



### Our Environmental Chairman Clifton Heiman writes....

## HAVE YOU HUGGED YOUR TREES TODAY?



The good news is - the Newsletter will be mailed out once more. The bad news is - it will use more paper causing the loss of trees. Think of a pair of mature, healthy trees as your lifeline, in one year, two trees can produce roughly the same amount of oxygen breathed by an average person in the same time span. A 32' tree can put out about 260 pounds of oxygen annually and clean several pollutants out of the air. Consider this the next time you see a tree being cut down. Consider also that a 25' tree planted in a strategic place can cut the yearly heating and cooling costs of a typical home by 8 to 12%. In Texas the best location for a shade tree is almost always near the west side of your house where it can block the suns hot summer rays.

The air you breathe can be cooler, too, thanks to trees. The U.S Department of Agriculture says that the net cooling effect of a young, healthy tree is the same as 10 room-size air conditioners running 20 hours a day. To multiply that benefit and really shrink your utility bill, plant a tree that shades your air conditioning unit. Your tree will need water, even when it's not green. In Texas most plants lose their leaves in the fall and winter. When water supply dries up one of the first things to die is a fungi that clings to tiny tree roots, helping them gather nutrients and water more efficiently.

# Vision Screening at Work

The Eye Screening Unit participated with the East Texas Health Access Network at a Medical Camp in Pineland, TX in July. With 295 plus people registered for the camp, 164 had eye screening and 48 pair of glasses were dispensed. Thirteen other booths included services varying from Lions Eye Bank information to dental consultations and breast screening. Doctors and volunteers came from San Antonio, Dallas, Houston, Cut 'n Shoot, Jasper and Pineland. Lion Irma Dowden from District 2-S1 helped with vision screening as did our own District 2-S2 Lions Larry Snider and George Malone from Houston Space City Lions, Rick Reynolds, Louis and Pat Hymel, Brenda Oliver, Eva and Eddie Thatcher of the Cut 'n Shoot Family Lions Club.
