





LIGHTNING STRIKES

Part II

Texas is second to Florida in lightning strike deaths. Last year the insurance companies were hit with an unusual amount of claim damages due to lightning strikes. The end results of a lightning strike can include damaged equipment and wiring fires and injuries or deaths.

Most lightning strikes occur in the following sequence. The tallest object, usually a tree, is struck by lightning, which follows the tree trunk to earth.

The lightning travels to and then enters along the perimeter of the building closest to the tree.

It then seeks an electrical wiring system and travels to an electrical breaker panel causing havoc along the way by being routed to anything plugged into an electrical receptacle or controlled by a switch.

If there is a proper surge suppressor mounted at each electrical breaker panel, the lightning voltage is clamped from traveling back through the system and causing more damage through other circuits in the building.

Proper individual multioutlet surge suppressor strips with low-clamping voltages are recommended in each area where an entertainment center, TV, computer, or other appliances will be plugged into.

Another consideration is the building's grounding system. Remember, when lightning strikes, you want it to bleed off as soon as possible so it does the least amount of damage.

There should be two means of grounding at the main electrical service. A properly sized (according to the service amperage) grounding electrode conductor should be routed to two inch by 10 ft. copper ground rods no closer than 6 feet apart.

Incoming telephone and cable TV service also should be grounded at the same point of connection as the electrical service.


