Thought's from the First Vice District Governor:

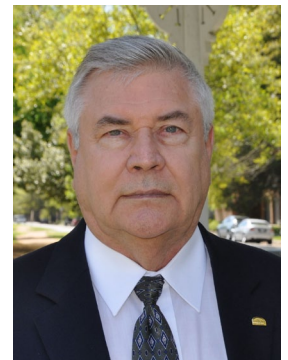
What a fantastic time for our Lions to stand up and serve our community!. Our District received a \$10,000 grant from LCIF to allow us to give assistance to the wildfire victims. Another \$2,000 grant came to us from the Texas Lions. We called all of the district's clubs that would possibly have wildfire victims in their area. The Lions of Magnolia and Tomball went to work. Although assistance was pouring in from all over the state, it was determined that there was a need for many to go shopping for food, clothing, cleaning supplies and medicine. The Lions of Magnolia worked with the relief personnel and the city's mayor (who is a Lion) and organized a shopping trip for many of the harder hit families. The President of the Magnolia Lions visited Walmart in Tomball and arranged a shopping trip. Walmart recognized the need to be a good community member and isolated two check-out counters to be used only for this service. They also offered a 10% discount to the victims. We used our tax exemption to further allow the victims to realize additional savings to make the money go further.

On Saturday, September 17th, 55 people came to Walmart and shopped for necessities for a total of 208 persons. It was fantastic. These people had lost every physical thing they owned. They were extremely fortunate to not experience any loss of life. The Lions who were there helping the shoppers were thanked over and over. It was not unusual to see our Lions being hugged by grateful folks.

Lions step forward when there is a need.

We also help each other when the need arises. Recently, my club had planned and sold tickets to a fund raiser fish fry. The president of our club (who is our chief cook) fell ill on Tuesday before the fish fry on Saturday. Andy wound up hospitalized and was unable to carry out his self assigned duties. Lions from two OTHER clubs stepped up and filled in to make the fish fry a roaring success! Thank you Lions!

Let's plan to help each other for our community projects and fund raisers.....club to club. It draws us together and it's just plain fun. DO IT. It's good to help one another.

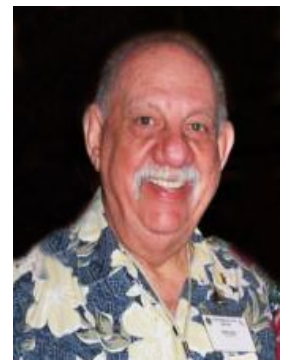
“WE CAN DO IT”

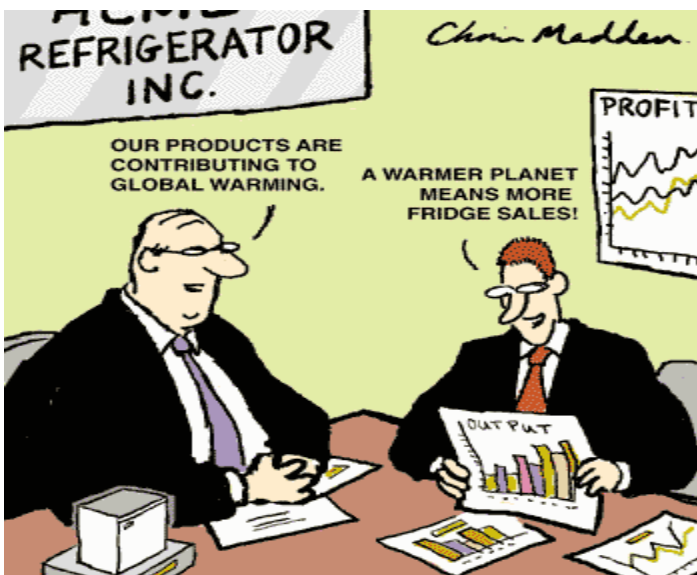
My point is, we will stop without new members. Without new clubs, without Lions like you and I - - Let me hear you say - - Lion Eddie,

