BOTTLED WATER

Part II



Glaceau makes Vitamin Water in 11 varieties with dramatic names such as Rescue, Multi-V, Stress-B, Defense and Revive. Each has its own flavor and hefty mix of vitamins, minerals, herbs or electrolytes.

Hansen's has Energy Water, with carbohydrates, several vitamins and sugar.

Another issue is that many of these waters are not calorie-free and they come in multiserving bottles. Glaceau Revive, for example, has 50 calories per eight ounce serving. One 20 ounce bottle has 2.5 servings, or 125 calories. Gatorade (Quaker Oats), that granddaddy of sports drinks, markets Propel Fitness Water, which has vitamins and four flavors.

Pepsi and Coca Cola, which dominate the bottled water market, don't intend to be left out. Pepsi's Aquafina has Aquafina Essentials. Coke's Dasani brand is expected to begin testing several flavors of Nutriwater in some areas soon.

Aquafina, the national leader in single-serving bottled water, brought out Essentials in June. It comes in four varieties, each with a different flavor and focus: vitamin C, vitamin B, calcium and multivitamin. People understand why we need vitamin C and the importance of calcium and soon.

Don't start buying cases of it and live off it and think it's going to make you a healthful person. Fortified waters shouldn't be a person's only source of water, nor should it replace healthy meals.

Don't lose sight that the whole foods, the fruits and vegetables and the grains do provide your body with what it needs. It is important to stay hydrated. You perform better and think better and a lot of people need some motivation.

Bottled water has another possible drawback for frequent users: none of the fluoride standard in tap water, a major reason Americans have relatively few cavities. Fluoride (in water) is important because the optimum level will help reduce cavities in children and adults.

Aside from the water itself, the other benefits are open to debate. In general, the amount of nutrients in enhanced waters is modest.

You can overdo it. If you are eating well, taking a vitamin pill, taking this fortified water, eating cereal that is vitamin-mineral fortified, eating an energy bar that has vitamin-mineral fortification, you can exceed safe upper limits.

You should let your doctor know what you are drinking, especially if the water includes herbs (such as ma huang) if you are on medications, to avoid the risk of interactions.

It's important for consumers of enhanced waters to realize that just because a product claims a benefit, it's not necessarily so. One product, Life 02, claims to offer an energy boost by having more oxygen than other water, even though humans can only absorb oxygen readily through the lungs. It's hard to believe that people are buying that.

Bus trips to International Convention in Detroit

In July of 2004, the Lions of Texas will have the opportunity to enjoy being a part of electing a great Texas Lion, Jimmy Ross, to be International 2nd Vice President.
