cagle, Secretary)

Lion Leaders at the Texas Lions Camp have expressed that they were grieved by the events or agreed 100% that PDG Conner was out of order when he talked about PDG Lenny.

A brief account of events that followed is:

Lions International's does not hold that it has any authority to make any recommendation in a matter that must be handled at a club level or by the independent entity (The Camp) where incident occurred;

The Houston Sports Lions Club leadership feels unwarranted and unfair pressure has been placed on their club to handle a matter that that they feel should be handled at a higher level;

Actions of the Executive Board of the Texas Lions Camp fall short of causing an apology to PDG Lenny or a retraction as recommended;

PDG George Conner did apologize to the Directors of the Texas Lions Camp if his actions offended the Directors;

PDG Conner feels that personal attacks have been made against him;

As a result of no apology to PDG Lenny, no retraction as recommended and being left to feel wronged and unwelcome in Lionism, the Houston Couples Club, along with forty (40) members will be withdrawing from Lions Clubs International.

The Bellaire Lions Club felt moved to read the resolution passed by their club which prompted all the inquires Lion Judy and I have received.

It is regretful that so many negative feelings have grown, festered and erupted in our District. It is sorrowful that the actions of one Lion against one occurred and has cost our District, the Texas Lions Camp and Lionism so much support. It causes me, and should cause every Lion, great dismay that this situation has caused the loss of an active, supportive Lions Club and its 40 members.

To those Lions who are upset they did not know of this occurrence and it repercussions,

I say "you have my sincere apology". To those who have caused and allowed Lionism and our District to be harmed by personal animosity and politics, I say "shame on you". To those who have supported this District, Lionism and me this year, I say simply, "THANK YOU".

As far as I know, the letter writing stopped, but the attacks seem to have continued behind the scenes. As an example, the President of the Bellaire Lions Club read a resolution at a PSC meeting attacking me. No one from Bellaire Lions Club can have first hand knowledge of the events, because no one from that club was present at the meeting in August.

You may be assured there is another side to the story. As much as I would like to defend myself from charges leveled against me, in my opinion it would not be in the best interest of Lionism or this district to do so.

I will make two points. First, I told the truth. Second, I have never said anything derogatory about the Houston Couples Lions Club. This club was organized during my year as District Governor by my late and dear friend, M. H. "Koko" Clark. The club has done many great things and provided generous financial support for the Texas Lions Camp, beginning with a 100% contribution to the camp at the club's charter night. They raised their annual contribution to 1,000% and kept it there until this year. Their list of donations is long and impressive, including scholarships for counselors and two beautiful picnic shelters. It is most regrettable that they choose to leave the organization. The Houston Couples Lions Club will be missed.

A new Lions' year will be starting soon. Let's put our differences behind us and move on to a successful year of Lions' service.

# WHY IS CARPET AN INDOOR AIR QUALITY PROBLEM?

Carpet can act as a "sink" for chemical and biological pollutants, including pesticides, dust mites, and fungi.

Like many other household products and furnishings, new carpet can be a source of chemical emissions. Carpet emits volatile organic compounds, as do products that accompany carpet installation such as adhesives and padding.

Some people report symptoms such as eye, nose and throat irritation; headaches; skin irritations; shortness of breath or cough; and fatigue, which they may associate with new carpet installation.

#### WHAT ARE THE SOLUTIONS?

Individuals purchasing new carpet should ask retailers for information to help them select lower emitting carpet, cushion, and adhesives. Before new carpet is installed, they should ask the

retailer to unroll and air out the carpet in a clean, wellventilated area. They should consider leaving the premises during and immediately after carpet installation or schedule the installation when the space is unoccupied.

Opening doors and windows and increasing the amount of fresh air indoors will reduce exposure to most chemicals released from newly installed carpet.

During and after installation in a home, use of window fans and room air conditioners to exhaust fumes to the outdoors is recommended. Ventilation systems should be in proper working order, and should be operated during installation, and for 48 to 72 hours after the new carpet is installed.

Individuals should request that the installer follow the Carpet and Rug Institute's installation guidelines. If new carpet has an objectionable odor, they should contact their carpet retailer.

Finally, carpet owners should follow the manufacturer's instructions for proper carpet maintenance.

Contrarily, the hush-hush tone of their existence sows negative inquests that sprout pessimistic ideas that are harvested by those with little or no information about the organization. This is unfortunate for those organizations because they do wonderful work for their communities and mankind.
