The June PSC meeting was held on June 5, 2002 at Furr's Cafeteria 10950 North Freeway, Houston, Texas. The meeting was called to order by Lion President Chuck Martin at 7:00 P.M.

Lion President Chuck Martin announced that before you can come into the room you must pay Your meal ticket and have the cashier stamp your ticket paid or the Tail Twister will find you. He reminded us that you must give your receipt to the cashier upon leaving the cafeteria.

Lion Art Drouin (Conroe Noon Lions Club) gave the Invocation.

Lion Hank Lauchley (Houston Downtown Lions Club) led the group in the Pledge to the Flag.

Lion Ladoris Cates (Conroe Noon Lions Club) led the group in singing "America".

Lion President Chuck Martin appointed Lion Eddie Risha to be the Tail Twister for this meeting. He warned us to be good because the Tail Twister would fine us. Lion Tamer Lion Eddie Risha announced that he has to fine Lion Bob Otto five dollars for early Campaigning for the office of president of the P&S Council, since Lion Bob had passed out his fliers Before our meeting started.

Ms. Franzetti told us that Taping For The Blind is celebrating its 35th anniversary this year. She said that her organization has over 200 volunteers that work with the staff of four employees. Taping For the Blind provides three main services for the blind as follows. Radio reading services that broadcast the readings of The Houston Chronicle, different books, and magazines, 24 hours a day, 7days a week. They loan low frequency radios to their clients to receive these readings. The radios cost them around \$100.00 each. Custom recording is a service where anybody in Texas can send in any printed material, which will be read and recorded on tape for them free of charge. They will not duplicate recordings if it is currently available from other organizations. The third service is audio descriptions of shows, such as Theater Under the Stars, The Alley Theater, and Parades. We have done Rodeo Parade, and performances. We describe the visual elements of what is going on stage. Ms.Franzetti may be reached at 713-622-2767.

Ms. Franzetti relayed a message from Dr. Ed Bradley requesting help from Lions. The American Council Of the Blind will be holding their Convention here in Houston from June 28-July 6. They need Lions to help pass out headsets to the Delegates that will attend the various events during their visit to our great

PSC Minutes—June 5, 2002



**RULES FOR DISTRICT 2-S2
PRESIDENTS AND SECRETARIES COUNCIL
2002-2003**

1. Protocol will be stated by the Council Chair at the beginning of each meeting and need not be repeated during the meeting.
2. To respect the environment and avoid potential health risk, there is NO SMOKING inside the meeting room.
3. The Presidents and Secretaries of each Lions Club in District 2S2 are voting members of the council and are expected to attend each meeting.
4. Solicitation of funds during council is discouraged. On rare occasions, solicitation may be allowed when approved by the President and Secretary of the Council. Fiscal needs should be anticipated and submitted in writing to the District Newsletter.
5. District and Club announcements, reports, awards, and speeches are limited to two (2) minutes. Any speaker exceeding the time limit is subject to a fine of \$1.00 for each quarter minute or fraction thereof.
6. Persons having more than one reason to address the Council should consolidate all announcements, reports, awards, and speeches into one appearance on the floor. Greater use of the District Newsletter for these purposes should be made.
7. Council members and guests remain respectfully silent while others are addressing the Council. The Tail Twister is encouraged to access fines for bad manners, throaty whispers and mumbling. **All cell phones and pages should be placed in a mode that will not create sound when activated. All cell phone use should be conducted outside the meeting area.**
8. Notices of council meetings are sent in the District Newsletter. (It should be received approximately 8 days prior to the meeting).
9. Material to be printed in the District Newsletter is sent to the editor by the eighteenth (18th) of the month. The District Newsletter is the primary means of communication of the Club and District information.
10. President and Secretary of the PSC meeting must be 100% in attendance at the PSC meetings the previous year. Nominated person for President must have been President of his/her club the previous year and the nomination for Secretary must have been Secretary of his/her club the previous year. PSC President and/or Secretary will serve a term of one (1) year and cannot seek either office thereafter. Only those eligible to vote are the current Presidents and Secretaries of the year the voting for PSC President and Secretary takes place. Presidents vote for the nominated President and Secretaries vote for nominated Secretary. The nominating committee presents the slate one (1) month (in May) before elections (in June). The new officers take office July 1. The presiding officers of the PSC meeting are the President and Secretary. From PCC Paul Fletcher: I have received a plea of help from PDG Margo Guerra of District 20-R2 New York-Bermuda of a plea from the Lions of Honduras for assistance of a two month old boy Jorge Alberta Peralta born with a hereditary disease associated with malignant intraocular tumor(s) that develop from retinal visual cells. If the disease process goes untreated, numerous seedling nodules produce secondary tumors, gradually filling the eye and extending along the optic nerve to the brain, usually ending in death. The Lions of District 20-R2 and the Montefiore Medical Center in the Bronx, New York are anxious to treat Baby Peralta. Dr. Harry M. Engel, director of the Retina and Vitreous Service of Montefiore Medical Center stated that "the cost of the eye examination and surgeon fees will be waived as the referral is through the Lions Clubs which has been supportive of the Department of Ophthalmology over the years" but hospital and operating room fees may be estimated at \$5,000. - \$50,000., for the entire course of therapy which may require radiation and chemotherapy treatment. The approximate time needed for the completion of treatment is six to twelve weeks. 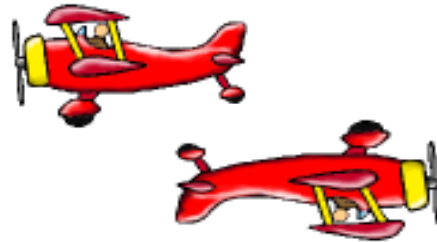

