I had the privilege to spend a day with Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester, Michigan a couple of weeks ago. This is another inspirational organization that we support via our 100% contribution. They provide about 200 dogs a year too their clients, most of whom are blind, at no cost to the client (actual cost around \$8,000). They breed their own dogs and have large group of volunteer Puppy Raisers who look after and train the dogs for the first year of their life. Then the dogs are returned to the Center for further training. Finally, the dogs are paired with their client and go through 28 days of intensive training as a team at the Centers residential unit. We heard from one of their clients and witnessed the incredible work done by them as team. I would be happy to present at your Club if you would like me to. We are working with clubs to update our records for communications with members. We have just over 1,000 of our 1,600 members with valid email addresses. We do understand that some members do not have email addresses, but we want to identify those members so that we can try alternative means of communication. We hope that we can reduce the number of members who choose to leave our clubs by letting them know what they will be missing! And giving them the opportunity to come to one of our meetings or projects.





My dear fellow 2-S2 Lions,

I am fresh off the airplane from my Guerrero Dental and Vision Clinic in Mexico. I must share a few thoughts. As a teacher, I had my students in every grade memorize excerpts from great historic and humanitarian speeches. One such speech was an oration by a gentleman and statesman who was one of my top favorite American heroes.

The Second Virginia Convention met March 1775 at Richmond. For three days, Patrick Henry listened while his fellow countrymen made every sort of plea for peace. After he had heard all he could stand, he rose and stated his call to action. His words that hot day in the crowded church included the following, "It is in vain, sir to extenuate the matter. Gentlemen may cry, Peace, Peace, but there is no peace. The war is actually begun! The next gale that sweeps from the north will bring to our ears the clash of resounding arms! Our brethren are already in the field! Why stand we here idle? What is it that gentlemen wish? What would they have? Is life so dear or peace so sweet, as to be purchased at the price of chains and slavery? Forbid it almighty God! I know not what course others may take; but as for me, give me liberty or give me death!"

I am not asking Lions to pick up guns. I am asking you to serve humanity like you have never served before. Remember that we are Lions Clubs INTERNATIONAL! Many of you have been going on missions for years. I applaud you and I thank you for leading the way. I know and I was taught that the good book teaches that charity begins at home and spreads abroad. We must never neglect our own communities. But, please, consider those who have so much less.

I witnessed elderly, blind patients being dragged into the Guerrero Clinic by their armpits. They do not have access to even the aluminum walkers! There is no health care for the elderly nor the children in so many countries. Lions are helping the Guerrero Clinic which was started by Rotarians. This is a great network with fellow volunteers. The Crystal Foundation is the non-profit. All donations are tax deductible in the United States. I will be going back next fall. I learned to do ultrasound on eyes. I was able to assist in eye exams and observe the removal of cataracts.

I will return next fall.

CAMPAIGN | 100



Our campaign 100 is under way as of July 1, 2018. This a three year campaign to raise \$300 million dollars but its impact will last generations. Lions Club International Foundation projects that by year 2021 they will be able to serve more than 200 million people a year through this campaign. These funds will enable LCIF to expand its commitment to communities with a continued focus on vison, youth, disaster relief and humanitarian causes. LCIF is asking Lions or others to pledge \$100.00 per year each for three years and/or for LIONS Clubs to pledge \$250.00 per member total for the three year campaign. A pledge of \$750.00 per member total for the next three years would give the club a Model Club status. A pledge to this campaign would be of great humanitarian service, not only to our local area but to health care, disaster relief and service projects all over

the world. Last year Campaign 100 was in its planning stage therefor any donations by individual Lions and/or Clubs made to Campaign 100 during that time will count toward pledges made for the next three years. Any pledge over \$5,000.00 may be paid out over a five year period.

JOINING FORCES TO FIGHT DIABETES

Diabetes contributes to more than 5 million deaths a year, making it the eighth-leading cause of death in the world. And the numbers are rising. Lions and Leos are confronting this global health emergency by raising awareness of diabetes through Strides events, expanding access to care through screening and treatment programs, and improving quality of life through diabetes camps and community recreational programs. We believe we can help prevent and control this global epidemic by

uniting Lions and Leos around this cause.

World Diabetes Day (WDD) was created in 1991 by IDF and the World Health Organization in response to growing concerns about the escalating health threat posed by diabetes. World Diabetes Day became an official United Nations Dav in 2006 with the passage of United Nation Resolution 61/225. It is marked every year on 14 **November**, the birthday of Sir Frederick Banting, who codiscovered insulin along with Charles Best in 1922.