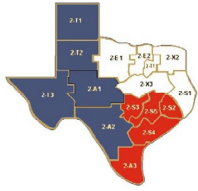
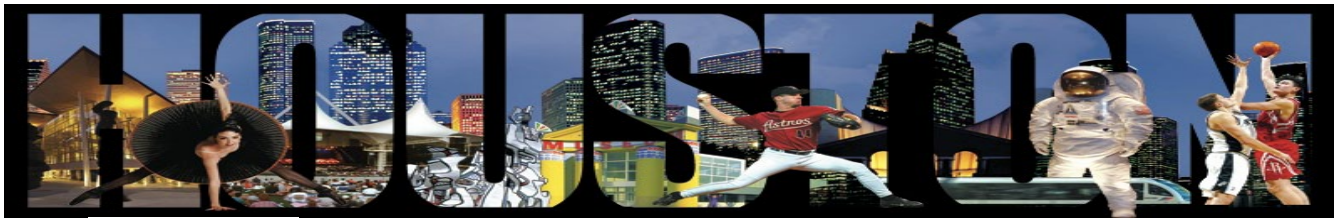
How many are needed to serve?

To provide and serve **a meal** (lunch or dinner) you will need at least 12 people or more. There are always 2 serving lines needed and some to help with drinks and/or dessert. The cost can range from \$350-750 depending on food cooked or catered. **Watermelon/ Coke Float** parties can take from 6-8 people or more to really run smoothly. You'll need to make arrangements to pre-order your watermelons or ice cream. Cost is \$100 to \$150. A **refreshment stand** needs at least 3-4 people, but more are definitely a plus! Cost is usually around \$100 with most supplies already here at the camp. **Awards night** is simple for small groups, needing only 4, but more can really set the mood of celebration for the campers as they come into the amphitheater. There is no cost for hosting Awards.

We can't cook the meal, can someone else? or we need help cooking our meal.

There is always the advantage of using one of our local restaurants that will not only cook the meal, but will deliver it to the camp for you. If your unable to cook a meal, but would still like to serve, we recommend one of these establishments. We have pizza and chicken available as menu choices and at reasonable prices. ****Special note:** Also, we would like to remove the use of our kitchen staff from being part of the picnics. It is an opportunity to have others cook so that they won't have to. We will close our kitchen and not have staff available to cook or heat up food. We will be able to order the things that you might need, ie watermelon, ice cream and the like, things that are difficult to transport or that need to stay cold. But items like beans to be heated, etc. will need to be taken care of by you, or not used in your menu. So check your menu and see what other things you could do, instead of using our dining hall facilities and staff. There is also the option of having the meal catered. As always, the camp will provide igloo coolers, ice and counselors ready to help before the picnic.

Conclusion: I know that you are excited about the coming season. The campers are always happy to see the Lions and these opportunities give them a chance to say thanks. So, get with your club and pick your 3 top dates and/or events that your club would like to provide. Then register by sending an email to Trish on Oct. 1 to register your club for Summer 2012. I will be out of the office until Oct. 3. So the policy of first come first serve will be decided by time stamp on the email. Don't register prior to Oct 1 at 12:01 am, because your email will not be valid. So get your dates, and your cup of coffee and I'll see you in my inbox on Oct.1.

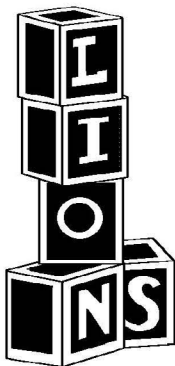

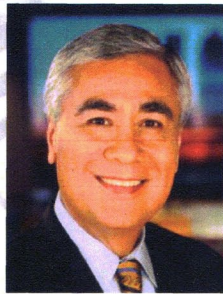

- (d) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a District Governor or Past District Governor of any Lions Clubs International District.

NOMINATIONS

The completed application form(s), will be provided to the Chairman of the District Governor’s Honorary Committee. Said application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application(s) are required to be received by February 15th of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to induct someone each and every year.
