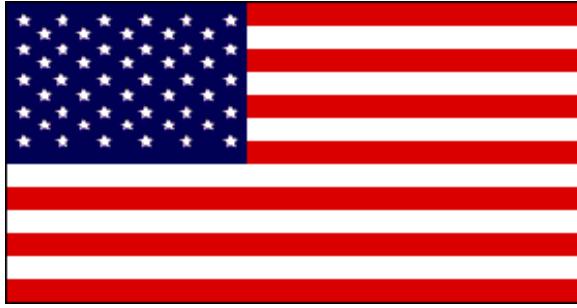

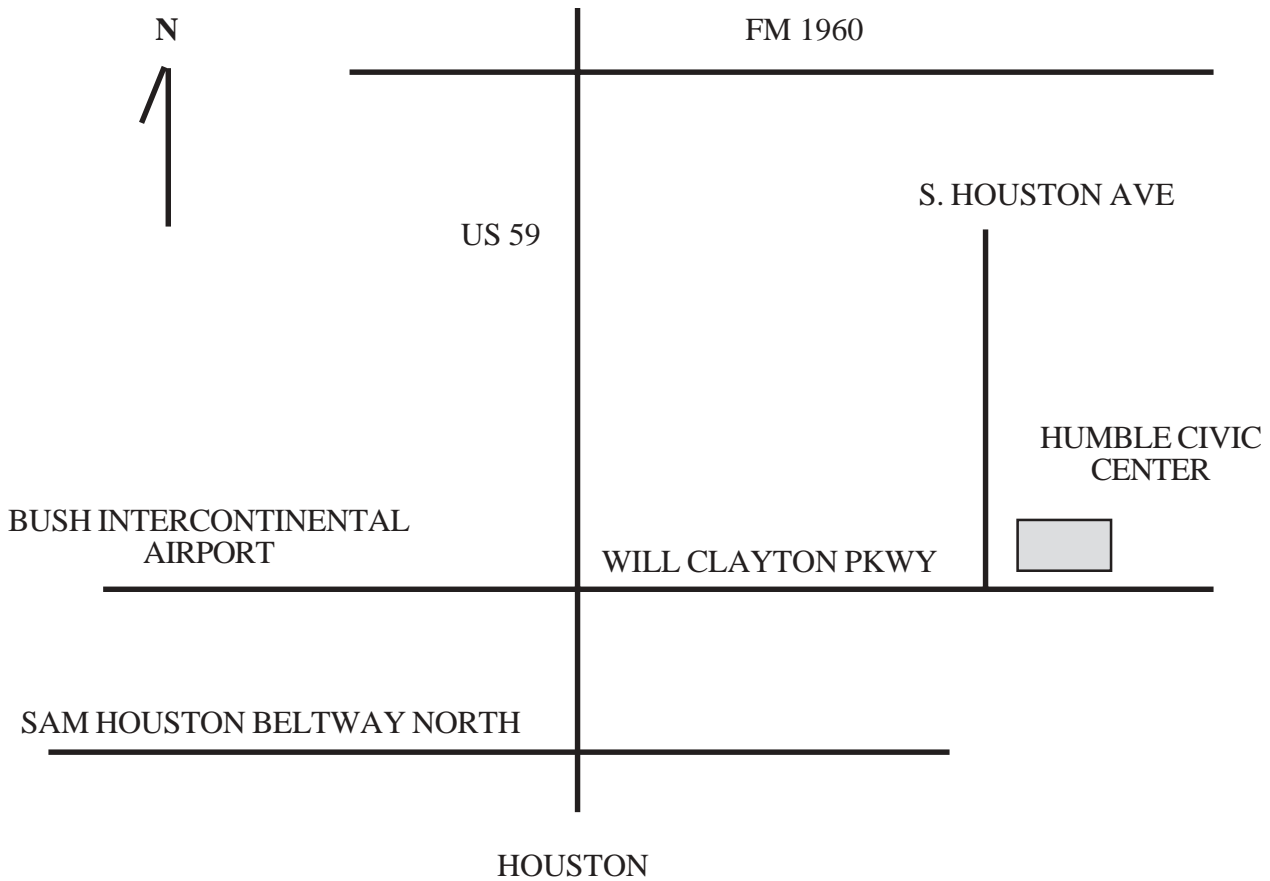

DIABETIC ESSAY RULES

Topic: "Becoming Knowledgeable about Diabetes Through Research"

"Essay" is a written article read, by the author, at the District 2-S2 Youth Contest Day on a Saturday in March of 2003 to be announced later at location also to be announced later in competition with other contestants from District Lions' Club.

