### A point to ponder.

Most, if not all, of our religions call us to be witnesses, not judge and jury.

It's November, and the first weekend was reserved for the Second Annual Council of Governors meeting, and was held in Nacogdoches, Texas. Good hotel, good meeting, and a very good time were had by all.

One noteworthy, if not unusual, event did occur. The Vice District Governor's Council was allowed to sit-in and observe the Executive Council Meeting. The subject was a proposed increase in dues for the Texas Lions Camp (TLC). Evidence of need and considerable, as well as, thoughtful discussion was presented on both sides of the issue. Ultimately, the issue was assigned to the ballot box at each district's convention for final resolution by the Lions of Texas. On behalf of the District Governors, I wish to thank an enlightened Council Chairman, Dick Robinson, for permitting us to observe.

The fact that an impending "need" for the TLC has been presented does offer immediate food for thought. The crown jewel of MD2 is in some jeopardy: Are we going to reduce services?; Take fewer campers?; Cut the staff?; Or do any of the dozens of other cost cutting remedies that leap to mind. As it should be, the **Lions of Texas shall resolve this problem**, but first, **the Lions of Texas must educate themselves** on the pros and cons of the ballot proposition. Schedule a Camp Director for a presentation and a "Q & A" session at your club as soon as possible.

On the proposition of helping the camp in true Lion's fashion, I offer the following for consideration. Last year, we had a "Send the Camp a Christmas Card" (with a check) campaign which was a great success, much to the surprise of almost every one involved. Should this have been a surprise? What is so surprising about the Lions of MD2 coming together as a family to protect the children? You, the Lions, are urged to rise to this occasion one more time and demonstrate your unbowed spirit, determination and resolve.

#### PROCEDURES FOR LIONS DAY WITH THE UNITED NATIONS

#### FORM AND PAYMENT

The registration form and payment must be received at Lions Clubs International no later than **February**18, 2005. UN security regulations require that every person attending must pre-register by the **February**18, 2005 deadline. Due to United Nations security requirements, all those planning to attend must be pre-registered. Only registrations accompanied by payment will be accepted. Payment must be in the form of a check, draft or money order in U.S. dollars drawn on a U.S. bank and payable to Lions Clubs International.

#### REFUNDS

There will be no refunds after **February 18, 2005**. There are no exceptions. Since Lions Clubs International must pay for meals and fees whether registrants attend or not, this policy of no refunds applies to all registrants, including those needing to obtain a visa and those who are not issued a visa.

#### VISAS

Lions Clubs International does not have the ability to assist individuals in obtaining visas to attend this event. Issuing visas is the prerogative of the consulate of any country.

Lions Day with the UN is an event that is open to any Lion/guest from any country who pays the fee and attends the program in New York. Lions Clubs International is unable to issue special letters of invitation to any Lion wishing to attend the event. However, a confirmation letter will be sent to each person who registers.

#### LUNCHEON WAITING LIST

Luncheon seating is limited to 350 people and will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. We encourage early registrations to secure a luncheon seat. After the 350 reservations for the luncheon have been made, additional registrants will be added to a luncheon waiting list based on available seats. Please note: Persons on the luncheon waiting list can still attend the day program.

The names of those people on the waiting list who will be receiving lunches will be announced the morning of the program. Names from the waiting list will be called in the order in which they are received. If a person on the waiting list is not present when their name is called, that person will not receive a lunch.

Each photo submission should **include** (in one of the official association languages) a **title**, the **negative**, and a 25-word (or less) **description** of the photo and why the environment being depicted should be improved, protected or preserved.

Photos submitted will be displayed at the Lions international convention and judged by convention registrants for the categories indicated and for "Best of Show."

- Multiple districts and single districts may conduct competitions among their respective clubs to select their finalist or "Best of Show" photo.
- At all contest levels, all entries are to be judged in an objective manner by an impartial group of judges. Winners are to be selected on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of environmental themes.
- Photo, negative, and description may be submitted to Lions Clubs International by March 1, 2005 via surface mail or e-mail. A completed entry form and negative must accompany each entry. The contestant is responsible for ensuring that an e-mail file can be opened electronically and that the photo is received in good condition.