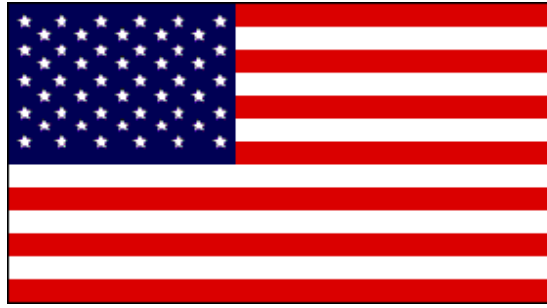

TRANSITIONAL DISTRICT

District and Club Administration Division

The following information regarding transitional districts as defined by association policy is provided for your review.

In the event any single or sub-district shall fail to maintain at least thirty-five (35) clubs and one thousand two hundred and fifty (1250) members in good standing, it shall be permitted up to two (2) fiscal years from the time it fails to meet said minimum requirements to attain the requisite number of clubs and club members. In the event it shall fail to attain the same, the district shall automatically be designated a TRANSITIONAL DISTRICT and shall not be eligible to elect a district governor until such time as it consists of thirty-five (35) Lions Clubs and one thousand two hundred and fifty (1250) members in good standing.

Additional restrictions may be imposed by the International Board of Directors for transitional districts.

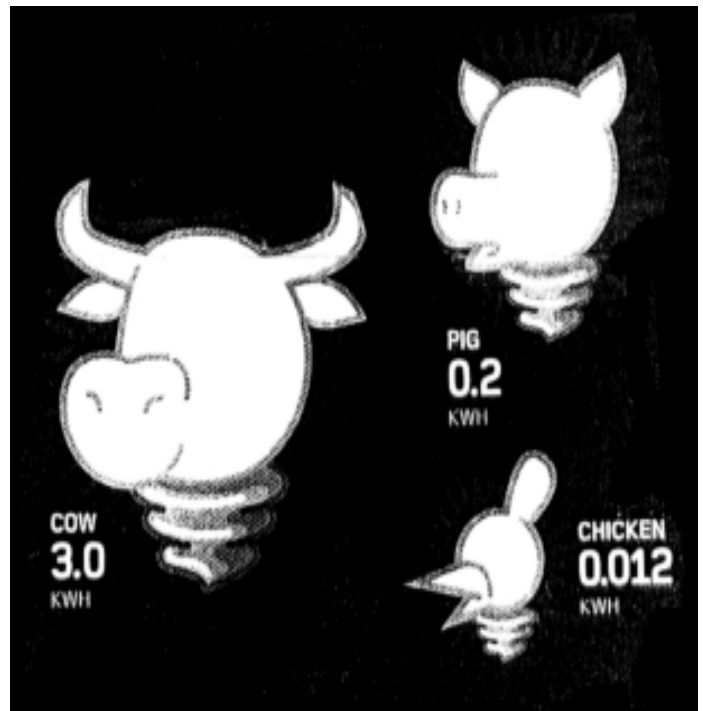

BARNYARD POWER

WHAT MANURE CAN DO

It takes 2.4 kilowatt hours (kwh) of electricity to burn a 100-watt electric lightbulb for a day. Heres how much electrical energy is obtainable from the average daily droppings of three popular barnyard animals.



The popularity of alternative fuels - especially manure, the most unglamorous fuel of all - waxes and wanes with the price of energy. The equipment to turn animal waste into electrical power has been around for decades, and yet only about 30 American farms have taken the plunge (some 400 have done so in Europe). In recent years manure boosters “took a holiday, mainly due to cheap energy,” says Mark Moser, whose company, Resource Conservation Management, has been designing and installing manure-power projects since the early 1980s. But now, with energy prices high again, manure is getting another look.

Most manure-to-power facilities work according to this basic scheme: Manure is placed in an anaerobic digester - a large, unfortunately named container designed to encourage the growth of bacteria.

These bacteria convert the carbohydrates in manure into biogas, a substance that consists mainly of methane (the primary ingredient in natural gas) and carbon dioxide. The biogas is then piped to an engine where it is burned to produce electricity.

It usually takes between 20 and 30 days for manure to be fully processed, after which it can be used as a nearly odorless fertilizer. The other advantages of manure power go beyond energy bills. It uses up methane, a greenhouse gas that would otherwise be emitted into the atmosphere from manure-storage lagoons. Pathogens present in untreated manure are eliminated. And last but by no means least, it reduces the smell of the stuff.

Contest

- October 1, 2002** Deadline to purchase kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- November 15, 2002** Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the district governor.

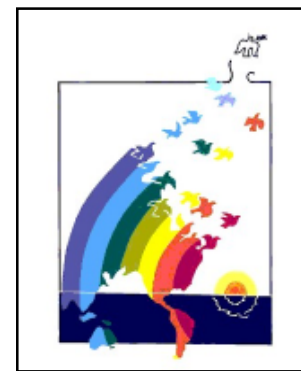
