#### Campaign SightFirst II

In the early 1990's, Lions, worldwide, raised more than \$143 millions dollars for Campaign Sight First. These funds, along with interest and subsequent donations, have been used to improve eye care for over 100 million, prevent vision loss or restore vision in 24 million people, create more than 250 eye care clinics and train nearly 68,000 eye care professionals. Even with the great success of Sight First, much work remains to prevent the world's blind population from doubling to 74 million by the year 2020. Therefore, Lions International has begun Campaign Sight First II with the goal of raising \$150 million dollars worldwide.

In District 2-S2, Lion Billy Chiasson has been appointed District Coordinator for Campaign Sight First II. His team of Group Coordinators include Lion Betty Goetzman, Lion Chuck Martin, Lion Judy Champion, Lion Beverly Kottwitz, Lion Jim Gregory, Lion Sam Thomas, Lion George Malone, PDG James "Bud" McCune and PDG Dr. Irv Wishnow. These Lions will be visiting all clubs in our district to explain the Campaign Sight First II goals and programs and to be of assistance to clubs in setting goals and fund raising for the campaign. Be listening for their calls and get ready to help Lions worldwide once again lead in the battle against preventable blindness.
