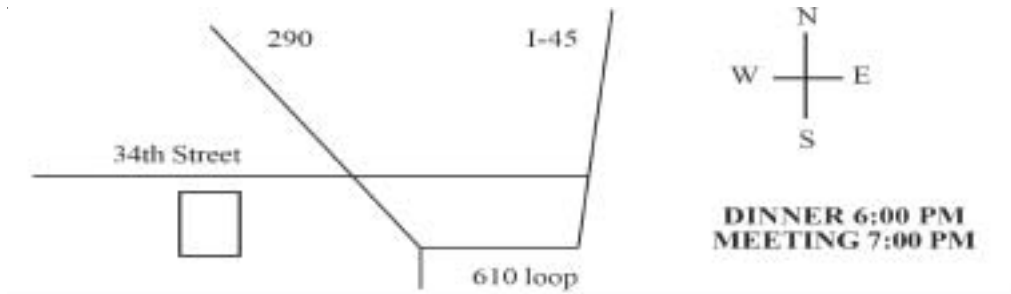

District Governor C.W. “Buzz” Goins

First, let me say how proud I am to be able to serve our District, and let me also express my “Thanks” to those Who have chosen to serve in the Cabinet. Some of you, while I do not know you, I do know you through the eyes of others, and without exception, everyone selected was recommended by two to five other Lions. There is a big job to be done this year, and it will take the best we have. In some respects, we are a continuation of the last year here we enjoyed some notable achievements, e.g., and increase in clubs formed and an increase in members. We must sustain this momentum - and do better!

President Mehta’s One Plus program using the Mission 30 implementation plan is conceptually sound, requiring only the proper selection of the 30 members to execute the plan. In this, we are fortunate in that our own PDG Fred Wuensche is one of the “30”. Help for 2-S2 is near and available. A Chairperson will be named for this committee as much work has to be done in concert with the Region and Zone Chairs.

The much heralded Campaign Sight First II is upon us, and the demands, at first glance, appear to be monumental at least. While the casual observer (and participant) will be overwhelmed, the average Lion will readily see that the old standbys “planning” and “implementation” will win the day. Campaign Sight First was an outstanding success, and there is no reason to believe Sight First II will be anything less. The job also calls for a new Chairperson who will be appointed. A lot more information is “coming down” on this Lions project.

These programs coupled with the addition to the Governor’s 100 percent that includes two new charities don’t make it any easier, but as my grandmother used to say, “Hard work never killed anyone”. These charities are labors of love for the chairpersons who volunteered, thereby proving the old adage, “The person who enjoys his job will never have to work”.

The Lions Project for Canine Companion Independence (LPCCI) and the Hugh O’Brien Youth outreach (HOBY) are worthy programs that serve both those in need and the youth of our community. They give the Lions two other avenues into the community.

On the tourist and fun side, what can be said about Hong Kong? Words like fantastic, and stupendous are totally inadequate and do nothing to paint a picture of this island city that is a sister, weather-wise, to Houston. (Please note that this is a consensus opinion.) After an almost 35 year absence, nothing prepared me for the changes. The under class has been promoted into near extinction by a very low unemployment rate. How low you say: how about the importation of 100,000 household workers to provide the workers that are not available locally or from mainland China?

An office (and apartment) building boom unlike anything seen in the west and high-rises with the names of every major corporation throughout the world adorn this island like Bluebonnets and Indian Paint Brushes on a Texas roadside in the spring. (The only way to build here is up.) The birthing of a world dominating financial center whose time has come, who knows?

As expected, the Lions International Convention was an unqualified success in all aspects. Twelve thousand plus Lions were assembled, trained, paraded, and reveled – all in good order and with great fraternity; not withstanding some menus the adventurous-challenged found to be a bit “offish”. It’s amazing how little variety is required in some diets.

Report to the Lions of District 2-S2 on our Work in Nicaragua
From : PDG Tony Wenzel

In May, Two Individuals from InFocus and I spent 10 days in Nicaragua and I feel it's safe to say it was very successful. We trained some 35 or 40 Lions, Red Cross workers and others to evaluate eye sight and dispense eye glasses and recognize other eye care needs. We supplied material required to 5 Lions Clubs. We took hundreds of frames and lens with us, and we hundreds more to ship down there as soon as we get specific instructions on how to send them, etc. A Vice Minister of Health promised his cooperation so we are not finished with this our fourth trip. But , I want to thank all the clubs, Individuals and others who have helped us, including LCIF and InFocus. If I have inadvertently left your club off the list, let me know. I do have a good" Forgetter". Individuals probably don't want their names listed, but if you do, again, just let me know.

World Lions Service Day on Oct. 8 and United Nations Day Oct. 24.

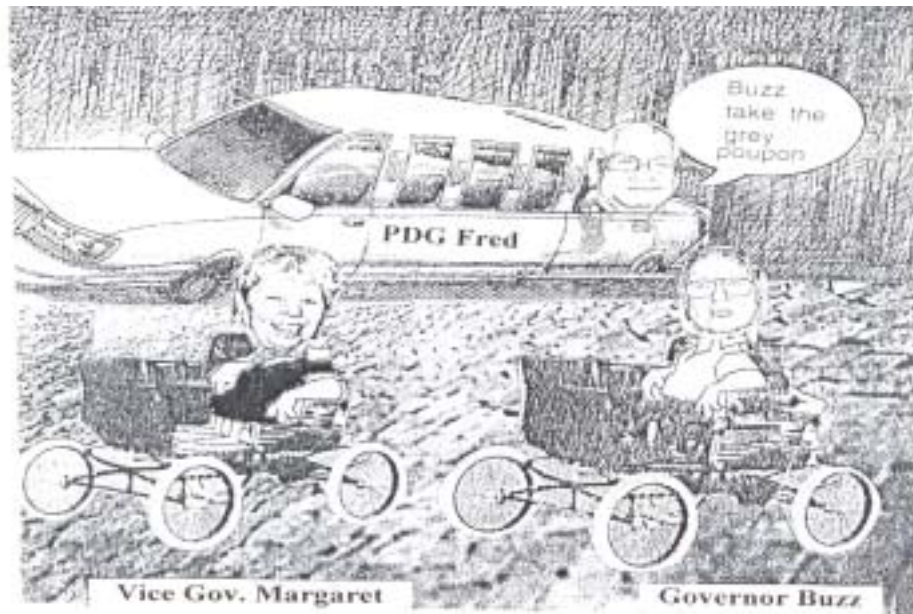
