Thoughts from your District Governor

I don't know about all of you, but I, for one, am glad the national election is behind us. It was a hard-fought race and certainly shows there is still a big divide in our country. As the holiday season approaches and Lions start planning their families' Thanksgiving activities, I think it is important to reflect on our many blessings. I know that I am thankful to live in a nation where we can disagree on so many important issues without any fear of persecution. We are one nation – one people – unified by a common history and driven to illuminate the world with the beacon of freedom.

As Lions, we have chosen to serve the needs of our communities damaged by disaster, or weakened by economic challenges that threaten the fabric of the families in our communities. I am so pleased to report to you that the Lions in District 2S2 are doing just that. We have continued, and in many areas, expanded our outreach to those in need. Clubs are working hard to hold fundraisers to support families challenged by large medical bills and rebuild homes of others devastated by disaster. I acknowledged examples of our Clubs performing great service at our second Cabinet meeting in November. Your Humanitarian Relief Fund has already approved two grants this year – one from the Tomball Lions and one from the Huffman Lions – and we hope to award several more in the coming months. The Crosby Lions worked with Rebuilding Together Houston's "Volunteer Home Repair" program to rebuild the home of a resident in nearby Barrett, Texas.







Lionism is growing in our District, too. As I mentioned at the Cabinet meeting, the Oak Forest Lions Club has more than doubled their membership this year. Other Clubs throughout the District have held successful membership drives that have shown great promise in bringing in more members. With the extension support of State GMT Chair PDG Hal Griffin, we are only four members away from petitioning for a charter in Kingwood. I'd like to thank all those Lions who helped us canvas for new Lions. The Houston Heights President even missed a Club meeting to canvas. We really are well on our way to building the District up again ... we WILL have eight new clubs and 450 new members!

Christmas brings to mind Religion – Family – Friends – getting together for great food and catching up for the year.



Impact of Environmental Pollution.

Environmental Pollution is the introduction of contaminants into a natural environment. It causes instability, disorder, harm or discomfort to the ecosystem. Pollution can take the form of chemical substances or energy, such as noise, heat, or light. Research has shown that humans are using resources faster than the environment can produce; for these reasons we will have problems. The problem is; our actions are making our environment not suitable for life forms. The environment is fundamentally connected to everything we need as human beings for survival. Do you know why there is no life on other planets? - Their environments cannot sustain life.

Causes.

- If we continue to disrupt the temperature balance and precipitation patterns of our current environment, it will make it more difficult to grow food leading to starvation of millions more.
- Our Groundwater is polluted with chemicals resulting in us drinking contaminated water which may contribute
 to sicknesses, and shorter lives.
- Studies have linked pollution to a decrease in brain function; this is intensified by poor nutrition brought on by less agricultural productivity.
- We are forced to breathe polluted air every day, again leading to significantly shorter and unhealthier lives.
- The negative consequences of the existing polluted air include
 - chronic bronchitis.
 - decreased lung function
 - Asthma and other adverse pulmonary effects.