The District winner will compete with other contestants from other Districts in the State of Texas at the State Convention in Dallas, May 23 & 24, 2003.

The essay does not exceed 1,500 words. All words in the essay are counted including articles, conjunctives and pronouns, for example: i.e., "a", "I", "and", and "an".

Each contestant must personally research, write, and read the contest essay and present it before judges and spectators. The essay must include a bibliography of sources used in its composition. In addition to copies used by the contestants in the reading of the essay, each contestant submits four double spaced, typewritten copies of the contest essay at the time the article is read.

The following criteria used for judging essay:

- a. 60 percent currentness, authenticity and application to the assigned Essay Topic.
- b. 15 percent grammar, sentence structure, pronunciation, enunciation, correct word usage, and relationship to the assigned essay.
- c. 25 percent understandability of the essay through personal presentation techniques in use of posture, eye contact and voice, by its modulation, volume, speed clarity and enunciation.

Each contestant must be or have been:

- a. Regularly enrolled as a student at a public high school or comparable educational program of learning.
- b. Junior or Senior level up to 19 years of age by May 24, 2003.
- c. Never married.

Contestant submits for publication with application, 2 wallet sized color photographs (close up of head and shoulders).

Outstanding Youth Scholarship Contest Rules and Guidelines

Contestant must be a full time student at a public school or comparable educational program of learning, at the junior or senior level, within the area designated as District 2-S2 in Texas Lions Clubs districts. Contestant must be between the ages of 17 and 19 as of May 24, 2003. Contestant must not be nor have been a party to a marriage or cohabitation with a person of the opposite sex who is unrelated to contestant or have participated in the conception of a child before participation in the 2-S2 scholarship contest. Contestant must be available to attend the State Convention in Dallas, Texas on May 23 & 24, 2003.

Each contestant's application shall be accompanied by an unofficial high school transcript and three letters of recommendation.

The maximum points to be used for judging contestants shall be:

- a. Grade point average = 20 points.
- b. Personal biography information statement = 5 points.
- c. Three letters of recommendation (total) = 15 points.
- d. Community service / leadership = 30 points.
- e. Personal Interview = 30 points.

The judges' total scores are to be combined to reach a grand total score.

Contestants shall remain outside the contest room until invited to enter by the Contest Chairman.

How Can Binge Drinking be Controlled with High School and College Students?

The presentation should analyze the problem with present a solution. Research for this topic can be conducted by interviewing school officials, teachers, judges, law enforcement personnel, probation personnel, counselors, Juvenile Court Officials, legislators, medical personnel and by using the library. The topic is broad and allows the contestants considerable leeway in proposing the plan. Sources of data and any quotes used in the presentation should be identified by title and or date published (year if known). Innovative practical and reasonable ideas are welcomed. Each contestants must be a full time student in a Texas High School, a junior or senior class member at the time of the MD-2 convention and be sponsored by a Lion/Lioness/Leo Club in Multiple District 2.

The speech will be from 5 to 7 minutes in length. Notes, cue cards and video equipment may not be used at District or State contests. Contestants will be required to use either the stationary or hand held mike for presentation. A monitor will signal contestants at 5 minutes and at 6 ½ minutes. Order your free **Diabetes Outcomes Card**

This card lists regular health checks for good diabetes care, such as lab tests and exams. The **Diabetes Outcomes Card** tells you how often each check is done and lists the American Diabetes Association goal for each. Take your **Diabetes Outcomes Card** to your diabetes visits. You and your health care provider will set your goals, update your progress, and discuss results.

Diabetes can lead to vision loss or even blindness. If you catch problems early, you can save your sight. However, you may not have any symptoms. That is why it is important to have an eye exam each year.

