According to LCI, the Club Excellence Process (CEP) is "a fun, interactive process that brings members together to look at what your club is today and what it will be tomorrow. It gives you the tools to strengthen your service, improve club effectiveness and enhance your membership experience. CEP is the perfect resource for any club that wants to achieve excellence!"

There are two versions available CEP Pro, where a trained Lions facilitator is used to guide your club and the CEP Lite for clubs who prefer to have a club member lead the process. Both versions involve the same steps:

- Assessing your club and your community
- Making an Excellent Club
- Determining Club Needs
- Settings Goals for the Future

While the steps might seem simple, the process will help your club identify unmet community needs and reach out to the community to see help determine how your club can met these needs. Meeting needs doesn't always mean back-breaking work or a lot of money, it could mean things would be relatively easily achieved by your club. Part of the process will also involve rating your club and helping to make your club more effective. While many of us might be a little scared in rating our club, it is the type of action that needs to happen if you want to attract people to join and do the work in the community you've identified for action.

So please read more about CEP at the website above and talk to your club about going through the process. Hats off to the district clubs who have gone through the CEP program and hats off to the district clubs who are considering it. # Thought's from the Second Vice District Governor ...

**Advice for the Zone Chairperson** 

**NO! I hope you never catch me offering another Lion "**advice". On that subject, let me simply say "Never offer a Lion something they can't pin on their vest". With that general understanding, I would hope that you plan to enter your year as Zone Chairperson with two simple goals in mind – to have fun, and make new friends! With that attitude, you just cannot fail.

After a brief description of the Zone Chair "fundamentals", I will share some of the ideas that I've seen used by really effective Zone Chairs. The primary functions of the Zone Chair include communicating information between the Clubs in the Zone and the District, providing coaching support when Clubs experience challenges and motivating and supporting club officers. To accomplish these objectives, the Zone Chair will organize and plan the quarterly Zone meetings. This is where District news and events will be shared with the Clubs, and Clubs' news and events can be shared with each other.

Club visitations are the fun part. It is while attending these that the Zone Chair connects with his or her Clubs. By participating and taking notes, the Zone Chair will gather information about Club activities that can be included in the Zone Reports offered at the Cabinet meetings. If done well – meaning gathering timely information about upcoming events – the Club activities can be publicized enough in advance to get support from other Lions across the District. The Zone Chair should be able to monitor the Clubs' effectiveness by participating and making general observations at the Club meetings they attend, too.

The on-line resource "MyLCI" is a great tool for the Zone Chair, as well. If you have not taken advantage of this resource, please contact one of your District officers for assistance. From the Zone Chair features on MyLCI, you can gather member information and develop a really handy list of membership data that will make generating mailing lists fairly simple.

I've seen really successful Zone Chairpersons in the past who had the best times and made great friends while serving their year as Zone Chair. The common elements I saw were "organization" and "planning". One Zone Chair whom I recall had a mastery of the job had his Zone activities planned out for the entire year well before the year even got started. This doesn't mean it's too late to start planning today. Before his first Zone meeting, this great Lion created a nice manual with important Club officer information detailed, resources noted and a calendar with Zone meeting dates listed for the entire year.

At the first Zone meeting, he met with his Zone's Club officers and set up a plan for visiting all the Clubs in his Zone throughout the year. I know that I enjoy attending Club meetings, but for some reason "planning" them has always

been the really hard part. Isn't it great when that part is done early in the year? It makes procrastinating obsolete! This great Zone Chair taught me that the fourth and last Zone meeting should be special. He made it so, too. Instead of the more formal "meeting" setting, he made it a party. We met at a restaurant and shared successes and focused on the Clubs' accomplishments for the year. He even encouraged the Club officers to include the newly elected officers who would be replacing them the next year. At this meeting, Lions who really worked hard over the year were recognized for their contributions.

So, if you make a personal commitment to have fun and make new friends when you sign on to serve as Zone Chair, I promise you that you'll NEVER feel like someone had to twist your arm to serve. Serving your fellow Lions is just one more way that WE SERVE.

## **HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FUND**

Have you ever heard of this committee? This fund is at the root of the basic function of the Lions—Community Service. This is one way your club can help others (not Lions) in your community that have a special need. There is a form and rules that must be met; however, they are easy to follow.

First funds are limited to a total of \$2500—half from the District and half from the requesting Lions Club. The Club must submit a form requesting funds. No money is paid to the individual requesting the funds, nor can anyone who is a Lion be served by the HRF. Again, the total request cannot be more than \$2500—half to be paid by the District and half from the individual club.

The check from the club for half of the cost, as well as a statement of expenses and a statement of whether this is an emergency request must be submitted to the District Secretary. The District Secretary will submit the request to the HRF Committee and they will vote on the request.

Some of the previous requests have been for specialized medical equipment, special glasses or braces, home repairs or doctor or drug bills, etc..

If your club recognizes a need, you can call or e-mail anyone on the HRF Committee and they will answer questions for you.

Members of the HRF Committee are Lions Winnie Mae Eads, Betty Williamson and Jim Kerr, Directors.

Also DG Chris Moorman, IPDG Eddie Risha, 2VDG Mark Roth and the Director/Chairman 1VDG Noah Speer, as well as the District Secretary Betty Ezell and District Treasurer Greg Turner.

This can be a great service to a deserving person and the District and your club split the cost.

# MEMBERSHIP TYPES AND FEES

# **New Member**

New members pay an entrance fee of US\$25 or must submit the proper waiver certification form. International dues total US \$43 annually. Dues are billed on a semi-annual basis. Additional district, multiple district and club dues may apply.

# Transfer Member

Transfer members in good standing pay no entrance fee when transferring to an existing club within 12 months.

# Family Member

The Family Membership Program provides families with the opportunity to receive a special dues discount when they join a Lions club together. The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (US\$43), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (US\$21.50). All family members pay the one-time entrance fee of US\$25.

The Family Membership Program is open to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club, and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. Common household family members include parents, children, spouses, aunts and uncles, cousins, grandparents, in-laws and legal dependents. Submit the Family Unit Certification Form (TK-30).

# Student

Students between the age of majority and through age 30 pay no entrance fee and half international dues. Students over age 30 and joining a Campus Lions club pay a US\$10 entrance fee and full international dues. Submit the *Student Member Certification Form* (STU-5) for each student.

# **Current or Former Leo**

All graduating Leos receive an entrance fee waiver. Current or former Leos, through the age of 30, who have been a Leo for at least a year and a day,pay half international dues. Submit the Leo to Lion Certification and Years of Service Transfer Form (LL-2) for each current or former Leo under 30.



# Young Adult

Young adults, through the age of 30, receive an entrance fee waiver and pay half international dues when joining a Leo Lions club. Submit the Leo to Lion Certification and Years of Service Transfer Form (LL-2) for each young adult.


