### TONY'S TALES

At this time of year our clubs are getting into top gear to help those who would otherwise have a less happy Christmas. Many will be working with their local welfare groups to support them and also providing food hampers and toys for children. Truly a season where we ramp up our giving.

Thanks to those clubs who continue to report their activities in mylci. A selection from November:

- Houston Cy-Fair Lions screened 683 children this month. 64 were referred for complete vision examinations. These screenings were conducted at seven pre schools, and 1 public event.
- **The Woodlands** Collect used eyeglasses for refurbishing and distribution on mission trips. Collected 1500 pairs of glasses and delivered to the Conroe Noon Lions processing facility.
- South Montgomery 450 pairs of eyeglasses recycled at the Conroe Noon Lions sorting center.
- **The Woodlands** Donated \$1000 this non-profit Museum that is creating opportunities that Educate, Empower and Excite children and families through play while inspiring a lifelong sense of wonder and discovery.
- Cinco Ranch -Lions and family volunteered at the Ballard house for breakfast with Santa and festival of trees
- Katy Nov 23-24, 2018 table was set up at the Katy Festival of Trees to benefit the Ballard House. Sunday Nov 20th the tree was decorated for sale.
- Tomball The Tomball Lions Club participated in the annual Families Feeding Families event which provides a
  Thanksgiving meal and other necessities for low to moderate income area families and individuals. In addition to
  volunteering for the event, the Tomball Lions Club performed vision screening for children in attendance. Turkey
  dinners with all the trimmings were fed to ~1,500+ on site and delivered to another ~400 shut-ins and homeless.
  Hundreds of volunteers of all ages come out for this event to help make it a special day. Attendees could also pick
  from numerous piles of donated clothes, obtain flu shots, haircuts, etc. This was the first time our Lions Club has
  participated in this very worthwhile event and we look forward to again next year.
- Hardin Community and schools donate non-perishables, and Lions add dry goods, bread and turkeys and facilitate distribution of food to needy families. We served 38 families this year. We include families with children as well as the disabled and elderly.
- Humble Noon Thirty brown bags were filled with smoked hams and other Thanksgiving trimmings and delivered to Family Time to be distributed to families in need.
- **Crosby** Crosby Lions Club collected donations and presented a grandmother and her two children with a Thanksgiving dinner and gift cards for Christmas presents.
- **Baytown** We installed about 800 flags around town in honor of Veteran's Day.
- Dayton Set out flags for Veteran's Day
- Hardin Flags distributed for Veterans Day at the price of \$35 per flag each year.
- **Montgomery** Leo Club kickoff meeting with new sponsor, new and returning members. Pizza and fun times planning this next years events.
- **Cleveland** The Cleveland Lions club participated in the annual eye testing for the Tarkington Elementary school.
- Klein Phoenix Scouting Discussed with BSA leadership about transferring the charter of 2 Cub Scout Packs to the Club. It was agreed, and the Club has submitted required BSA paperwork. Klein Phoenix Lions Club welcomes Pack 1326 from Bernshausen Elementary and Pack 1331 from Benfer Elementary in addition to Pack 300 from Mittelstaedt Elementary which joined the club in October.
- **Cut and Shoot Family** Challenge Air **a**ttended by Lion Joan, Rick & Louie. Donated food for pilots and assisted children on plane rides.

# **REMINDER – OUTSTANDING YOUTH ESSAY COMPETITIONS**

Contestants of the Diabetes Essay Contest, the Drug awareness Speech, and the Outstanding Youth contest must be submitted to **Sara Coots (scoots@rougeuxplic.com)** electronically by **March 30**<sup>th</sup>. Anything received after that date will be disqualified. Our District contest for all three scholarship programs will be held on April 13<sup>th</sup>, venue to be announced at a later date.





**PURPOSE** - The purpose of the Past District Governors District Association Distinguished Achievement Award is to "bestow honor upon those Lions in District 2-S2 who have shown outstanding leadership and service achievement to their Club, Community and District."

**QUALIFICATIONS -** Minimum qualifications for the Award are:

- a) An active member with at least seven (7) years of service. This award is for living Lions only, unless the honoree passes away after being nominated.
- b) Outstanding leadership and dedicated service to Club. Community and district.
- c) Special achievements in, or contributions to, humanitarian service for those less fortunate.
- d) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a member of any Lions Hall of Fame.
- e) At the time of the presentation of the award, must NOT be a District Governor or Past District Governor of any Lions Clubs International District.

**NOMINATIONS** - The completed application form must be sent to the Chairman of the District Governor's Honorary Committee. The application may be made by any Lion in the District that is in good standing. The application is required to be received by **February 15th** of each year and will be valid for that year only. If an applicant is not selected for that year, a new application must be submitted again to be considered for this award. There is no requirement to make an award each and every year.