Diabetes can harm the nerves in your feet. When it does, you may not feel a cut or blister on your foot. Untreated, a cut or blister can lead to infection and possibly the loss of a limb.

Check your feet for loss of feeling

Call the American Diabetes Association to order a **free filament** you can use. The filament comes in a cardboard holder along with how to use it. Make checking your feet part of your regular diabetes care. You and your provider can work together to prevent or delay foot problems.

Contact your provider right away if you notice loss of feeling in your feet, or if you see cuts, blisters, redness, or swelling.

People with diabetes are twice as likely to develop high blood pressure than people without diabetes. If untreated, high blood pressure can lead to heart disease and stroke. It can also cause eye and kidney problems.

Texas Lions Foundation Diabetes Project

A recent study by a Canadian researcher has revealed that Type 1 Diabetes, seen in adults nearly exclusively 20 years ago, is striking overweight children in alarming numbers.

This study is of particular interest to Texas Lions because the Texas Lions Foundation supports diabetes research.

Overweight children that develop the disease face complications from heart disease, blindness, kidney failure and amputations as they grow older.

Dr. Heather Dean, a pediatrician at the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, revealed her findings at a recent meeting of the American Diabetes Association in San Francisco. The research results were worse than what doctors might have expected, according to the Los Angeles Times.

In her study, she kept records on 51 patients with Type I diabetes who had developed the disease before they were 17. Of those, now between the ages of 18 and 33, two had died from complications of diabetes. Three more patients from the group remain on dialysis.

The group included 44 women. There were 56 pregnancies and only 35 live births. Dean said many of the failed pregnancies could have been prevented if mothers had adequate control of sugar levels. All patients were from Canada native population, and all were prone to diabetes.

KEEP HIM GOING

Do right by cordless tools to extend life of expensive batteries!



More and more tools in everyday use for home repair and gardening are cordless and are powered by rechargeable batteries. Unfortunately, many users of cordless tools don't take proper care of them, so batteries year out prematurely and don't respond to recharging.

Rechargeable batteries contain hazardous chemicals that can pollute soil and groundwater, and they should not be disposed of in the trash. Places that will accept rechargeable batteries for recycling can be located by calling 800-822-8837. Dial the number and enter your postal ZIP code, and you will be given the name of a center near you.

Most rechargeable tools come with owner's manuals that specify the correct recharging time. Some tools can be charged in an hour; others require four hours or more of charging time. It is a good idea to place a label on the charger stating the charging time. This can help avoid overcharging, which can damage the batteries in some tools. Always unplug the charger after it has charged a tool or battery pack.

Some chargers have tiny indicator lights to let users know when a full charge is reached. If you have a charger with such signals, be sure to check the owner's manual to understand what the signals mean. Make sure a battery pack is firmly seated in the charger so good contact is made.

A tool can be recharged as soon as it shows signs of losing power. There is no need to wait until the batteries are fully discharged.

If a battery pack becomes hot from extended use, let it cool for about 30 minutes before placing it in a charger. Some chargers even have built-in sensors that delay charging until the battery pack cools.

When possible, buy tools that include spare battery packs so that one set of batteries can be kept fully charged and ready for use while the other is being used.

Excessive heat and cold are probably the chief destroyers of rechargeable batteries. Don't leave a cordless tool in hot sunlight for long periods, and don't store it over the winter in an unheated garage or shed. Keeping cordless tools at room temperature is one of the best ways of extending their lives. Batteries should also be charged at room temperature rather than in hot or cold locations.

The average useful life span of rechargeable batteries is four or five years. When a tool or battery pack reaches the point where it won't hold a charge or recover its power by recharging, it is time to replace the batteries or junk the tool.

Replacement battery packs are sold at some home centers or can be obtained from manufacturers. Black & Decker Corp. has a series of Versa Pack tools (drills, screwdrivers, flashlights, saws etc.) that feature interchangeable and rechargeable batteries.

High-powered replacement battery packs are the most expensive, so one way to save money is to keep your cordless tools within a modest power range. Cordless-tool power is rated in volts, with some tools at 24 volts or more.

(The greater the volts, the greater the power.) Cordless drills - the most popular cordless tools - with 12 volts of power are adequate for virtually any job a do-it-yourselfer is likely to encounter.
