Just Imagine the feeling.....

(Thoughts from the Camper Transportation Committee)

As Lions in District 2-S2, when we find and sponsor a camper to the Texas Lions Camp, we get that warm and fuzzy feeling that we crave to satisfy our need to serve others. But, once we sign-off on the application, we tend to forget about it and go on doing other things to serve.

We never give a second thought to the long-lasting effect we have on a child when we sponsor him or her to the Texas Lions Camp. We never stop to think that once we have mailed in the application a lot of different things begin to happen for that camper. Every day until the application is approved, the child waits and watches the mail box to see if he/she will be accepted. We never give another thought to the anxiety the child may suffer while waiting for word – especially if he or she is a first-time camper. We never give another thought to what they are thinking about being away from Mom and Dad and Home for a whole week.

For the first time, this year we thought about it. And that is when we, on the Camper Transportation Committee, realized we can and do play a major role in our campers' experiences.

While we wrestled with thoughts of discontinuing our project of providing bus transportation to the children of District 2-S2 because it is very labor-intensive and always falls on just a few Lions to get the job done. And while we wondered what we were doing wrong because we have very few Lions who are interested in "joining the bus brigade", we realized that it is our fault that no one comes to help because we have not told you about the wonderful opportunity we have to experience what a child going to our camp is experiencing.

We have the opportunity when we chaperone children on the bus going to camp to 1) anticipate along with them the experiences they will have; and 2) wonder if they are really going to have as much fun as people say they will have. The bus ride becomes for the camper, part of the camping experience....they reunite with many of the campers they met last year, or they begin to make new friends among the other campers on the bus, and they start to get answers to their questions. Some of the campers cry because they are leaving Mom and Dan behind, some are happy because they are leaving Mom and Dad behind, and some are "just plain scared". Once we drop the campers off in Kerrville, we worry about whether they will make it for the whole week and whether they are going to be homesick and cry all week, and whether they will be there when we come to pick them up on Saturday.

But when we arrive on Saturday, we realize we didn't have to worry. They rave about the really good time they had and many cry because they don't want to leave their new friends and counselors behind. On the ride home, we get to observe, first hand, the change in their personalities, their increased self-confidence and their new feeling of accomplishment. You get to see their awards (every camper gets one). We get to talk to the camper....the one who has never been out of his wheelchair, and he tells you his most favorite activity at camp was the "dance" on Thursday night.

Yes, it is a lot of fun to watch and learn with our campers. We had several Lions and non-Lions who came along to chaperone campers this year and experienced first-hand our campers' experiences.

The Camper Transportation Committee would like to thank them. We sincerely hope they enjoyed and learned while helping. And we hope they know how much we appreciate their "helping out". They are:

Lion Jim Groves (New Waverly Lions Club) and his daughter, Debbie. For the past several years, these wonderful Lions have driven all the way from New Waverly early Sunday morning to help with the loading process and to make the trip to Kerrville with us (a 14-hour day for them).

Lion Archie Heugatter (Houston Spring Branch Lions Club). Lion Archie has helped us for years and, although he is not as active as he once was (retired and gone fishin'), he is our go-to guy when we are desperate. I called Archie home from his fishing camp to help us out on Saturday. He put everything on hold to do so and we will owe him forever.

Lion Winnie Baul (Houston Space City Lions Club). For the past three years, Lion Winnie has been our

"cootie checker". She ensures that none of the campers have lice in their hair; if they do, they can't go to camp. Lion Winnie also always makes at least one trip with us to help with the campers. Since she is a school nurse, she has a lot of good knowledge.

Lion George Malone (Houston Space City Lions Club). Lion George, too, has traveled to camp on the bus with us to help with the campers for several years.

Lion Margie Perkins (Houston Space City Lions Club). Lion Margie made her second trip to camp on the bus with us this year. We hope she comes back for another trip next year.

Lion Steve Hand (Houston Sports Lions Club). Lion Steve helped on the bus several years past, and decided to come back again, for a round-trip this time. What we call a round-trip is joining us for a trip to take campers to camp on Sunday and then the next Saturday to pick up those campers for their return home. Lion Steve was a natural with the campers; he developed a real fan club with both the girls and the boys.

Lion Jeffrey Boules (Houston Sports Lions Club). Lion Jeffrey is a fairly new Lion and a great organizer. Although he has been to camp before to feed the campers on a Friday and attended the Awards Ceremony, we believe he enjoyed a whole new aspect of the camping adventure from interacting with the campers on the bus. They certainly listened to him and "straightened up" when he asked them to.

Lions Kevin and Laurette Bienvenu (Houston Copperfield Club). Lions Kevin and Laurette are new Lions who have never been to our camp before. They were wonderful with the campers and an asset to our Team. We will be forever indebted to them for making the trip with us. They have promised to come back next year.

"And, our "thank you" list would not be complete unless we listed **Ms. Darleane Warren, Lions Community Relations Coordinator with the Lions Eye Bank of Texas**. Darleane has been making our trips to Kerrville on the bus for two years now and she is an old pro by now. She relates well to the campers and she is a whiz with the paperwork.

Our THANK YOU'S would not be complete without telling you about **Mr. Russell "Rusty" Roberts**. His "real job" is working with **LifeGift** (you will remember that he was the **Executive Direction of the Lions Eye Bank** for several years). But, we are lucky to know Rusty because he drives buses as a hobby, and he drives the Camp Bus free of charge, although he is contracted to a viable bus company and could command good pay. He has done this for the past three years. In addition to driving the bus, Rusty helped with the campers, operated the wheelchair lift for those campers in wheelchairs, transfered them from wheelchairs to seats, and loaded luggage and equipment to just name a few of the things he does for us.

Handicapped Camping Season is over for this year. We have added to our lasting memories and have also added some funny stories that we can tell. Invite us to visit your club if you want to hear them. And, consider joining us next year for a trip to camp.....you will be glad you did.

Closing thoughts from the Past District Governor



How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2009. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "The Power of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations in New York City, New York, USA (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$2,500 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2010.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.


