#### WOMEN FOR MEMBERSHIP

International President Tae-Sup Lee is spearheading a bold new initiative to reach out to potential women members. Today there are 196,000 Women Lions which is 14% of Lions membership. District 2-S2 women membership is 577 or 28.47%. Women have been involved in Lions for many years, first as members of Lioness clubs and since 1987, as full fledged lions. However, this is the first time there has been such a large scale effort to target this largely untapped source directly for membership. The time is now!

I have been appointed by District Governor Melba Buado to join the MERL team as chair of Women Membership and Participation. Lions International has given a goal of 25 net new women members by March 31, 2004. This is a very makeable goal and one we can triple with the joint effort of our club membership chairs, presidents and members.

Club Presidents will receive five copies of the new brochure, for recruitment of women members, "I Am A Lion" ME37 by September l This publication targets the concerns of women and highlights the abundance of opportunities available to women through membership in a Lions club.

Women bring in depth community involvement to Lions, along with attention to detail and new ideas for programs and projects. Clubs can have immediate membership growth by bringing in wives, daughters, sisters, mothers and friends. The goal of 25 net new women members could be met by December 31, 2003. By meeting the goal on this date we have the rest of the lion year to triple the goal. Let's get to work!

As leader, you must announce your goals early, then immediately recruit, motivated, and train people to implement your goals. May I suggest your MERL goal include a high percentage of club members attending the <u>MwLLC</u> and <u>District Convention</u>.

Following advice given at the MD-2 Convention, <u>MwLLC</u> and <u>Convention</u> are constructed with informative programs and events "*More Fun*" and "Younger" —for Families with Children at Home.

We ask you to send LIONS and LEOs (And potential LIONS and LEOs) eMail addresses so we can keep them posted about LIONS happenings (eMail addresses will be held in confidence and used as occasional notices of District Events). Encourage suggestions to the Convention Committee for interesting events and subjects to consider. Ask members to volunteer to work on Convention Committees.

#### **Use Technology Rather Than Geography**

Go to < www.GoLions.us > —a website for continuing information about District (LIONS and LEOs) events. The site is intended as a quick reference for: who, when, where, where, dress, how much, etc. so busies families may attend and be involved District events.

Ask Club Webmasters and Bulletin Editors to link to the site and add articles about the <u>MwLLC</u> and <u>District Convention</u>. Especially be sure LEO members are included.
