# RULES FOR DISTRICT 2-S2 PRESIDENTS AND SECRETARIES COUNCIL 2003-2004

- 1. Protocol will be stated by the Council Chair at the beginning of each meeting and need not be repeated during the meeting.
- 2. To respect the environment and avoid potential health risk, there is **NO SMOKING** inside the meeting room.
- 3. The Presidents and Secretaries of each Lions Club in District 2-S2 are voting members of the council and are expected to attend each meeting.
- 4. Solicitation of funds during council is discouraged. On rare occasions, solicitation may be allowed when approved by the District Governor or the President and Secretary of the Council. Fiscal needs should be anticipated and submitted in writing to the District Newsletter.
- 5. District and Club announcements, reports, awards, and speeches are limited to two (2) minutes. Any speaker exceeding the time limit is subject to a fine of \$1.00 for each quarter minute or fraction thereof.
- 6. Persons having more than one reason to address the Council should consolidate all announcements, reports, awards, and speeches into one appearance on the floor. Greater use of the District Newsletter for these purposes should be made.
- 7. Council members and guests remain respectfully silent while others are addressing the Council. The Tail Twister is encouraged to access fines for bad manners, throaty whispers and mumbling. All cell phones and pagers should be placed in a mode that will not create sound when activated. All cell phone use should be conducted outside the meeting area.
- 8. Notices of council meetings are sent in the District Newsletter. (It should be received approximately 8 days prior to the meeting).
- 9. Material to be printed in the District Newsletter is sent to the editor by the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) of the month. The District Newsletter is the primary means of communication of the Club and District information.
- 10. President and Secretary of the PSC meeting must be 100% in attendance at the PSC meetings the previous year. Nominated person for President must have been President of his/her club the previous year and the nomination for Secretary must have been Secretary of his/her club the previous year. PSC President and/or Secretary will serve a term of one (1) year and cannot seek either office thereafter. Only those eligible to vote are the current Presidents and Secretaries of the year the voting for PSC President and Secretary takes place. Presidents vote for the nominated President and Secretaries vote for nominated Secretary. The nominating committee presents the slate one (1) month (in May) before elections (in June). The new officers take office July 1. The presiding officers of the PSC meeting are the President and Secretary. In the absence of the President, the Secretary will preside and will appoint a temporary Secretary to take minutes. In the absence of the Secretary, the President will appoint a temporary Secretary.
- 11. The Agenda for the Presidents and Secretaries Council: Call to order, protocol and recognition of guests. Invocation. Pledge to the flag of the nation. Song. Lions' action program. District Announcements. Club Announcements. Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer. District Governor. Parade of Gifts. Lions Roar and adjournment.
- 12. Procedural questions are resolved by of Robert's Rules Order.
- 13. Lions requesting time of the floor should register before the meeting on the first come "Sign-up Sheet".



This may be a law that no one enforces but I believe that Lions Clubs in District 2-S2 should know that this law exists. Some of the things I am talking about are:

- a) The brochure refers to the Charitable Raffle Enabling Act, recodified September 1, 1999.
- b) What "Qualified Organizations may hold a raffle.
- c) What **prizes** may be offered?
- d) What are the restrictions on haw a raffle may be conducted.
   (There is a limit of two a year and more than one raffle at a time is prohibited.)
- e) What are the penalties for conducting an unauthorized raffle?

  (Only raffles held according to this law are authorized. An unauthorized raffle is considered gambling under the Texas Penal Code. conducting such a raffle is a Class A misdemeanor and participating is such a raffle is a Class C misdemeanor.
- f) Also, certain things **must be printed on** each raffle ticket.
- g) The Attorney General has Regional offices. The phone number for the one in the Houston Area is **713-223-5886.**

#### **How the Contest Works**

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2003. Participating students are asked to draw, sketch or paint their interpretation of the contest theme, "Create a Brighter Tomorrow."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations in New York City, New York, USA (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$2,500 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony will be held in February or
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.



Governor Bud, you deserve this rest after doing an excellent job as Governor of District 2-S2. No need to worry about next year for it will be in good hands once more.

To make yourself more comfortable you need a cold drink and a cool breeze. A fan is one item that helps the environment by saving on electricity.

A ceiling fan is like a breeze on a hot day, and the cost of running a ceiling fan is less than a penny per hour.

One of the most popular amenities in today's homes is the ceiling-mounted paddle fan. For circulating heat, cooling a room, lighting up a space or just as a decorating touch, paddle fans offer something for just about every home, taste and budget.

In the winter, you can use the fan to push heat at the top of the vault down to the room. In the summer, the motor is reversed to pull warm air up to the ceiling and out the windows.

Another desirable and increasingly common feature is a multiple or variable speed motor. This allows you to adjust the speed that the blades rotate, increasing or decreasing the amount of air being moved by the fan.

Another choice is whether or not you want a light kit. Most fans are sold without a light attached, but are pre-wired for the light kit.

With all that decided on, the final selection comes down to one of appearance. You'll find fans in polished brass, antique brass, chrome and any of a variety of colors. Blades can be purchased in white or any of several wood tones, some with wicker accents.

#### **Installation**

Lighter weight fans can be mounted directly to standard ceiling boxes in place of the original Ceiling light. Larger fans, especially ones with light kits attached, can be quite heavy, and are often too much weight for a standard box. In those cases, specially reinforced or braced boxes need to be used. Consult with the dealer where you buy the fan for their recommendations on the proper type of box to use.

Fans with multifunction switches may require multiple wires between the fan and the switch, so consult the instruction booklet or talk with your dealer before completing any wiring installations.
