



- •Did you know that if 100% of the 32,500+ Lions in the State of Texas contributed to the Century Club by giving \$10 a month, \$3.9 million would be generated each year?

The difference between \$3.9 million and \$1.8 million would be \$2.1 million. If this surplus was then transferred to the Endowment Fund, it would not be long before we could ensure that our Camp would exist well into the lives of our children, their children and their children's children. What a wonderful legacy we could all leave our families.

District 2-S2 has a total of 117 Lions, friends and family who belong to the Century Club. Since we have 2000+ members, we have a way to go to get our 100%.

Monthly Message:

I am proposing 10 areas in which clubs and districts can become involved in Building a better tomorrow:

- * Environment Lions can address environmental concerns by planting one tree for each club in a district and perhaps naming the area "Lions Park." Or by adopting a section of highway, park, river, stream or other local site.
- * Literacy Work with local businesses, libraries and schools to collect books, puzzles, educational toys, videotapes and audiotapes for children from low income families or at social service agencies, and recent immigrants or refugees. Each item can include a note identifying it as a gift from your club.
- * Partnerships for Children at Risk Currently there are millions of children at risk. Lions, by partnering with various social agencies, can furnish food, clothing, medical assistance and incentives to return to school or enroll in vocational programs.
- * Children's Eye Screening This is ideal as a club's World Sight Day project. Work with your local school system and eye care specialists to provide free vision screenings and eyeglasses for local youngsters. This is especially significant for recent immigrants or refugee families.

- * Healthy Youth In many nations, adolescent obesity is on the rise. Sponsor events that promote physical fitness and healthy lifestyles that will carry into adulthood.
- * Helping Hands for Youth Sponsoring youth groups, such as Scouts and, of course, Leo clubs, will help tomorrow's leaders understand the need for responsible action. Lions can also involve youth in club activities and fundraisers as a way of impressing on them the need for community service.
- * Vocational Guidance Lions can provide first-hand knowledge of a work place environment by inviting students to be their guests at work. Not only will young people understand the discipline and procedures of a particular profession, these experiences may also influence possible career choices.
- * Adopt-a-Buddy Mentoring Program This could well be a natural follow-up to the vocational guidance initiative suggested above. A Lion could meet with the student at least once a month for a year.
- * Outreach Initiatives Collect and recycle used clothing or partner with manufacturers that provide surplus clothing for non-profit organizations. Donate vitamins, powdered milk and other food to needy families. Also contact local businesses to serve as drop-off points for used eyeglasses.
- * Bikes-for-Life Personally, I believe this is a unique program with far-reaching benefits. Ask local bicycle shops to serve as donation centers for used bicycles and tricycles, including those for the disabled. Working together, the Lions can repair and reconstruct the bikes. These recycled bikes may be given to needy children or adults.

LAKE POLLUTION



Vice Governor Melba, that week at Lake Tahoe sounds like fun, but before you go jump into any lake you should know this:

The Bush administration's chief enforcer of the threedecade-old Clean Water Act concedes its goal of making all rivers and lakes safe for swimming and fishing has fallen in priority to combating terrorism and righting the economy.

The industrialized nations have registered some success in controlling pollution from "point sources" - that is from measurable discharge points. But they are still plagued with diffuse pollution - such as run-off from agricultural lands packed with pesticides and fertilizers and stormwater flowing from cities and towns which can contain sewage, heavy metals, oils, hydrocarbons, garbage, chemicals from road dc-icing, organic wastes from animals, and dust, among other things. These sources are difficult to control and are causing increased pollution of rivers and lakes throughout.

Lakes, in particular, are becoming over-dosed with nutrients such as fertilizers and animal wastes. Since the 1950s, concentrations of phosphates and nitrates in freshwater rivers and lakes have increased significantly. Nutrient from fertilizers and animal wastes were found to be the main contaminants in nearly 60 per cent of the polluted lakes surveyed in the U.S.

Nitrates in drinking water may cause blood poisoning in infants, hypertension in children, gastric cancers in adults and fetal malformations. The combination of high nitrates with pesticides, a common phenomenon, may form nitrosamines, which are both carcinogenic (cancer forming) and mutagenic (causing birth defects).

Urban run-off is a major threat to freshwater in some areas. The polluted run-off from city streets in Florida is thought to account for more than half of the state's water pollution and nearly 85 per cent of all heavy metals found in its rivers and swamps.

Integrated management is needed

The only way most countries, developed and developing alike, can hope to cope with mounting pollution of their freshwater resources is to evolve and implement integrated management strategies, which not only help clean up water courses, but prevent pollution in the first place.

Unfortunately, real integration of water management, pollution control and land management has not proved possible in most countries. Despite the problems, it is clear that in order to safeguard remaining water resources, integrated management of land and water will have to become the norm, not the exception.
