

I don't think I've ever been a part of a greater team. Thank you for letting me be a part of your year. A point to ponder: Is destiny planned or does it just happen?

Yet another month has passed with alarming speed, and I do not know if this is a perceived product of my advancing age of if someone is messing with the time – space continuum. A friend suggested more naps in the afternoon – not that naps will cure the problem, but for a while, at least, you will not be aware of things going by so fast. Truly, ignorance is bliss!

The 87th District Convention is over, and a good time was had by all. More than 140 Lions and guests registered and most attended. The "events" were well received and very favorable commentary was given for each. The food and service received the most praise followed closely be the keynote speaker PID Dennis Tichenor and his wife Lion Judi. PID Dennis is a gifted speaker and motivator. One can only hope that there is a path to the top for him. The election held little, if any, suspense. One highlight was Governor Fred announcing that he was the winner in the IPDG race.

As Convention Chairman, I wish to thank all the committee members and volunteers for a job well done. The next chairman would do well to keep this year's committee roster in hand.

For me, Hong Kong will be the "Omega and Alpha" of this and the next Lion year: to Hong Kong as DG-E and back home as DG. The big push now is to select a cabinet. Outside of secretary and treasurer, the most critical positions are Region and Zone chairpersons and the Coordinator. Some openings for the Zone Chairs are available. Every DG has a theme for his year, and so it is with me; which simply stated is "Power to the Clubs".

In MD2, District 2-S2 is one of the chains, and our clubs are the links. By definition, a chain is no stronger than its weakest link. Clubs that do not make timely submissions of MMRs, Activities Reports, dues, etc. are not contributing much strength to the chain. Attendance at the PS&C and Zone meetings is, at best, sporadic for some clubs. Cabinet meetings are problematic, more often than not; the secretary conducts a tentative roll call hoping to announce that a quorum does exist, much to relief of all present. It is realized that "things happen" that will prevent attendance at specified functions. What organization, at any level, does not have a least one VP, Director or someone who can represent the club or committee?

I firmly believe that no club intends to be in this position. This year we will determine the problem and perform the required remediation. **Repeated** calling to clubs about various violations of protocol and procedure is indicative of bad communications- surely not ineptness? Our accountability system needs to be fully activated. The President is responsible for the club, and the Zone Chairperson is responsible for 4-6 clubs, and the Region Chairperson is responsible for 6-7 zones, and the District Governor is responsible for all of them. One hopes for the day when **all clubs** are represented at the PS&C and Zone meetings and Cabinet meetings include a full contingent of Cabinet Officers, and a quorum is never in suspense. Let's give it a try.



Subject: Election Results

This memo will serve as the Official Notification that at the 87th Annual Convention of Lions District 2-S2, held at the Sheraton North Hotel in Houston, Texas, the following Lions were duly elected to their respective positions and that the Constitutional Amendments to the Lions District 2-S2 Constitution did pass by a greater margin than 2/3rds as required by our Constitution and By-laws.

Ninty-one (91) Delegates representing clubs in the District were certified to vote and 88 delegates cast their votes.

I understand one certified delegate's father died, so he left before voting. Why the other two certified delegates did not vote, I do not know. The Voting room was open from 4:00 PM until 5:00 PM on Saturday, April 30, 2005 in accordance with the schedule printed in the Official Convention Program Booklet.

The following were elected by a nearly unanimous vote of the delegates certified to vote and voting.

"Buzz" Goins - District Governor 2005-2006 Margaret Badeaux - Vice District Governor 2005-2006 Larry Snider - Trustee - Lions Eye Bank of Texas 2005-2006 Pat Mann - Trustee - Lions Eye Bank of Texas 2005-2007 Noah Speer - Director - Texas Lions League for Children 2005-2007 Terry Harris - Director - Lighthouse of Houston 2005-2007 Ken Smith - Director - Humanitarian Relief Fund 2005-2008



AFTER ONE MONTH



Rising energy costs play an increasing role in the types of features included or provided as upgrades in new-home designs in the area.

Many builders have responded to the growing demand for structures and appliances built to or even exceeding the latest standards in energy efficiency.

The standard most buyers are familiar with is the Energy Star program, developed by the U.S. Dept. of Energy and Environmental Protection Agency. Energy Star establishes a performance target of 30 percent less energy use for air heating and cooling, and water heating than a reference home based on the 1993 Model Energy Code. Implementation of Energy Star standards has allowed Americans to save more than \$7 billion in 2003 and reduced greenhouse gas emissions the equivalent of taking 14 million cars off the road.

Another more stringent program is Environments for Living, which includes such requirements as a virtually air tight building envelope with fresh-air ventilation; pressure balancing to cool and heat the home evenly; carbon monoxide detectors; an improved insulation system; and properly sized and installed mechanical systems.

Both Energy Star and Environments for Living require participating builders to conduct a blower-door test and a duct-blasting test on one of every six homes to ensure that heating and cooling systems are completely sealed, with no leaks.

Environments for Living established a standard for home design based on building science principles. Building science is the study of the interaction of people, buildings and environment—the technology of construction.

Building science engineers focus on the design of a home's thermal envelope, its heating and cooling system, and the configuration of its interior - interrelated systems that must work in harmony to create a living environment.

The Houston-area Environments for Living guidelines also include precautions to help eliminate the potential for mold growth, such as vapor barriers and drainage planes for moisture management.

Nowhere is building science more important than in warm and humid climates such as Houston's, where cooling costs can account for one third or more of a homeowner's annual energy bill.

Leaky air conditioning ducts are one of a home's biggest energy wasters; estimates indicate that the average residential duct system leaks as much as 30 percent. The phrase 'throwing money out the window' seems to be on target regarding energy costs. High performance windows can be energy efficient as well as beautiful.
