PURPOSE

The purpose of the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Association Distinguished Achievement Award is to “bestow honor upon those Lions in District 2-S2 who have shown outstanding leadership and service achievement to their Club, Community and District.”

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum qualifications for the Past District Governors District 2-S2 Distinguished Achievement Award are:

- (a) An active member with at least seven (7) years of service. This award is for living Lions only, unless the honoree passes away after being nominated.
- (b) Outstanding leadership and dedicated service to Club, Community and district.
- (c) Special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate.
- (d) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a member of any Lions Hall of Fame.
- (e) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a District Governor or Past District Governor of any Lions Clubs International District.

NOMINATIONS

The completed application form(s), will be provided to the Chairman of the District Governor's Honorary Committee. Said application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application(s) are required to be received by February 15th of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to induct someone each and every year.

Glasses For School Children

Lions International Sight First II through the Texas Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center has made possible the manufacture of new eyeglasses for needy School Children at reduced cost. This project is based on the successful four year ongoing program conducted by zone 1, District 2-A1. TLERC along with Chihuahua City Mexico have been given a grant through LCIF Sight First II for a state of the art finishing lab. This finishing lab is able to produce single vision glasses of a standard prescription for a cost of \$18.00. This price includes a fashionable frame and standard lenses. TLERC will serve as a laboratory and will produce ordering criteria. Local Lions Clubs or the doctors designated by the clubs will fit the frames and order the finished product from TLERC.

The standard prescription is in a range from plus or minus 0.00 to 4.00 sphere and up to a minus 2.00 cylinder. The prescription that TLERC will fill must be complete. The prescription must contain right eye correction, sphere-cylinder and axis (if needed), left eye correction, sphere-cylinder and axis (if needed), distance PD and doctors signature.

Any prescription greater than a 4.00 plus or minus sphere and a minus 2.00 cylinder will have to be made from a high index lenses at a premium. In some cases a child will need a bifocal. These glasses will also be made at a premium. Along with the information needed on the standard prescription the following information will be needed; the add for bifocal and the seg height.

A survey from TLERC has been produced and given to the TLERC presenters to conduct in their respective districts. This survey is meant to determine the willingness of the Lions Clubs of MD-2 to participate in this program. The ordering criteria will be given to the district governors to disseminate to their districts.

Zone 1, District 2-A1, stands ready to assist any MD-2 locality with ideas and procedures in establishing an effective eyeglass program for needy school children. In the final aspect, it is the local doctor that has to be the ultimate authority. Education is the answer to upward mobility within any society. Without vision, education becomes problematic.

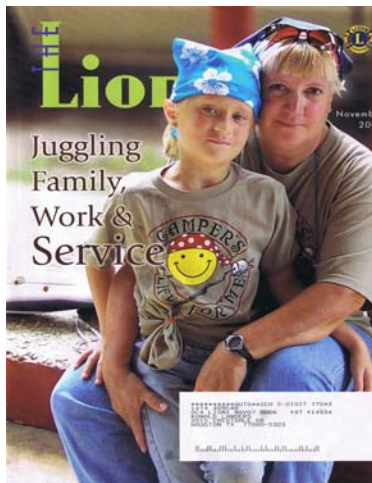
