Leadership Development in Lions

HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FUND

Have you ever heard of this committee? This fund is at the root of the basic function of the Lions—Community Service. This is one way your club can help others (not Lions) in your community that have a special need. There is a form and rules that must be met; however, they are easy to follow.

First funds are limited to a total of \$2500—half from the District and half from the requesting Lions Club. The Club must submit a form requesting funds. No money is paid to the individual requesting the funds, nor can anyone who is a Lion be served by the HRF. Again, the total request cannot be more than \$2500—half to be paid by the District and half from the individual club.

The check from the club for half of the cost, as well as a statement of expenses and a statement of whether this is an emergency request must be submitted to the District Secretary. The District Secretary will submit the request to the HRF Committee and they will vote on the request.

Some of the previous requests have been for specialized medical equipment, special glasses or braces, home repairs or doctor or drug bills, etc..

If your club recognizes a need, you can call or e-mail anyone on the HRF Committee and they will answer questions for you.

Members of the HRF Committee are Lions Winnie Mae Eads, Betty Williamson and Jim Kerr, Directors.

Also DG Chris Moorman, IPDG Eddie Risha, 2VDG Mark Roth and the Director/Chairman 1VDG Noah Spear, as well as the District Secretary Betty Ezell and District Treasurer Greg Turner.

This can be a great service to a deserving person and the District and your club split the cost.

MD-2 TEXAS LIONS HALL OF FAME

- 1) Elevation of Lions into the Texas Lions Hall of Fame bestows an honor upon one who has been outstanding in using their time, talents and resources to further the cause of humanitarian services.
- 2) The MD-2 State Office shall, at the first council meeting each year, distribute information about nomination criteria to District Governors.
- 3) Selection shall be by the Hall of Fame Committee for each district. The committee of five members each, from different clubs, shall be appointed by the District Governor. The nominee shall be certified to the Council of Governors not later than the February Council meeting.
- 4) Minimum standards to qualify for the Texas Lions Hall of Fame are:
 - a) Be an active or deceased member with at least fifteen years of service,
 - b) Having provided outstanding and dedicated service to Lionism beyond the call of duty,
 - c) Having provided other than Lionistic service to community, state and nation,
 - d) Having accomplished special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate, and
 - e) Not having solicited in any manner for this recognition, which will automatically eliminate the soliciting candidate for that year.
- 5) A fee of \$227.50 shall accompany the nominee's profile. Selection of International Directors is automatic and no fee is required. The Hall of Fame fee covers the cost of the Hall of Fame Medallion and, the Hall of Fame Plaque, which is presented to each nominee.
- 6) Presentation of the selected nominee, by the District Governor, shall be at the MD-2 Convention. Each selected nominee will receive a duplicate of the plaque placed in the Hall of Fame.
- 7) A plaque with the names of to the Texas Lions Hall of Fame members shall be maintained in an appropriate space at the MD-2 State Office.
- 8) The nominees shall be selected in accordance with the following schedule:

Service organization first area 'Lady' Lion's Club; sets \$10,000 goal for Charter event

HOUSTON (Sept. 9)—Laser-focused on finding ways to serve its community, Houston Lady Lions, the first area "Lady" Lions Club, set an ambitious goal to raise \$10,000 at Hats & High Tea, Oct. 18, an afternoon event to celebrate its charter and mark its debut in the Houston community and Texas District 2-S2 Lions Club organization.

"We want to get involved immediately and find out how we can help," Houston Lady Lions President Jayne Edison said. She is president and CEO of Office Furniture Innovations (OFI) in Houston and was recognized as Woman Business Owner of the year by the Houston chapter of the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO) in 2010.

Edison said she believes Houston Lady Lions can be a trendsetter in changing hearts and minds about how people are to care for one another.

"People are willing to give to a good cause," she said. "We just have to know how to ask, and be willing to go out and give a little and ask a little. We have to work at it."

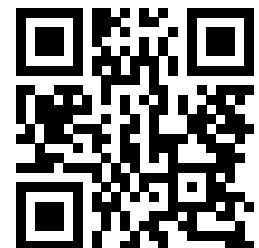
