- Environment Katy club cleaned trash along a 2-mile stretch of Fm2855 while Klein regularly collects recycle items from family and friends.
- Hunger no hunger related activities reported!
- Vision Crosby and Humble Noon both provide eye exams and glasses for the needy. Houston Cy-Fair, Klein and Magnolia all collect used eyeglasses for the Recycle Center. Houston Cy-Fair had a local optometrist as a guest speaker to talk about the benefits of early eye vision screening.
- Pediatric Cancer Montgomery sponsored a cancer victim to Texas Lions Camp and Houston Royal Oaks were at the camp graduation for campers with cancer and physical disabilities.


Greetings, Fellow Lions!



Texas Lions Camp – A Tribute



I had to share this. Last week Texas Lions Camp Diabetes Session 2 ended. We are just 49 weeks away until we're back. This message from a mom exemplifies what camp is for many families:

Dr. Ponder,

My daughter asked me to return to camp as soon as I picked her up. I will gladly allow her to go every time because of the care & comfort she received. The week prior to drop off I was a nervous wreck because Shelby is the only child and this is her first time being away for so long. On the way to camp I was holding back the tears, trying to remain strong for her. When we arrived at her dorm I did not want to leave but she was ready for us to go. Kelly on the med staff walked in and spoke to me and advised everything would be okay. She explained to me she has a son with type I diabetes, he was there at camp as well. She took the time to explain her story as well as her role at the camp. Once I talked to her my tears went away and I was able to give a sigh of relief. I was able to leave in confidence knowing Shelby was at a great place with people who would take care of her.

I really enjoyed your talk on the last day. You helped me breakthrough the feeling of guilt I have felt since she was diagnosed in 2015. I always put diabetes on me and wondered what I did and how I could have eliminated this. I often felt it was my fault an hesitated having any additional kids for fear of my next child having the same. "This is not your fault", was the most powerful moment of the night for me. THANK YOU, I needed to hear this. It was at this point the heavy weight of guilt was lifted.

When I picked my daughter up, she was a new person. She was confident and excited about all the memories she created during her week at camp. She met lots of friends, they exchanged numbers and have been talking ever since. The entire trip home we heard all about camp from start to finish, she never missed a memory.

One take away from your discussion was when you stated your goal, "just to be normal". This is something my family has also struggled with. We do not know many people with type I diabetes but how cool was it for her to spend a week with people like her. Prior to camp she felt like she was not normal and sometimes would have mini breakdowns about not being able to eat like others. Once I picked her up, I noticed the goal was met. The confidence and excitement was not only about all the fun she had but now she was NORMAL like everyone else.

Thank you all for creating a loving environment that allows everyone to feel "normal".

JOINING FORCES TO FIGHT DIABETES

Diabetes contributes to more than 5 million deaths a year, making it the eighth-leading cause of death in the world. And the numbers are rising. Lions and Leos are confronting this global health emergency by raising awareness of diabetes through Strides events, expanding access to care through screening and treatment programs, and improving quality of life through diabetes camps and community recreational programs. We believe we can help prevent and

control this global epidemic by uniting Lions and Leos around this cause.

World Diabetes Day (WDD) was created in 1991 by IDF and the World Health Organization in response to growing concerns about the escalating health threat posed by diabetes. World Diabetes Day became an official United Nations Day in 2006 with the passage of United Nation Resolution 61/225. It is marked every year on **14 November**, the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who co-discovered insulin along with Charles Best in 1922.
