LIONS EYE BANK MOBILE VISION SCREENING UNIT


The Lions Eye Bank of Texas is proud to announce the availability of its Mobile Screening Unit for use at vision screenings throughout the four districts that support the eye bank – Districts 2-S1, 2-S2, 2-S4 and 2-A3. The Mobile Screening Unit includes a full optic lane for conducting vision screenings as well as a supply of recycled eyeglasses from the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center in Midland, Texas.

Guidelines for use of the Mobile Screening Unit require a team of volunteers who are trained to use the equipment. District 2-S2 has a team, led by Lion Eddie Thatcher, already trained on the equipment. Lion Eddie and his team are willing to work with Lions interested in being trained to use the equipment and are available to assist with screenings. Other requirements for use include arranging for the transport of the unit and having a licensed professional on-site during all screenings.

Any club wishing to reserve the Mobile Screening Unit should complete a request form and return it to Alicen Swift at the Lions Eye Bank of Texas. The request form is available via e-mail, as well as on the District 2-S2 Web site. All requests will be acknowledged in writing upon receipt. Our Environmental Chairman Clifton Heiman writes....

COOKING VENTILATION

The kitchen has become the gathering place and center of entertainment during the past 20 years. This is why cooking ventilation has become a major aspect in the building of a new house or the complete remodeling of a kitchen.

Home Ventilation Institute has stated that the main source of pollution in the home is produced in the kitchen. Grease is a main contaminate. A family of four will produce a gallon of grease per year because of improper ventilation. A small amount of vaporized grease is some of the reasons why there are odors in

the home. A grease particle could float in a home up to three days. Controlling grease would also control moisture, heat and odors.

There are some common rules for choosing proper ventilation. The height of the hood should be 30 to 36 inches from the cooking surface. The width of the hood should match the width of the cooking surface. The hood can be larger for more efficient canopy collection of heat and steam, but never smaller.

The ventilator - some call lit a blower - should match the customer's cooking styles.

The final consideration of proper ventilation is the size of the duct used and how long it will need to be. You can connect 8 inch pipe to 10 inch, but never 10 inch to 8 inch. This would not allow proper exhaust and cause a restriction of air flow. Always try to minimize the number of elbows (4 maximum), and always try to separate each elbow by at least 2 feet. Subtract 10 feet for each 90° elbow and 5 feet for each 45° transition. The maximum recommendation is not to exceed 50 feet, and that could change with the number of elbows or transitions.
